Our thanks must go to him for steering us on a balanced course and for his diplomacy in handling certain situations, particularly at the eve of the season when goal and boundary umpires' fees presented a particularly sticky problem.

His guidance and effort during the latter part of the season brought about many rewards, particularly in the sphere of fees to umpires; the net result is a reasonable increase to all categories for the 1969 season. Our relationship with this Board remains cordial and friendly. We appreciate their problems, as they appreciate ours. Our congratulations to Ian Murray on his election to the Board. UMPIRES' ADVISERS:

To Jim Campbell' and George Meiers our thanks for their understanding and untiring efforts in improving our knowledge of the game. To George, newly elected Umpires' Adviser, and to Ted Brunton, his assistant, our congratulations and best wishes for the 1969 season.

JUNTRY FOOTBALL:

We continue to officiate at most country centres, and would no doubt officiate at far distant centres if suitable transport was available. We experienced some trouble with umpires failing to notify Associations of their intention to travel to their appointment in their own vehicle. This is a must and courtesy alone demands that this be done. Co-operation and friendliness with Country Associations will facilitate the passage of increase in fees when it occurs from time to time.

LIFE MEMBERS:

No umpires have been recommended for approval for Life Membership at the Annual General Meeting.

FINANCE:

We finished the financial year with \$117.18 in the bank, which is sufficient to commence this season and pay for various commitments that arise. Our Annual Ball was not such a financial burden as has been the case in previous years. Added expense this year will be payment to a Secretarial Service to process circulars, reports, etc.

STITUTION:

This was prepared in finality during the season and was presented to the members early in 1969 and was duly adopted. This puts our Association on a much firmer basis than previously and becomes the cornerstone of our function.

TRAINING SUPERVISER:

The W.A.N.F.L. saw fit to provide us with a Training Superviser. We were most fortunate in having the services of Hal Symons, who by his enthusiasm and knowledge of our physical requirements, galvanised us into a much fitter bunch than we had been during prior seasons. We trust that Hal will be with us in this capacity for many years to come.
