PRESIDENT'S REPORT

In 2015 the WANFLUA continued its proud history of ensuring strong working conditions for its members, whilst also providing an exciting and enjoyable social atmosphere for its members to revel in, thereby ensuring high satisfaction and retention rates amongst its members.

On top of this, in 2015 the WANFLUA embarked on some landmark achievements in securing a lucrative fundraising opportunity with Racing and Wagering Western Australia (RWWA) and signing off on a significantly restructured Memorandum of Understanding with the WAFC for the upcoming 2016 and 2017 seasons.

Before further exploring the successes of 2015, it is imperative that I take this opportunity to thank the tremendous support and the selfless volunteered dedication of the WANFLUA committee:

A further special thank you is to be extended to the outgoing committee members Justin Power and Clayton Gardner.

Justin has undertaken the highly responsible and time-consuming job of WANFLUA treasurer over the past two years. In this time, Justin has not only overseen and managed a high turnover of funds, he has assisted the important implementation of cloudbased accounting software and online banking, both of which will significantly increase the efficiencies of the treasurer role for generations to come.



Clayton's contribution on the general committee has also been highly valuable. Clayton completely revamped the association's website and has been of great assistance as the association looks to try to implement a centralised electronic record keeping system. I again extend my personal thanks to both Justin and Clayton for their selfless and excellent service to our association.

Thanks to Life Member Phil O'Reilly, the WANFLUA was presented with a significant fundraising opportunity from RWWA following the completion of the 2015 season. After consultation with its members, the association embarked on an agreement which resulted in members of the association volunteering their time to provide horse observation services to RWWA for seven Group One races between November 2015 and January 2016. The agreement would see our members usually get out of bed at 3am to attend stables (generally an hour from Perth) between 5am and 3pm and observe the horses racing in Group One events and reporting to RWWA any interactions between the horse and trainers prior to the race. In return for this service, RWWA agreed to donate an amount of \$53,080 to the WANFLUA. The WANFLUA received excellent feedback from RWWA and will be given the same opportunity again in 2016.

I would like to thank all members who generously volunteered their time by participating in this fundraising initiative. In particular, I would like to make special acknowledgement of the significant contribution of our Vice President, Ash Coster, who spent countless hours doing the organisation and appointment of all our volunteers. The association is greatly indebted to him for his generous service. The funds raised from the RWWA fundraiser provided

the association with many exciting opportunities.

Following the fundraiser, the WANFLUA in conjunction with the WAFC embarked on an exciting venture together which will see all WAFL field umpires from Colts to League be kitted with Match Day Communication equipment which will allow field umpires to easily communicate whilst officiating, much like occurs in the AFL. The 'match com' systems should see our members be kitted with equipment which significantly assists them in conducting their on-field duties, which in turn should lead to higher retention rates.

The match com came at significant expense, with the WAFC purchasing the equipment at a cost of \$79,117. The WAFC will take charge of the ownership of the equipment which includes maintenance and insurance expenses. From the horse guarding funds, the WANFLUA donated \$28,561 to the WAFC for the purchase of the match com equipment. I would like to thank the WAFC for their investment in our members and acknowledge the significant result this was for our members, with our fundraised money essentially being extended from \$53,080 to \$103,636. Again our Vice President Ash Coster was instrumental in the procurement and negotiation for the purchase of the match com equipment.

The committee will continue to liaise with its members to ensure the best utilisation of the remaining funds raised.

By the completion of the 2015 season, the Executive had also overseen the implementation of a considerably overhauled Memorandum of Understanding with the WAFC. I again would like to extend my gratitude to the WAFC for the way in which they entered into the discussions, which has resulted in a significantly improved document for all parties involved. Significant changes and improvements to the MOU are itemised below:

- The MOU now covers a two-year period, enabling greater ability of the WAFC and the WANFLUA to manage their respective budgets and provides a needed reduction in respective administration time;
- The recognition of all terms and conditions in the MOU document instead of being spread between the MOU and the WAFC Policy and Procedures Manual;
- The provision of an MOU which is now easily referenceable and able to be clearly read and understood;
- Greater clarity regarding:
 - the purpose and background of the agreement;
 - the insurance cover provided by the WAFC to the WANFLUA;
 - issue identification procedures;
 - leave provisions for umpires; and
 - the provision of trainers for pre-season fixtures.

The agreed MOU further has the inclusion of the below terms and benefits in addition to previous agreements:

- 1.2% pay increase for season 2016;
- A pay increase for season 2017 as per the June Quarter, Perth Capital City CPI rate;
- The provision of match day goal umpire jackets;
- An increase to the training uniform contribution by the WAFC, with the effect being the WAFC covering the majority, if not all, of training uniform costs;
- Increased funding by the WAFC for keynote WANFLUA presentation evenings;
- Increased ticket allocation to the Capes Room on grand final day; and
- Acceptance of new tribunal procedures which are envisaged to significantly improve umpire satisfaction with their interaction with the WAFL tribunal process.

Members are again encouraged to liaise with the Executive should they see areas within the MOU which they believe could be improved or if there are items within the MOU which are not complied with.

Another major highlight of 2015 was the revamped Hall of Fame function. Umpiring legend and WANFLUA Life Member Craig Hendrie was inducted into the Hall of Fame. The function was moved from Ernest Johnson to the Bells Function Centre. The new venue provided a wonderful backdrop for a fantastic night and was well received by all in attendance. We look forward to carrying this initiative into future years where we hope we will see a continuing growth in attendance from life members and past members at this function. I would also like to thank all those involved for the compilation of this yearbook. The selfless contribution of our volunteers is essential to the success of our association and I encourage all members to continue to pitch in and provide assistance to the running of this association where possible.

Thank you again for allowing me the privilege of leading this association and I look forward to continue working with you all going into 2016.



Brett Dalgleish had a sensational season, umpiring three finals and he has developed a wonderful attitude towards umpiring. I am confident if Brett can improve his time trials during the pre-season in a very competitive industry he can have further success. I am also confident that Jace Collingridge can resume training soon and that Cal Brown and Adam Bastick will umpire finals in 2016.

The AFL field umpire achievements were remarkable with Jeff Dalgleish and Dean Margetts officiating in the two preliminary finals held in Perth. Jeff's appointment to his first AFL Grand Final was fantastic. He commenced with the WAFL in 2003 and has umpired 232 league games, including 113 AFL games, and really only established himself on the AFL Team a few years back. Congratulations to the following umpires who debuted in 2015:



GOAL UMPIRES REPORT

John Marrapodi

In 2014, Colin Shawcross was left with the challenge on whether the WAFL goal umpire team could maintain the high quality of goal umpiring produced in season 2013. As 2015 was my first year as WAFL/ AFL Goal Umpire Coach, I had the added challenge of maintaining and working towards improving on the high standard, which included the coaching ethos left in place by Colin.

In 2015, a standard goal umpire assessment process was implemented across all three grades. As result, of the 540 appointments made throughout season 2015, a total of 534 appointed umpires received match day coaching and a match assessment. The aim was to match day coach as many umpires as possible and provide the necessary feedback to assist them in their development.

Another key performance indicator was to debut two new League umpires. This was achieved with the appointment of Ben Clark in Round 1 and Brendon Carrod in Round 4. We had five umpires debut in Reserves, Hannah Manassah (Round 1), Rhys Mola and David Hayes (Round 4) and Tiana Fry (Round 12). In addition, eight new umpires joined the WAFL panel – Rhys Mola, David Hayes, Nick Walters, Tim Banith, Jason Yazdani, Graeme Tingey, Udom Quartermain and Jayden Trivanovic. These umpires have joined us with some or no experience. For the umpires who umpired for the very first time, their development and commitment has been outstanding.

The focus throughout the season was not about ticking the boxes and debuting umpires. The focus had to be about sustainability and being able to keep umpires at those levels on a regular and prolonged basis, and I'm happy to say this was achieved. This meant a process of rotation had to be implemented to create opportunity. In some cases, byes had to be put in place to ensure goal umpires received game opportunity.

The 2015 football season presented us with many highlights. Ben Clark was nominated and umpired State 18's in both Western Australia and Victoria. His performance through the 18's competition earned him selection to umpire before the 2015 AFL Grand Final. Brendon Carrod was selected to umpire the State 16's in Queensland. Sam Hunter was selected to umpire



the 2015 State Game between Western Australia and South Australia and he was supported by Brody Payne as the emergency.

Major awards for 2015 were Sam Hunter (Carter Medal, Goal Umpire of the Year), Hannah Manassah (Shawcross Medal, Most Improved Goal Umpire) and Ben Clark (Rose Medal, Best Pre-Season Goal Umpire). These awards were an acknowledgment of the hard work and commitment shown by each of these fine young umpires.

Congratulation to all nine goal umpires who were selected to the WAFL Grand Final 2015. To be selected as a member of this team should be considered as an honour, in particular our emergency team. These positions are not consolation prizes – an emergency goal umpire needs to be ready to step up and assume the role of the participating umpire if there is an unforeseen problem.

My thanks go to the AFL goal umpiring group of Dale Edwick, Brett Rogers, Matthew Laycock and Luke Edwards. Their leadership and willingness to assist our WAFL umpiring group must be acknowledged.

I would also like to acknowledge my two assistance coaches, Colin Shawcross and Robert Davis. Their assistance, support and guidance throughout 2015 is simply outstanding. Finally to the Match Day Coaches, Rick Payne, Steve Clark, Jack Crawshaw, Denis Heaney and Marty Tomkins. To Match Day Coach and prepare reports for 534 appointments could not have been achieved without their commitment and dedication. Thank you to Terry Tomlinson from Community Football for identifying and encouraging young umpires to join the WAFL system.

My thanks to Luke Daniher and assistant Jami Ruscoe for their professionalism and managing the fitness program. I would also like to thank Peta Ryan and her medical team for attending to the wellbeing of the goal umpires. Thank you to Darryl Sinclair for his leadership and support. As coaches, we endeavour to provide as much support as possible to the goal umpiring team. It's always comforting to know that we have someone there to support the coaches.

Season 2016 promises to be exciting with greater opportunities for the team.

HALL OF FAME

Craig O'Donoghue

It's not every day that a star of the game agrees to joke about one of the most controversial moments of his AFL career. But when Sydney's 2005 premiership captain Barry Hall learned that Craig Hendrie was being inducted into the WANFLUA Hall of Fame, he was happy to create some laughs.

Hall and Hendrie were famously linked after the Swans forward gave away a 150m penalty against Hawthorn in 2007. Hendrie only paid the last of those 50m penalties, but the photos all show him and Hall in heated discussions so most people think Hendrie was responsible for the lot.


Hall was in Perth in May working for Fox Footy when Fremantle

played North Melbourne. He used the opportunity to take the mickey out of Hendrie on camera, while also congratulating him on his illustrious career.

"It was such a laugh," Hendrie said. "On field, Barry was one of the scariest guys to be near, even as an umpire. When you meet him off the field I found him to be a very engaging character. Always liked a chat before a game and was quite funny. For him to make himself available to be a part of the video tribute was awesome and it really made my night."

Hendrie has always been a popular character. With 69 AFL games, 256 WAFL matches, six WAFL grand finals, three state games and four Montgomery Medals, he was an obvious choice for Hall of Fame induction. His rise also created history because he joined his father Rob in the elite club, making them the first father-son inductions.

"Umpiring has been something that the whole family has been involved in for most of my life," Hendrie said. "It's provided us not only with some great on field moments and successes, but we've made lifelong



family friendships through umpiring. We've been able to travel to some great cities whilst umpiring and Dad has even umpired a game in London so it's provided us with an enormous amount of opportunities."

Fourteen Hall of Famers, and more than 150 umpires, partners, coaches and Life Members attended the induction ceremony at Bells Function Centre.

Inaugural Hall of Famer Trevor Cant was honoured on the night by being named out Ball Legend for 2015.

But it was Hendrie's night and his beaming smile was perfectly captured in his Hall of Fame caricature.

"It's a very humbling experience if you consider some of the great umpires that are already part of that group," Hendrie said. "I'm exceptionally honoured to have been acknowledged in such a way and I was pretty excited to become a part of it. It really does put an exclamation mark on my entire career and I'll have some fond memories to look back upon."

2015 AFL GRAND FINAL

It was a similar feeling for Doig, who has chalked up a remarkable 290 senior games, including 213 at AFL level.

"I think anytime you make a finals panel it's a good feeling and to make it to a prelim is a real positive, but in the end it's such a subjective pursuit," Doig said. "It is hard to gauge if you have had a good year just on making finals or should you judge the year on effort. I know which I prefer to base it off."

Dalgleish has now umpired 233 senior games and the Grand Final was his

WANFLUA life member Jeff Dalgleish became the first field umpire based outside of Victoria to officiate in an AFL Grand Final when he walked out on to the hallowed turf of the MCG for the 2015 decider between Hawthorn and West Coast.

Dalgleish was joined in the field by fellow WANFLUA life members Brett Rosebury, in his seventh AFL Grand Final, and Nathan Doig, who was appointed to patrol the boundary line for a fourth time, including the last three in a row.

Following a tense preliminary finals weekend, Dalgleish received the call every AFL umpire dreams of getting from head coach Hayden Kennedy on the ensuing Monday morning.

In true Dalgleish style, the typically reserved 29-yearold admitted to having no major emotions when informed of his landmark appointment.

"I think the coach was a bit disappointed in my underwhelming response when he did give me a call and said I was in," Dalgleish said.

"I probably didn't actually go as well as I would have liked in the prelim, but collectively as a team we went OK. I actually walked away a little bit disappointed with it, but I wasn't overly worried about the outcome. It was going to be what it was going to be.

"I was pretty relaxed about it to be honest. It was just business as usual and we rolled on for another week." 113th at the elite level, having been scouted by WANFLUA great Mike Ball while umpiring a juniors competition in 2002.

"Inside it's something you've been working towards for a very long period of time and in the back of my mind I've had this goal in place since I was about 16," Dalgleish said. "On reflection there's a lot of great things about being the first person based outside of Victoria to umpire a Grand Final. It's a relatively big achievement and I'm quite proud about that."

Dalgleish and Doig departed Perth together on the Thursday before the Grand Final for a light training session with their eastern states counterparts followed by a team dinner, before suiting up for the traditional Grand Final Parade through the streets of Melbourne.

While Doig has become accustomed to the festivities of AFL Grand Final Week, it was an all-new experience for Dalgleish and he had mixed emotions about how to embrace it all.

"I'm probably more introverted than most, so the big parade stuff doesn't really tickle my fancy and the real challenge for me was around accepting what it was and then making sure that we didn't let the distractions get in the way of performing well on the day," Dalgleish said.

"Almost take away the actual experience, it was really enjoyable to just spend time with teammates and people that I really respect." Game day finally arrived and the first ball was bounced. And so loud was the noise from the crowd during the first half that Dalgleish struggled to hear his coaches and AFL Umpires boss Wayne Campbell speak at the main break.

"I remember rolling in at half-time, sitting down and all I could hear in my ears was this ringing like you've been at a rock concert," Dalgleish said.

"Wayne Campbell comes in and I can see his lips moving but I can't hear anything. I remember saying to him, 'mate, I can see you talking but I can't hear a word you're saying'.

"It was actually kind of a nice place to be because you've got this white noise in the background and it almost just

frees you up to fully concentrate and immerse yourself in the game."

Equally challenging for the supremely fit Dalgleish was the unusually hot weather that presided over Melbourne on Grand Final day.

"I remember in the last quarter starting to get a couple of cramps and thinking to myself, 'wow, I've put all this effort into preparing myself but maybe I'm not as fit as I should be?'," he said.

Hawthorn prevailed over West Coast to claim a rare third straight premiership, with Doig running the

boundary in all three, but from an umpiring perspective the day will be remembered for having a strong WA contingent.

In a strange coincidence, 2015 was also memorable for Dalgleish and Doig on a personal level as both welcomed their first children in the months leading up to the Grand Final. Both Dalgleish and Doig paid tribute to their wives, Natalie and Ash, for shouldering much of the responsibilities in raising Logan and Reggie during their very early days so the pair's umpiring duties were minimally impacted.

"Having your first child is quite exciting, but you're also going through a whole lot of other things," Dalgleish said. "There's consistent trouble-shooting around what works and what doesn't work that you're



kind of learning along the way, and you're trying to do that while you're sleep deprived and you're trying to support your partner through it."

Doig added: "I have a very amazing wife. I realistically couldn't be much help in those early days and months. So I tried to help where I could with Reg and then when I was at training or at a game that was my focus."

With four AFL grand finals now under his belt, Doig must now be ranked among the best umpires from any discipline to hail from WA. The 30-year-old urged those hoping to follow in his footsteps to focus on what is important and always put in the hard work.

> "I was never what you might call an AFL boundary umpiring aspirant, I just happened to be in the right place at the right time," Doig said.

> "My running coach at the time always told me that the harder you work, the luckier you get though. I just wanted to be the best umpire I could be and that didn't matter if I was running colts, reserves, league or AFL. I turned up to training wanting to improve. I turned up to games and tried to implement

what the coaches gave me to work on and now I'm here still doing the same."










Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2015

1 Statement of significant accounting policies

The significant policies which have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report are:

Basis of accounting The financial report is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared for its members in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations, other authoritative announcements and the Association Handbook in a form appropriate for a sporting association...

It has been prepared on the basis of historical costs and except where stated, does not take into account changing money values or fair values of non-current assets.

The accounting policies have been consistently applied, and, except where there is a change in accounting policy, are consistent with those of the previous year.

Statement of compliance The financial report complies with Australian Accounting Standards, which include Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (AIFRS), Compliance with AIFRS ensures that the financial report, comprising the financial atatements and notes thereto, complies with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS).

(a) Revenue recognition Revenues are recognised at fair value of the consideration received.

Membership – Membership revenue is driven through subscription fees. All membership income is recognised in the financial year in which it has been received to accurately match membership revenue with events held.

Interest - Interest Income is recognised when it is credited,

(b) Receivables Subscriptions shall be payable in the case of an Active Member immediately on notification of appointment as an Umpire and in all other cases no later than the 31st of May each year.

Collectability of debtors is reviewed on an ongoing basis. A provision for doubtful debts is raised where doubt as to the collection exists and debts which are known to be uncollectible are written off.

(c) Plant and equipment Plant and equipment is stated at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Acquisition – All acquisitions of assets (except caricatures but including lhe updating on all honour boards, pholos and framing of posters) are recorded at the cost of acquisition, being the purchase consideration determined as at the date of acquisition, plus costs incidental to acquisition,

Caricatures - They are anticipated to have indeterminate useful life. Their service potential has not, in any material sense, been consumed during the reporting period and as such, no amount for depreciation is recognised.

Depreciation - Is calculated on a diminishing value basis using the following rates: Honour boards, photos and posters 10% Plant and equipment 30%

(d) Cash assets Cash assets are carried at face value of the amounts deposited.

(e) Inventories Inventories are carried at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Net realisable value is determined on the basis of each inventory line's estimated selling price.

(f) Payables Trade creditors represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the Association prior to the end of the financial year and which are unpaid. The amounts are unsecure and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

(g) Taxee The Association is exempt from the payment of income tax under the Income Tax Assessment Act.

Goods and services tax (GST) - Revenue, expenses, assets and liabilities are recognised inclusive of the amount of GST.
