

President's Report



Thanks is also expressed to David Johnson and the WAFC for their support of this event through the contribution of \$2,000 towards the cost of the camp.

I am pleased to advise, the preseason camp is on again for the 2000 football season and will occur on the weekend of 11, 12 and 13 February 2000 at Ern Halliday in Sorrento. I urge all umpires and members who did not make it in 1999 to make 2000 a date, as I can confidently say on behalf of all those who attended in 1999 enjoyed the team bonding and camaraderie achieved from this weekend. The format for the 2000 camp is proposed to be fairly similar,



however there will be some improved and different activities to keep it up vibe and interesting.

The key thing about this is the non-relevance of "National" in our title, given the AFL is now our national league. It is mine and the committee's belief with the Year 2000, it would be fitting to have a new, more relevant name. Other benefits would be a new, modern logo, a new association tie and other paraphernalia to give us a new kick into the next century.

Next year will also see the committee pursuing plans for a gymnasium/fitness equipment, primarily to aid in the variety of training and the rehabilitation of injured umpires. This is an area we will be looking at in conjunction with the City of South Perth, the WAFC and the other users of Ernest Johnson Oval facilities

Treasurer's Report

I have decided to stand down as Treasurer. I have been the Treasurer of this Association for 9 years and I feel it is about time to hang up my calculator.

There is a large workload in any honorary position in this Association, and it is important that you, the members, help out when asked by your elected Committee. Most of the time, the best way you can help is to attend all functions, put your name down for those functions promptly and pay up when asked.

Remember this when the new season comes. I was still chasing subscriptions up until the lead up to finals. So, please take some responsibility in helping out when required.

There are a few items on the operating statement that will need some qualification, so here goes.

Firstly, there is an item called "Adjustment to accumulated depreciation". By way of explanation, when I took over the role as Treasurer for the second time, two years ago, I was instructed to recreate the Associations accounts on an accrual basis. Part of this involved adding assets to the asset schedule and setting out the depreciation schedule. Last year, we revisited the asset schedule and made sure that all assets were listed/removed as required. A calculation of the accumulated depreciation showed that we were carrying more that calculated, mainly because we were carrying some depreciation from retired assets. To bring the figure back in line, we needed to make an adjustment in the operating statement. This amounted to a figure of \$1,006 adding to the surplus for the year.

The second item I wish to comment on is "Loss on disposal of assets". There was a fridge listed in our assets, the one that was in the clubrooms before the new one that the SPJFC put in. This has gone so was retired from our books, the cost being \$159 being the residual value on the books. The other \$159 is the residual value on the microwave oven that was stolen earlier this year after a break-in.

The last item I will comment on in detail is the item "Trophies" which is currently showing a "profit" of \$719. We always carry a deficit of this amount. The reason for this surplus is that we have been asked to bill AMPOL for the Umpire of the Year prizes, and since we have



included this amount in the receipts (\$1,400) we have no corresponding payment. I assume that we will when the time comes as I now understand that we will be passing on this amount to Rick Hart for the winning umpires to spend up.

There are considerable funds tied up in "Accounts receivable". Most of this amount is owed by the WAFC. We have several invoices with them that are awaiting settlement.

Overall, the Association has had a reasonable year, the effective surplus for the year being in the region of \$3,000.

But there have been enormous workloads placed on the Committee from members of this Association not doing their bit. There have been several "no show" members who have put their name down for functions and failed to attend. Several social functions had to be cancelled due to poor responses, and I along with Adam Binks and Peter Frusher were chasing fees well into the season.

Please make it easy for my replacement and he may stay around for a while.

Enjoy your break, it all starts earlier next season.

Social Secretary's Report






Similarly, senior umpires also performed to a very high standard and it was very pleasing to see Mark Fussell and Craig Hendrie return to a standard that reflects their ability.

Fitness Coach's Report

Season 1999 has been completed. It provided a very solid building block for the umpires to build on for next season. David Johnson and myself met at the start of the season and set goals that were to be achieved by the end of the season. They regarded the fitness, make-up of training, and attitude of the umpires. The new motto of "stronger, sharper, faster, better" was not only to apply to the umpiring but to the training and approach of the umpires. Being the best umpires in the state meant that they should train as such. This took time to install but by the end of the season the atmosphere at training had a new look and at a consistently at a high level. The younger umpires trained commendable and should set the standard next year.

Some new training was introduced this year and I will run through it briefly.

- · A variety of activities were chosen to improve the umpire's fitness, give them a solid base to start the season, and avoid any injuries at all cost.
- · Warm-up routine: This was set-up to make sure the umpires were properly prepared before training and to avoid injuries. It was the same throughout the season to give a sense of routine and set a standard of discipline. Stretches were spaced between different forms of running (high knees, forwards, backward, sideways, butt kicks and crosso-
- · Triathlons: These were chosen because they are an excellent way to improve aerobic fitness. Also they provide a variety of training which is a key issue to promote interest.
- Swimming: Another variety exercise. Water supports joints while still improving aerobic fitness considerable. Water polo was included for enjoyment and variety.
- Running (Sir James Mitchell Park, Kings Park): These were the only hard road running exercises that were done. This was decided because of the emphasis on having an injury-free season. Even though it has a minor role in the pre-season it provides a good fitness base, especially for boundary
- · Interval Training: This involved the performance of repeated exercise bouts, with brief recovery periods in-between. The advantage of this exercise is that it is a means of performing large amounts of high



intensity exercise in a short time. It is also specific to the workload that the umpires experience in a game situation. Distances of 800m, 400m, 200m were used at various times.

- Circuits: I believe in the use of resistance exercises to make athletes better runners and avoid injuries. Certain exercises were selected to improve the abdominal strength, which help support and balance the body when running. Exercises were also chosen to increase upper and lower body strength that I believed was lacking in the umpires. These exercises help the umpires in their bouncing and throwing, and short and long running. Boxing was done to improve the players focus, reflexes, and aerobic fitness.
- Agility: involved the umpires being able to start, stop and change direction with balance and speed. This is important for all umpires to make sure they are always in the right
- · Sprints: long, medium and short sprint distances were used to improve the umpires off the mark, and general speed. Advice was given to umpires if there were flaws in their running style.

The aim of the schedule was to taper down the volume of the training and moderately increase the intensity. The umpires had built a good aerobic base during the pre-season and this was to be maintained. Tuesday was designated as a hard training night and Thursday would be short and sharp to allow the umpires to be 100% for the weekends games.

Specific training became a major part of be included. New training will involve the training schedule. This was done to work on distinct skills that the players required. A large variety of exercises were used to keep the umpires motivated and hone aerobic performance. Football exercises were incorporated to also help motivate and provide variety. All umpires found these exercises motivating and it helped them work together and enhanced their attitude throughout the hard part of the season.


Triathlons will be used again but on less occasions. Swimming and Kings Park will be used on occasions. Interval running will again

continuous running and Fartlek training. Sprints and agility exercises will be used but in different varieties. Particular emphasis will be placed on circuits to improve overall strength of the athletes, and add variety to training.

Congratulations to all umpires who achieved milestones and farewell to the senior umpires who have elected to retire. I look forward to an exciting season next year. Remember to keep your fitness levels up over the off-season.






THE STANDARD ORDER-OFF RULE FOR COMMUNITY FOOTBALL

A Standard Order-Off Rule for Community Football that was trialed across the State in 1998, underwent an evaluation and was modified and adopted for use during the 1999 season. The Rule involves the use of a Red and Yellow Card system to assist umpires in controlling misdemeanours of Players or Officials. Basically the Yellow Card offence is issued for minor offences (including swearing) and requires that an offender to be ordered off the field for 15 minutes but can be replaced after 15 minutes playing time has elapsed. Where an umpire considers that an offender's action warrants the offence to be dealt with by a Protests and Disputes Tribunal, the offender shall be issued with a Red Card. The offender shall be ordered off the field for the remainder of the match, but can only be replaced by another player after 15 minutes playing time has elapsed.

COUNTRY PANEL

Upper Great Southern, Lower South West and Eastern Districts were serviced this year by 12 Westar umpires, making up 69 umpiring appointments for the season.

The Country Panel consisted of Brett Rosebury, David Corcoran, Dean Margetts, Paul



St. Quintin, Jeff Petrie, Brendan Marsh, Tony Petrie, Ryan Worthington, Gavin Statham, James Friend, Tony Raudino and Paul Pitchers.

Earlier this year we saw Dean Margetts and Paul St. Quintin assisting with a development program involving umpires in the Eastern Districts Football League. This commitment was greatly appreciated by the EDFL. Finals at the Upper Great Southern and the Lower South West Football Leagues are now controlled by their own panels. Match payments remained the same as in 1998. That is: \$125 (under 250km) and \$165 (over 250km) with corresponding Finals fees of \$180 and Grand Final fees of \$230. The travel allowance remained at \$0.40 per kilometre

Congratulations to all Country Panel members for your co-operation and encouragement to fellow country umpires. Besides providing added experience for yourselves, your commitment has been instrumental in raising an awareness of the standards required to umpire at a higher level.

Umpiring services to the Mercantile Football Association (a social competition that played on a fortnightly basis) were discontinued this year.

On behalf of the Country Football Leagues and the West Australian Football Commission, I would like to thank the country panel umpires for their willing assistance throughout the year


Life Members Trophy


