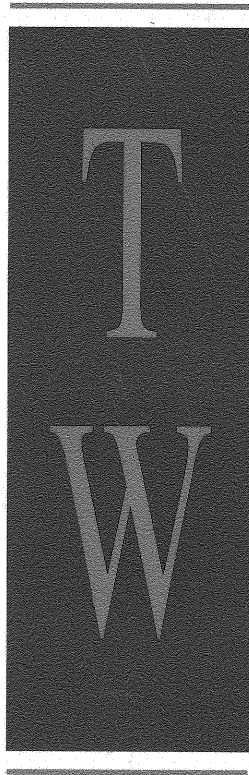
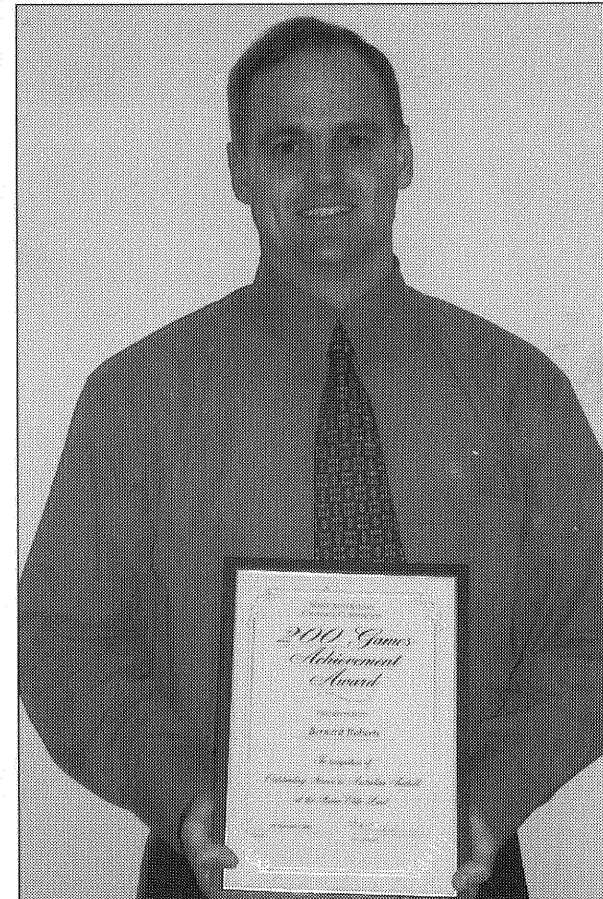

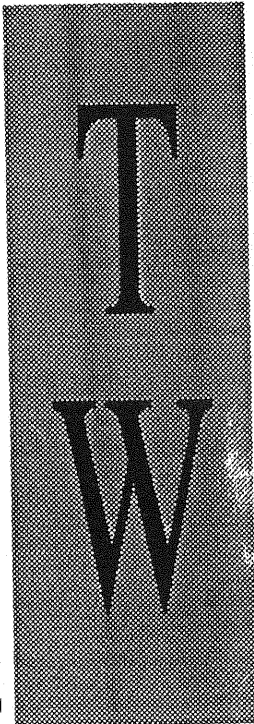

## President's Report

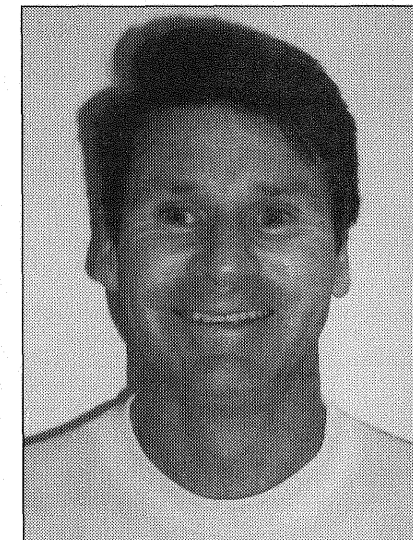
As the curtain is drawn on the 2001 football season, the 49<sup>th</sup> in the proud history of this club, we reflect on the tragic events of September 11<sup>th</sup>. It is one of those moments that will forever be etched in my mind. My thoughts go out to the families of the many thousands of innocent people that lost their lives.

It is perhaps a little ironic that at the beginning of every season it always looks like it will be a long year, especially when we are putting in all the hard work during pre-season training. However, in what seems like the blink of an eye the grand final has been played, the celebrations are over and we reflect on how quickly it all passed. But it isn't long before we find other things to do on training nights and weekends.

As usual the year kicked off with another fantastic training camp. This year we had a change of venue with the camp being held at Point Walter. The venue, food and the program were excellent. I would like to thank Trevor Garrett and his organising committee for putting together such a wonderful event. It is just a shame that there were not more umpires in attendance.

There is one particular moment from the camp that I would like to share with you which I think epitomises the character of those that choose to become umpires. It involves one of our newest and youngest members Gus Coelho. One of the challenges that was set at the camp was to scale a 10 metre high pole, climb onto a platform and then leap to a trapeze swing some 2 metres away. This is known as the "Pamper Pole". Anyway, Gus patiently sat and watched the other umpires as they climbed the pole and leapt for the swing...some succeeding and others not. Finally it was Gus's turn. Everyone watched as he gingerly climbed the pole. When he reached the top he stood on the platform but couldn't bring himself to jump. So he sat down, eased himself off the platform and was gently lowered to the ground.

Gus was not satisfied with this, so he decided to have another go. This time when he stood on the platform he drew on his courage to make a leap for the swing. He almost made it with his fingertips grazing the trapeze bar. After being lowered to the ground for a 2<sup>nd</sup> time Gus was still not satisfied, he didn't want this challenge to get



the better of him. So he decided to have one more go. However, this time when he stood up on the platform he placed a blindfold over his eyes. When he had composed himself he made one final leap, this time catching the trapeze swing with both hands.

This just goes to prove that if at first you don't succeed then try, try again. It certainly sets a fine example for everyone to follow and is something to reflect on when things are not going as well as you would like.

The 2002 camp has been booked for the same venue, however final arrangements will depend on the extent of financial support that can be provided by the Commission. This year the Commission again covered the cost of our accommodation, which greatly assisted in keeping the cost down. If the commission is unable to provide the same level of support next year then we will need to consider some alternatives.

It would be fair to say that this has been a tough year off the field for football in WA, particularly from a financial point of view. Unfortunately the financial well being of football is very much dependent on the on-field achievements of our 2 AFL clubs. With both clubs performing poorly in 2001 this has had a considerable impact on the

Commission's financial position. No doubt this will ultimately have some flow-on effect for umpiring in WA.

Fortunately for our Association we were successful in negotiating a new 3-year fees and conditions agreement with the Commission prior to the start of the season. In hindsight this was a fantastic outcome for our members as it guarantees our fee structure until the end of the 2003 season. Hopefully by then the fortunes of our 2 AFL clubs will have improved.

Under the new fees and conditions agreement we have achieved an overall increase of 28% in total match payments over the life of the agreement. For the first time we have a phasing in of match payments with increases for all umpires in each of the years. A further successful outcome was the securing of life passes for all retired members who are currently receiving them.

Another factor that is likely to have a significant impact on us is the termination of Caltex's/Ampol's 24 year relationship with umpiring. This has already had a direct impact on our Association as no funds were provided last year or this year to cover the cost of many of our awards. Instead these costs have had to be met by the Association. We are currently in the process of finding new sponsors for these awards in future years.

David Johnson has been actively pursuing a number of possible new sponsors and it will be interesting to see what our uniforms will look like next year.

While on the topic of sponsors it is fantastic to have the on-going support of Taylor Woodings Financial Services who are the major sponsor of our Association. Again they provided us with our training gear, which just adds to the professional manner in which our club approaches our sport. As an added bonus John Deacon donated some magnificent polo shirts for all of the committee members. I would like to thank John for his continued support of umpiring and our Association and I look forward to this relationship continuing for many years to come.

There are a number of other support sponsors that we have had during the year which have helped to provide both an incentive and encouragement to our members.

The Rick Hart Group has been a long time supporter of umpiring in WA. I would like to

thank Rick Hart and Grant Murdoch for their ongoing support which includes the provision of video and television equipment.

The Walk Café have again come on board to provide us with vouchers which we have used to award to the various umpires of the round.

John & Georgie McKay have again supported our Association through their sponsorship of Grand Final awards as well as donating their award winning ice cream for our camp.

This year we have been fortunate to secure some further support sponsorship from Alan "Chubby" Stiles, of Grand Cinemas, who donated 10 movie passes each week to be used at our discretion and many of you have benefited from these.

Another new sponsor this year was Alan & Betty Mirrabella who sponsored our sausage sizzles prior to the umpire of the round awards. They have also kindly donated some of their products, shampoos, etc to be used by our members in the clubroom showers.

I would like to thank all of these sponsors for their support and generosity during the year and I hope that you will all be there to support us again next year in the 50<sup>th</sup> year of our Association. My apologies if I have missed anyone.

Another bonus that we received this year was courtesy of the Commission who provided us with 2 passes to the Associates Bunker for each of the AFL games to be used at the discretion of the Committee. This is a wonderful acknowledgment of the contribution that our Association makes to football in WA and also provides us with a means of entertaining some of our sponsors. It also allows us to mix with members from the other WAFL clubs and Commission representatives who all share in the use of the Bunker. I would like to thank the Commission for providing their support in this manner.

While on the topic of support from the Commission I would like to thank David Johnson for all his efforts and support during this year. His tireless efforts continue to improve the facilities that we have down at E.J. This year we saw the addition of a 2<sup>nd</sup> light tower on the eastern side of the oval, which has also provided some lighting to the top oval. The training facilities that we have available are beginning to rival those of the WAFL clubs and are certainly the envy of other umpiring Associations around the country. David has further plans to improve

the facilities, which I am sure we will hear more about in the future.

The clubrooms have also seen a bit of a face-lift this year courtesy of the South Perth Junior Football Club who arranged for the installation of the concertina door between the social room and the lecture room. This has certainly added to the overall amenity of the venue.

This year has also seen the retirement of 2 long serving umpires who have made wonderful contributions to the Association. Firstly, Simon Gill who was our president for the last 3 years and secondly Bernie Roberts who has provided us with our newsletters over many years. I wish these 2 guys all the best in their retirement and hope to see you both around the clubrooms in the future. Thanks for your respective contributions over the years and I am sure you will be greatly missed out on the track.

In addition to these retirements we have also seen a temporary transfer of Brendan Marsh who has gone to Kalgoorlie for work reasons. I am sure that Murray O'Dea will show him the ropes up there. This move happened very unexpectedly and left the committee in a difficult position, as Marshy was the secretary. I would like to thank Marshy for all his efforts during the year as he certainly helped get things back in order. I would also like to thank David Corcoran for stepping in and taking on the secretary's role after Marshy's departure.

Another departing umpire and committee member is Brett Rosebury, who has decided to move to Melbourne to further his AFL career. I wish Brett all the best and know that this move

will definitely prove to be a positive one for him. Thanks Brett for your help during the year.

While I am talking about the committee I would also like to thank all the other members for their help and support during the year, this has been greatly appreciated.

Finally, thank you to all the life members who answered Andrew Shepherdson's call for support. It has been fantastic to see so many of you down at the clubrooms especially at our umpire of the round sausage sizzles. I look forward to the same level of support next year and call on all the other life members to get on down and be part of the club.

Moving on to 2002. This will be the 50<sup>th</sup> year of our Association and it will be a year of celebration. There are a number of exciting things that we have planned so stay tuned we want you all to be there and share in the celebrations

In preparing for this event we have been researching the history of the Association. Andrew Curtis has been relentless in his pursuit of information. No final decisions have been made about how we will record the history of the past 50 years, as there is still a lot more work to be done. Any help and support that you can provide to Andrew would be greatly appreciated.

In closing I wish you all a happy Christmas and New Year and look forward to seeing you all on the track next year.

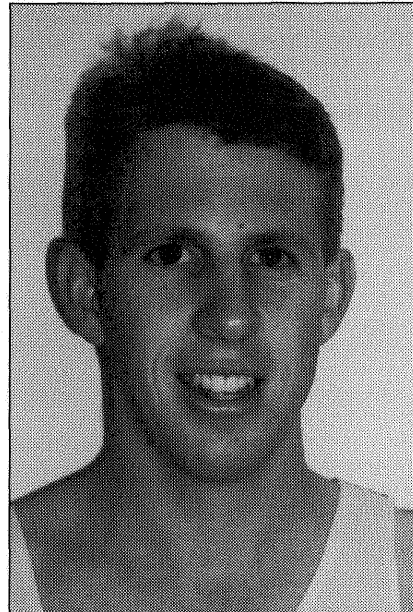
## Secretary's Report

To anyone who didn't get their new tie please come and see me early next year so we can correct it and get you your tie.

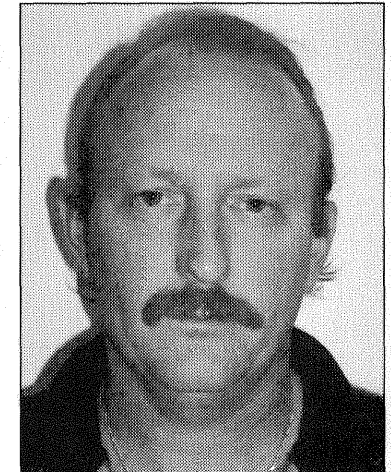

The loss that is shown for this function is due mainly to outstanding accounts from the previous year that weren't taken into account when last years books were done. The function this year actually made a small profit from selling the seats to the grand final.

All up there has been an improvement in the bottom line profit of almost \$6,000 from last year. This places the association in a good position to grow bigger and stronger next year.

## General Manager's Report

In recent times I have attempted to report on the positives that have been achieved in Umpiring in Western Australia. The reason is quite simply because of the very negative situation officials in sport so often find themselves. My message in 2001 is one of seeking assistance.

By realising where we have come from, where are we now and seeking where we want to be, perhaps together we can all make a difference, where too few are often being asked to find the solutions.

Constantly I am asked, "Why isn't more money being spent on promotion and recruitment? along with what are you doing to keep umpires within the sport?" With nine years experience in an administrative role, added to fourteen years as a running umpire, I feel I am in a position to make comment with some authority.

No amount of money nor increase in full time administrators or coaches will address the main issue of our poor image.

Image is the key to attracting greater numbers.

Image is the key in retaining umpires in the sport.

Image is the key to having more resources spent on our vital area of the game. No one has taken our role in the game seriously enough to want to make a difference.

This is where we have come from.

Today, more is spent on WA umpiring than ever before (some \$753K in 2001). Yet we still have shortages in most umpiring groups. Umpires retire after distinguished careers and after years of fantastic contribution and commitment. We have Golden Whistles to recognise individual achievements. We have the "Montgomery Medal" to recognise outstanding excellence and we have the "Ross Capes" Room to recognise an umpiring contribution to football, yet we are still mocked, spoken down to, and receive little or no promotion in media. Take Trevor Garret's announcement last year. After 15 years service, 277 senior matches, 4 Westar Grand Finals, numerous State Games and off field roles such as Association President and committeeman, Trevor received a sentence at the bottom of a feelgood article some four pages in from the back page of our morning paper. This was after a media release and numerous phone calls to sports writers – as I said, no amount of money or resources will change our image. So what will?



The answer is simple. Ourselves – the umpires themselves!

That is the now.

It is time to take responsibility. Time to do something about this image problem. We can do this in a very short time with little or no expense. By following these guidelines, at least you can say you've played a role in promoting the sport of umpiring.

- Never speak down about umpiring, particularly in a public forum.
- Apply the laws as they relate to us! Don't be afraid when a player questions you. Take action. We try and "do the right thing", yet other sports would never tolerate the insults that flow from players as we do in Australian football. Our laws enable us to eradicate insulting and offensive behaviour, yet we witness time and again umpires backing away from their duty.
- Understand the role we play in the game – understand the expectations that are held by the players, coaches, administrators, media, spectators, timekeepers, scoreboard attendants, sponsors etc.

- Stand up for what we are and above all be very proud of being a "good umpire".
- Work with the WAFL. Make them to be proud of you. After all, they are your boss and can help via club communication.
- Stop waiting for others to do your job. Make a difference, because you can.

This list is not final. As you can see, my point is that we hold the key to ongoing success. If we start working on our image on the field, if we start telling people that we are worth investing in and if we take charge, others will follow.

Added to what is being done behind the scenes, football will be, – no – umpiring will be the winner.

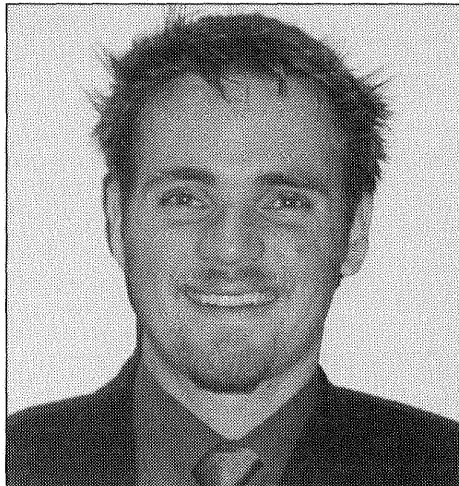

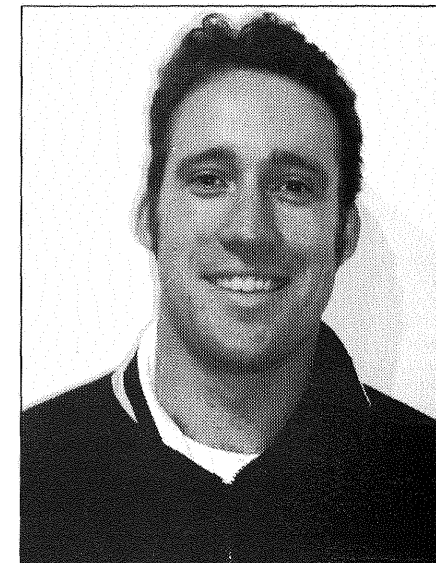

## Fitness Coach's Report

The year 2001 was a definitive year for the umpires. The umpires have slowly improved over the last two years and this year was a stand out. The performance on the track was excellent and continued on a consistent basis. Particular umpires took on leadership roles and lead from the front and kept everybody on the front foot and motivated.

The aim this year was to further reduce injuries and have everyone peaking for the finals. All the hard work was done during the pre-season and two-thirds of the in-season. This involved interval training, fartlek, middle distance, speed and agility work and other sessions that were away from Ernest Johnson to give the umpires some variety and take some stress away from the running joints and muscles. These included triathlons, swimming, "round the bridges" and Kings Park runs. Everybody found these enjoyable and that it took them away from the usual training ground.

The general feeling and attitude of the group was always positive and developed an atmosphere that was conducive to effective training. The newer umpires improved greatly and showed a keenness to take on the older blokes. The senior umpires lead from the front and gave an excellent example. The level of training that was reached allowed the remaining sessions to be tapered down in volume. Short and sharp sessions were to follow, keeping the umpires fresh but maintaining their fitness and sharpness. I would also like to thank all the coaches, senior players who assisted me throughout the season plus the whole umpiring group for a tremendous season and I look forward to putting everyone through an intense pre-season next year!

## Field Umpires Coach Report

Season 2001 represented a changing of the guard for field umpires. With senior umpires retired the group was left to contemplate the new generation of umpire. The task ahead for all of us was challenging.

We had spent most of 2000 rebuilding our group framework, focussing on a disciplined approach to all aspects of umpire performance. This was in many respects a culture shock for many umpires. Early in 2001 there appeared to be an element of complacency about the group with some believing League football would just happen as lack of depth in League experience was obvious. To counter this, the coaching staff identified some umpires in the group who in previous years had perhaps not maximised their potential. These umpires were encouraged to commit 100% effort to stepping up and placing pressure on other umpires to ensure competition for places in League football.

Thankfully many of those umpires identified accepted the challenges presented.

As a team we then set about maximising our potential. An uncompromising approach to all areas of umpire performance in 2001 was clearly evident with the group approach to pre-season. Our fitness levels began to improve dramatically and our approach to pre-season matches was fantastic. The demonstrated improvement during pre-season training and matches from 12 months previous was quite remarkable.

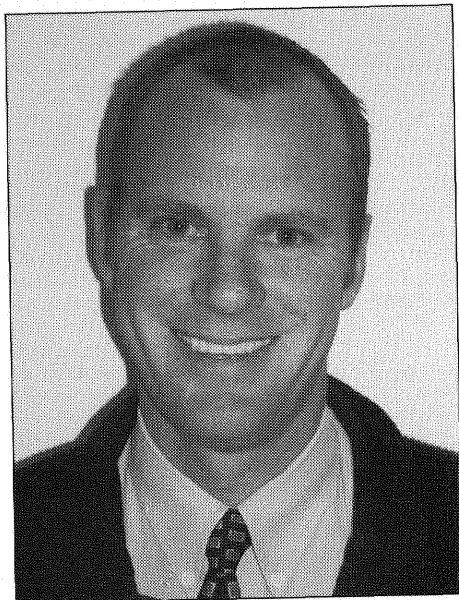
The coaching staff began to feel some confidence that this group was capable of producing some real improvements on season 2000. A number of areas where we spent significant amounts of time and resources in season 2000 were now being implemented into their early 2001 matches. The most notable being:

- A strong work ethic.
- Demonstrated game plans.
- Understanding the importance of well-executed skills.
- Commitment to teamwork.
- Ability to improve areas of concern after coaching feedback.
- Positive feeling amongst the team of umpires.

The coaching staff was well assisted in many of these areas from our leadership group within the field umpiring team. Dean Margetts (Captain),

David Corcoran (Vice Captain) on many occasions put aside their own personal needs to ensure the group remained focussed on maximising opportunities and performance. For that, we as coaches are grateful of their unselfish, mature approach.

Nineteen Umpires officiated in League matches in 2001 with five umpires making their League debuts –



David Panagopolous, Matt Hayes, Gareth Parker, Todd Keating and Craig O'Donohue. We were very pleased with the efforts of our League debut umpires in season 2001 and together with other developing umpires they hold the future of this group in their hands.

Following is a mention of each:

### David Panagopolous

David umpired 15 League matches and also participated in the U/18 championships in Melbourne. This is an effort which should not be understated. David has been in the system for a number of years and this year matured and committed to improving his umpiring. What left a lasting impression on all of us in the coaching group was David's ability in the face of disappointment after the first week of finals to reveal great character. His support, encouragement and selfless commitment to his teammates during the remaining finals were of the highest order.

### Matt Hayes

Matt umpired 11 League matches and demonstrated that when maximising his effort and commitment he has the capacity to perform extremely well. We were encouraged by Matt's performances and trust this is the beginning of a long League career.

### Gareth Parker

Gareth umpired 5 League matches and is the future of this group. Gareth has the potential to achieve many

milestones provided the correct choices are made fulfilling his potential.

### Todd Keating

Todd umpired 11 League matches. League debut at 17 is a remarkable achievement. Todd along with Gareth has the potential to achieve many milestones provided the correct choices are made fulfilling his potential.

### Craig O'Donohue

Craig umpired 1 League match in season 2001. From Melbourne Craig accepted a career opportunity in WA and from an early stage we felt he was equipped to handle senior football. The enthusiasm Craig engendered with his attitude to training and matches was very pleasing.

As the season progressed it was becoming evident that significant improvements had been made throughout the group and at seasons end we had surpassed statistically the previous season's result. To have achieved that result with significantly less experience was extremely satisfying.

Credit must go to the umpires who stuck to the task very well all season and by the end of qualifying matches had produced a good performance overall.

In finals we produced some exceptional umpiring performances mixed with some average efforts. The step up in pressure played its part and was a great learning curve for many umpires. The most important element to stand out though during the finals was the team environment. At no stage did individuals put themselves above the group and by finals end every umpire had made a contribution to the effort, which demonstrates growing maturity within the group.

Grand Final day was a win for umpiring. Each of the umpires acquitted themselves professionally and represented the group with honour. It would be remiss of me not to mention the efforts of the League Grand Final umpires. Arguably the most important match of the day was handled, in my view, magnificently. Craig Hendrie, Mark Fussell and David Corcoran demonstrated quite clearly the potential of this group when we focus on processes rather than outcome. They stuck to the game plan, umpired positively and executed the full range of skills to the highest order. Their performances were a reflection of how far this group has come in the past 12 months.

Some Umpires received personal recognition of their performances this season and they were.

### Umpire of the Year - Craig Hendrie.

Craig demonstrated ability to week in week out umpire at a very high level. His consistency, professionalism and leadership were valuable assets. On top of all this his finals campaign was terrific.

### Most Improved Umpire - Glenn Howie

Glenn had a career at the crossroads 12 months ago. His capacity to dramatically improve his overall

performance during season 2001 was one of the highlights.

Overall season 2001 was successful for the group. Our senior umpires have taken on the responsibility of leadership. Their influence over the rest of the group is now critical in ensuring continued improvement. Our second tier umpires who have achieved levels of success or placed pressure on those above are congratulated for the effort. The real test for those umpires is to now push themselves to higher levels of performance in every aspect of umpiring. To the young inexperienced umpires who shouldered the work in colts and at times reserves football, well done. These umpires represent the next generation and hopefully over the next few years we will see the emergence of some of these young men. I truly believe this group is well advanced in maximising its potential. We all must now commit to improving on season 2001 from every viewpoint.

Finally a thankyou to my coaching staff, Derrick Ernst, Kevin Castensen and Rob Kelly. We stood together all year and I am immensely proud of the efforts each of these people put in. I learnt a lot from each this season and look forward to spending more time with them in the future.

To David Johnson and Peter Troode I pass on my gratitude for the support you continue to show all coaches in umpiring.

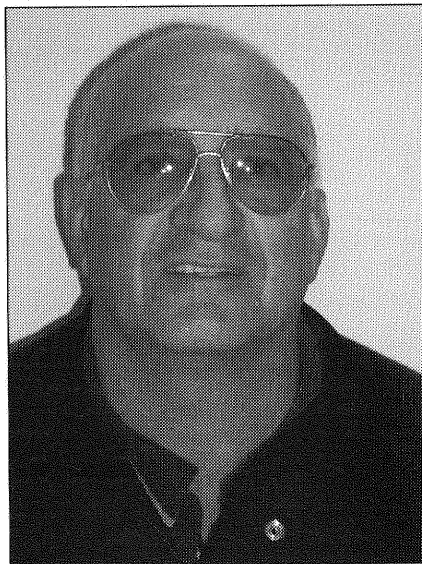
No less than five boundary umpires had long-term injuries. The coaching staff wishes them well and hopes that they can recover to be available for the 2002 season.

Success was also evident of the field with eleven boundary umpires successfully completing level 1 accreditation with two completing level two. It



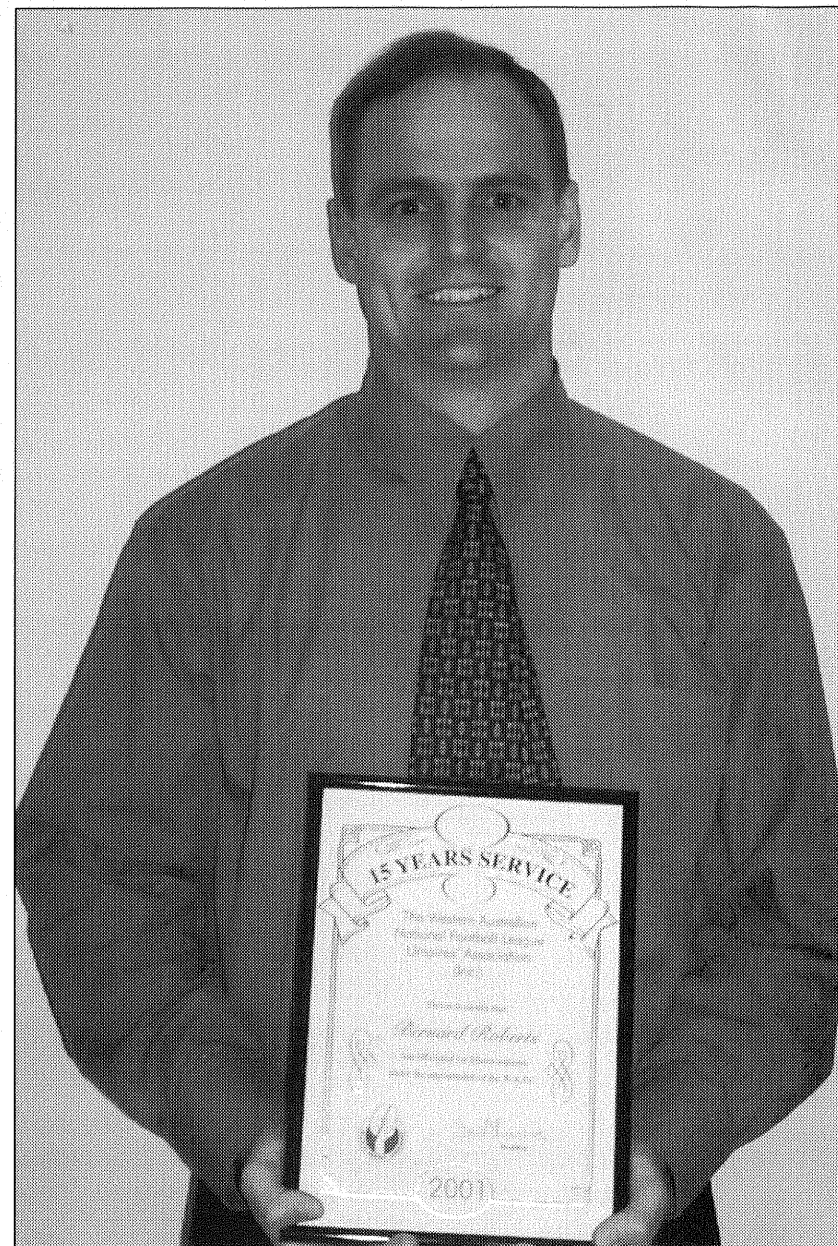

## AFL Goal Umpiring Report

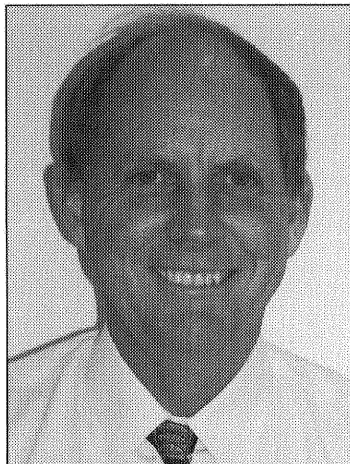

In this regard, I have sent a lengthy memo to the AFL Director of Umpiring, seeking discussion on what I see as being necessary for enhancement so as to move forward, positively, in line with the 2001 Policy guidelines.

There is an old saying, "if it ain't broke don't fix it" which is very true to how this season evolved. Very disappointingly, the TEAM spirit that we developed as a squad last year was not evident, to the same extent, this year. The start of the "proverbial hitting the fan" was when the AFL Director of Umpiring issued a letter in November 2000 to the States, advising that squads were to be reduced (in WA from 5 to 4). Although we fought this directive, given our strong performances by all members during the year, the AFL was not prepared to bend, initially.

Secondly, a very unnecessary decision was made before the season by "someone" in higher places that Goal Umpires' observers on match day would not be allowed into the rooms before the game, to speak with the goal umpires. The observer could go into the rooms after the game, but only after the Manager from each club had collected his papers, which on occasions, was 30 minutes or more after the game had ended. Another example of "support staff" mentality which makes us feel like second class citizens and takes away a united spirit and atmosphere.



Thirdly, the match day assessments carrying points allocated on set performance criteria, proved for some, an unnecessary hurdle, which took away the standard "one game at a time" requirement, so as to remain focused now and let the macro picture take care of itself.

As was stated last year and again at the beginning of this year, "to umpire AFL home and away games should be seen as a privilege, not as a right. To umpire AFL finals is therefore a bonus."

Something **slightly** more positive - well done and congratulations to Wayne and Cos on being appointed to the Australia v Ireland, International Rules Series in Adelaide on 19th October, 2001. Unfortunately, because the AFL was not able to arrange air tickets in time, they didn't get the opportunity to participate in the end, which was extremely disappointing. Professionalism is a two sided equation..

I would like to thank John Hauswirth for his fantastic support in assisting me with match day assessments throughout the entire season. I would also like to acknowledge John's dedication and performance in carrying out his WAFL coaching duties, which were first class and certainly in line with our objectives to develop youth, male or female, with promotion being the reward for commitment and effort.

without any scoring errors. This is a terrific achievement and reinforces the view that our umpires have the ability to consistently perform at the highest level.

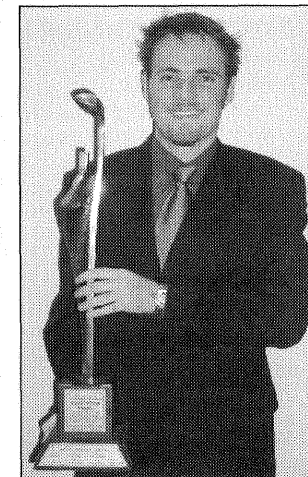
## Life Members Trophy

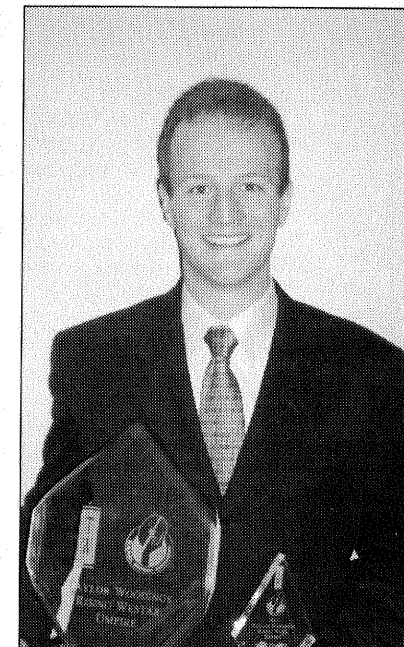

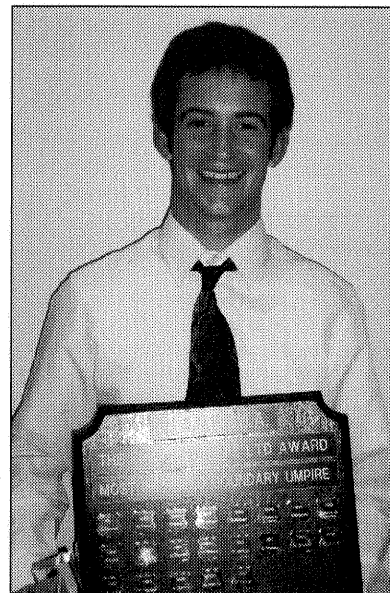

## Hall of Fame

The WANFLUA Hall of Fame was inaugurated in 1995. Prior to this year, 20 umpires had been inducted. The field umpires inducted to date (7) umpired a combined total of 1823 league games - an average of 260 each! The boundary Hall of Fame umpires (6) umpired 1001 - an average of 166 each. The goal umpires (7) umpired a total of 1577 - an average of 225 each. In total the field, boundary and goal umpires currently in the Hall of Fame had chalked up 4401 league games (equivalent to 10 full seasons per umpire). In addition, they officiated in a total of 87 grand finals (or an average of 4 each). This is truly a remarkable achievement and confirms the status of the WANFLUA Hall of Fame.

This year saw three umpires - one from each discipline - inducted into this prestigious club.

The 2001 Inductees were Ray Scott, Bill Carter and Phil Nolan. These three have certainly demonstrated their worthiness of joining such an elite group.

Ray Scott umpired 147 league games, 3 Grand Finals 1963, 67 & 68, and 9 State Games. Bill Carter umpired 212 league games, 11 Grand Finals 1955 - 1964, 1970 and 24 State Games. Phil Nolan umpired 160 League games including 30 AFL games, 3 Grand Finals 1987, 88, 90 and 4 State Games.

As part of being inducted into the Hall of Fame, the inductees were each presented with a personal caricature that will hang in the clubrooms at Ernest Johnson Reserve.
