COUNTRY FOOTBALL:

We continue to officiate at 13 country centres and remain well received by them. With these Country Leagues we should always endeavour to put our best foot forward, especially with regard to transport arrangements, pick-up points, etc.

FINANCE:

We commence this season with a surplus of \$114.19. If you read our Treasurer's Report you will see that we are continually burdened with losses on the Cabaret and Christmas Tree. Therefore I suggest to the incoming committee that these functions be looked at from this standpoint. Perhaps a different venue other than Boans Rendezvous Room might ease the strain. Remember, we subsidise the Training Camp and extra training equipment such as batons, ray lamps and a stop watch are necessities. This is where the money should be spent.

TRAINING CAMP:

Our Training Supervisor, Mr. Hal Symons, organised a Training Camp at Point Peron which has now become an integral part of the pre-season programme. Hal is not with us this year, but his successor, Mr. Ken Armstrong, is proving his worth and is most popular with the panel.

FEES:

Some increases occurred. However, boundary and goal umpires I consider remain underpaid. The question of fees, both for League appointments and to Country Leagues, should be looked at more fully. Conferences between those bodies and our Association would clear up much misunderstanding.

SOCIAL:

Again very successful. We kicked off the season with cricket and tennis matches. The after training dinners were, as usual, well attended, and the Cabaret Ball was socially a great success.

The kids, of course, enjoyed the Christmas Tree, and the Christmas Barbecue held at Dick Stubberfield's home was well attended.
