President's Report

As the curtain closes on 1993, we congratulate those umpires who achieved the ultimate in being selected to officiate in Grand Finals.

As I said at the Grand Final Dinner Dance, all umpires should be congratulated for participating this year. Success and satisfaction in umpiring should come from having had the courage to have a go and knowing that you gave your best.

The last twelve months have seen dramatic change in umpiring. I would like to briefly revisit some of those changes and then look ahead to the challenges of 1994.

I am sure David would recognise that 1993 was a learning curve for all of us, particularly with the combination of an inexperienced umpiring panel and an inexperienced coaching panel.


One thing without question is dedication to the task from all quarters and we look forward to Season 1994 with excitement.

Training Venue

Training was relocated from Harold Rossiter Park to Ernest Johnson Oval in South Perth.

At the time of the previous Committee negotiating our relocation, the South Perth City Council had lead us to believe that Trinity Aquinas Football Club would be moved away from Ernest Johnson Oval and that we would be the primary winter tenant, sharing with the Junior Football Club.

We recognise that training conditions were less than satisfactory due to the appalling state in which the Trinity Aquinas Football Club continually left the change rooms and can be assured that this situation will be remedied next



year when Trinity Aquinas will relocate to their new oval and social rooms near Collier Park.

Whilst many rumours have been circulated regarding Leederville Oval, we have had neither confirmation, nor even an approach from the West Australian Football Commission regarding our relocation to Leederville Oval.

Following our relocation to Ernest Johnson Oval at the start of Season 1993, we negotiated an arrangement with the Civic Centre Bowling Club providing every umpire with social membership and access to the fantastic social facilities at that club.

We have enjoyed an excellent relationship with the Bowling Club and must thank Hilma Repacholi, her committee and membership for their generous hospitality.

Sponsorship

AMPOL continued to show outstanding support to the W.A.N.F.L.U.A. and we would like to recognise their support.

I would personally like to thank Mark Kevin and particularly Ross Benzie for their support in developing a new structure for our Umpiring Awards, which included a magnificent television and video set being awarded to the Field, Boundary and Goal Umpire of the Year.

Rick Hart joined us for the first time this year by arrangement through David Johnson. Their contribution of television and video equipment contributed significantly to the coaching aids from which all umpires benefited.

W.A.N.F.L.U.A. Committee

We are fortunate in umpiring to attract individuals of the calibre of those gentlemen represented on our Committee. Each Committeeman was allocated a specific portfolio of responsibility and each responded to produce a net result of another great year for this Association.

I will not name them all, but would like to offer each my personal thanks for their support.

Special thanks must go to Peter Frusher (Secretary), John Hauswirth (Social Secretary) and Paul Smith (Treasurer) for the contribution they made this season.

Merribrook 1994

One of our initiatives this year was to search for a catalyst which would embrace the spirit of change within the Umpires Association and elevate us as a team to improve umpiring standards across the board. It is hoped that this will ultimately be reflected through increased participation at A.F.L. level by members of this

Association, although Merribrook is very much oriented towards the success of every umpire as part of our W.A.N.F.L.U.A. team.

Trevor Garret has done an enormous amount of work in identifying Merribrook as the most appropriate challenge for our team.

On behalf of the Management Committee I present for your consideration the Secretary's Report for 1993.





Treasurer's Report

Well its that time of the year again to reflect on what went down during 1993. Apart from what has happened on the field, there have been some changes to our accounting procedures this year. In the past we have not accounted for depreciation in our books, rather holding goods at their purchased value, thus keeping an inflated value of the Associations worth.

Another anomaly in the books that has been carried over in the past two years has been the inclusion of three microwave ovens in our list of assets. Two have been stolen over the last two years and we have replaced them. The fact that they were not written off in the books earlier was that we were hoping that insurance would cover the loss. The insurance company has not paid up.

I consulted with our Auditor, Denis Heaney, and we agreed that since I was introducing a new accounting system, this would be the best time to reassess our list of assets and make allowances for depreciation. For this reason, the opening assets for 1992-93 are not the same as the closing assets for 1991-92. The revised closing assets for 1991-92 have been amended to account for depreciation and write off of stolen microwaves.

This year we did not sell any alcohol to speak of (apart from a small amount during pre-season) and this reflected in the gross revenue from bar takings (down \$6,000). Also, there were several "free shows" provided by your committee at the Bowling Club which has reduced the profit on our bar trading (to \$400). This "shortfall" in our profitability was met in the form of \$2,000 sponsorship by the Civic Centre Bowling Club. Allowing for the \$735 that we paid to the CCBC so that all of us became social members of the CCBC, this resulted in a net figure of around \$1,700. This was put towards the Grand Final Dinner Dance along with the money raised from the Quiz Night.

The commission received from the National Australia Bank represents commission earned over the past two years. When the bank realised the size of the commission, with the fall in interest rates and other banking practices making margins very tight, they advised us that this year would be the last that we would receive commission. Our account has been reviewed accordingly.

We also paid the rental for the use of Harold Rossiter Park over the previous three years. We were in dispute with the Perth City Council in a number of areas which resulted in our tardy



payment of the account. It was finally paid to allow the Vic Park Cricket Club to start extensions to the clubrooms.

Yearbook advertising looks to have fallen from 1992, however, 1992 has both the 1990 and 1991 advertising revenue recorded in the same year.

Two other items on the accounts reflect fund raising that was done for the 1994 Training Camp at Merribrook. These are the Raffle (\$2,444 profit) and Chook Lotto (\$380 profit). Combined with the \$900 that members have deposited for the camp represents a large chunk of what is required to stage this event. Any members that have not paid their \$25 deposit can do so on AGM night.

The Association's funds are in good condition which will enable us to provide facilities for you when a permanent home for umpiring is decided upon.

In closing I would like to thank Trevor Pescud and Trevor Cant on the excellent job they did once again with the Quiz Night. The money that was raised went toward the GFDD and all who attended that event got value for money. Thank you also to John Hauswirth for your efforts as Social Secretary and to Peter Frusher as Secretary. Since you are both retiring from the Committee this year I would like to personally thank you for your efforts over the past two years. You have left a big hole for others to fill.

Thanks to all the wives/mothers/girlfriends who helped out in the kitchen this year. The service was excellent.



Field Umpires Coach Report

The 1993 season was a challenging one with some of our senior umpires retiring after the 1992 season. (There were five experienced umpires available this season with two of them picked for AFL duty.)


While the numbers were encouraging for this season, there were a lot of new umpires, which resulted in a relatively inexperienced panel. These umpires were asked to umpire at higher levels than would normally be the case and to their credit they did very well.

All umpires started slowly but improved as the season progressed, while their fitness levels were much higher than in previous seasons which is a credit to them for the work that they have put in.

The field umpires were separated into three groups at the start of the year (AFL and League in one group, Reserves in the next and Colts in the third). While it was designed that the umpires umpired in these groups, only it was possible for an umpire to be promoted to the next level but he could not go backwards except for the finals. This innovation was very successful and will be continued next season.

The umpires in the Colts group were the least experienced with only a handful having umpired before at this level. They umpired well throughout the season and showed that there was plenty of talent among them. Congratulations to all of them, they will go a long way in umpiring.

The Reserves group also performed very well. They were joined by a number coming up from the Colts group and as they had been promoted to this level they were then only available for League or Reserves football. This put a lot of pressure on League and Reserves umpires to perform, which they did.



The performance of the League/AFL group was very encouraging. They not only had to make the right decisions but had to have a good rapport with the players and officials. The future of some of these umpires is good and they will, through dedicated hard work, succeed at AFL level.

The areas requiring improvement from a coaching aspect are:

(a) Skill drills (to start early February)

(b) Level 3 Accreditation (early February)

(c) Meetings (to start earlier in the season in conjunction with accreditation and to be more finely tuned and shorter).

In finishing, I wish all umpires the best for Christmas and for the coming 1994 season.


The excellent efforts of David Johnson with his enthusiasm for umpiring were reflected in the positive attitude of us all in our commitment to umpiring in the 90's.


Unfortunately, with the exit of "The Legend" (hip hip hooray) I have had to ask my umpires for any stories that have occurred while travelling to country areas.



Regulations

The following Regulations represent the Code of Conduct applicable to all members of the WANFL Umpires Association.

- 1 The spirit of these Regulations is to promote a professional image for umpires of Australian football and to foster good fellowship and mutual respect amongst members of the WANFLUA.
- 2 Behaviour:
 - A professional standard of behaviour and conduct is expected of all members both on and off the field.
 - All members of this Association shall be considered equal and each member is required to respect and uphold the rights of other members.
 - Umpires shall conduct themselves in an impartial manner and shall uphold the laws of the game and the reputation of the WANFLUA.
- 3 A professional standard of attire is required at all in-season games and official functions, unless officially stated otherwise. Pre-season games attire may be casual, however neat.
- 4 It is incumbent on all umpires to familiarise themselves with The Laws of Australian Football and the WANFL Umpires Association Constitution and Rules which form the basis of this Association.
- 5 Members shall respect and adhere to directions from the Director of Umpiring and other officials appointed by the WAFL, AFL or other controlling bodies or Commissions. The only exceptions permitted from this regulation shall be in the instance of decisions endorsed by the Management Committee or the membership of the WANFLUA.
- 6 Written complaints regarding alleged breaches of these regulations may be lodged with the Management Committee which may then exercise its powers in accordance with Clause 21 of the Constitution and Rules.
