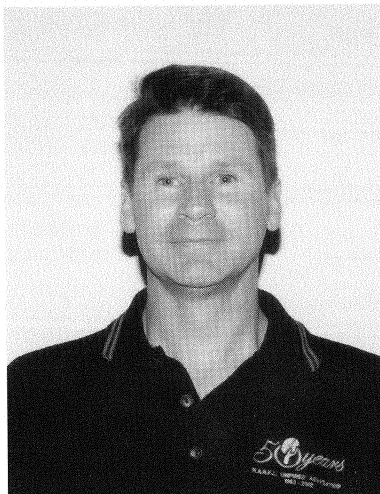

Just after the start of the home and away series we were also advised that Mike Ball had been appointed as the senior field umpires' coach. In 2003, the committee set about reversing last years loss. Fortunately we have achieved this by posting a profit of \$2843, which was a big turn around from last years loss of \$9390.

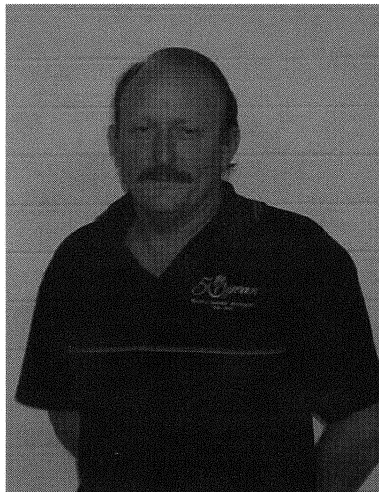
The only functions this year that did not run at a profit even if only small one, were the Training Camp, Presentation Night and Grand Final Umpires Club.

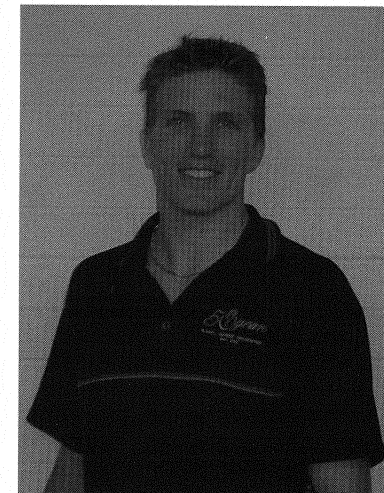

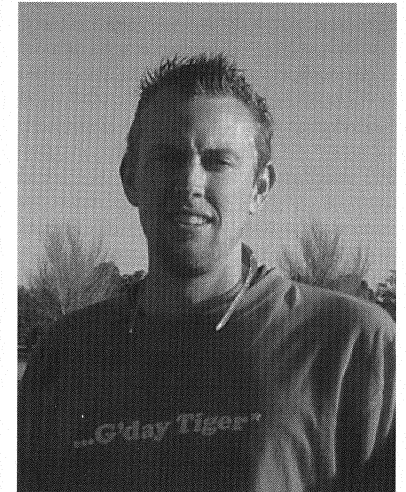

It was a slow start to the season with the change of management at the beginning of the year and a lack of trainers early on but once we got started we took off! We had a record number of trainers this year that all put in a huge effort to help the season run smoothly.

2003 saw the lowest injury count in the past 5 years with only 15 injuries requiring at least 1 game rest for the season. In previous years this figure has been as high as 40! I believe that this figure is the result of good management from all aspects of umpire training. All coaches have made it know what is required of an umpire in terms of fitness and well-being and our new fitness coach Rob, has pushed each umpire to a new level of fitness and has provided an awareness of what it takes to be an elite athlete. To top it off our medical staff have followed injuries through from start to finish in order to minimize reoccurrence and speed up recovery.

The 2003 season was the introduction of split days for the trainers. Working as a sports trainer from 8am until 5.30pm is a demanding job. The job requires the full attention of a sports trainer from start to finish. We felt that trainers could not perform at their best when they had been working all day so we introduced a split shift to provide the league umpires with a new sports trainer. The split system has worked well for us and will be continued into Season 2004

As this season has been my last I will not be around to make improvements for next year but that will not stop me making a few suggestions. In 2004 we need to see:

- Trainers working closely with the fitness coach to assist in warm up programs, general fitness programs and supervision of specific individual sessions.
- Trainers being involved in the overall 'health and well-being'. This may be on an individual level (dietary advice) or as a group where trainers provide information on 'the role of a Sports Trainer', 'different warm -



up techniques', 'alternative training sessions', hydration and nutrition advice etc

- Injury prevention workshops throughout the year. These are a great way for trainers to keep their skills up to date and it ensures that the umpires are receiving the best possible service.

I would like to thank all the coaching and management staff for your support over the years. I truly appreciate the respect you have given me in my role as Head Sports Trainer. A big thank you to all of my trainers who really do put in the hard yards to make sure that each umpire is physically ready to walk onto the field. To all the umps - thanks guys..... you have let me into your change room and respected me as a person, as your Head Trainer. I wish you all the best in the future and I am sure that I will be seeing a lot your faces on the TV as future AFL umps! Cheers. Julia

WEBSITE

The joint venture between the WANFLUA and Umpiring WA has seen continued success with the potential to further enhance it. It has been

a great recruitment avenue with around 50 inquiries over the year from November 2002 to October 2003.

UNIFORM

The group promoted a close teamwork environment at training and on match days. The team has room to improve which will only provide more opportunities for umpires in the future.

Field Umpires Coach Report

The first part of the season was to evaluate all umpires at training and in matches. The reason for this was that the coaching staff was completely new except for Rob Kelly, and had no knowledge of each umpire's standing within the group. A new feedback system was introduced and all umpires were seen consistently throughout the season.

Performance on and off field improved throughout the season with umpires reaching the goals they set out to achieve. Coaching sessions will be evaluated and altered marginally in 2004 but overall the performance level was high from all umpires.

The State game saw Greg Bandy officiate in his first state game, along side experienced umpie Craig Hendrie. Their performance was very good considering the one sided game.

The AFL Squad stayed the same as 2002 with one exception, Craig Hendrie, who was promoted to the Rookie Squad that was implemented this year. Craig was later elevated to the list when Derek Humphrey-Smith retired in July 2003. We have the potential to improve our listings in the future and as I stated throughout the year stringent guidelines exist for umpires to be elevated to the AFL list.

The performance of all umpires in the 2003 finals was incredible. All those who were given an opportunity to umpire in this prestigious competition covered themselves in glory with performances far exceeding the expectations of the coaching staff. The umpires who performed in the colts, Reserves and League grand Finals made sure we finished on a high despite the poor weather.

Umpire of the Year : Craig Hendrie completed a great year by being elevated to the AFL Squad. His remarkable performance of achieving this award three years in a row shows the commitment he made has paid off.



Most Improved : David Panagopolous has been around for a number of years and was contemplating retirement at the start of 2003, but was enticed back. This decision proved to be a positive one for him having umpired 21 League games including the League second semi-final in which he performed very well.

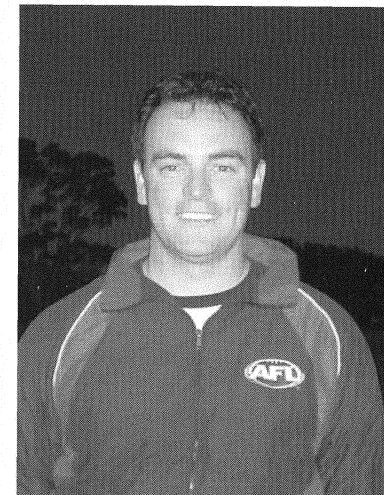

Alan, who has excellent umpiring pedigree (His father, Graeme Zanich umpired over 350 league games at the Sunday Football League), won the Devine Medal for the best boundary umpire for 2002 and officiated in his second consecutive Grand Final. His promotion to the AFL Squad is a reward for his hard work and improvement over the last couple of years.

Season 2003 can best be described as a year of opportunity. Prior to the commencement to the season three of the senior umpires decided to pursue other interests. 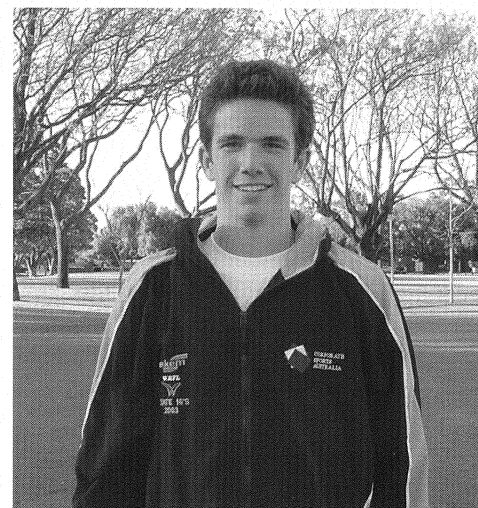

This was just the start of a big year for Craig. As a result of a number of retirements and injuries Craig was elevated to the main panel part way through the season. This makes him the third Hendrie to make it to AFL level.

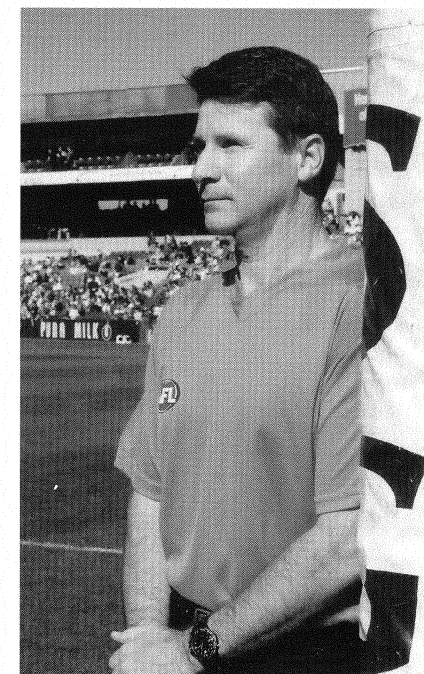

Unfortunately the 2003 year was not so memorable for David Corcoran. In controversial cir-

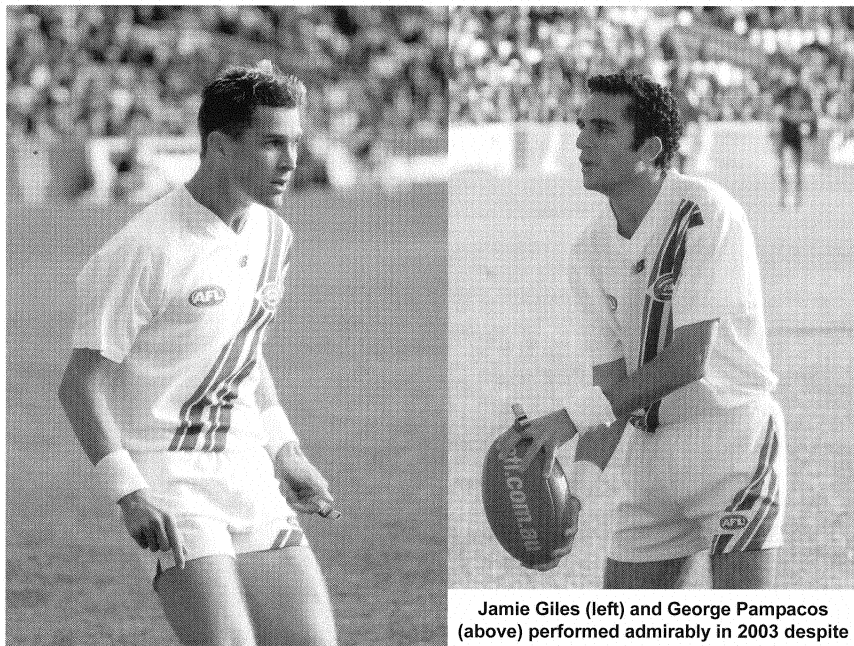

The field umpires were not the only ones to see some changes to their list during the 2003 season. After only one season in the AFL, Anthony Gooch was not offered a contract for 2003. His place was taken by Alan Zanich who was rewarded for his performances in the WAFL, which included back-to-back grand finals in 2001 and 2002. After running in the Wizard Cup Alan suffered an injury that subsequently resulted in surgery. Unfortunately this injury kept Alan off the field for the majority of the season. Although he returned to WAFL ranks later in the year he is still yet to make his AFL debut. However, I am sure that this will happen in 2004.

The injuries woes for our boundary umpires didn't stop there. Dan Gooch's run of injury was set to continue in 2003. Stranded on 199 senior games Dan underwent surgery that kept him off the field for the whole season. He is recovering well and hopefully we will see him running the white line again in 2004 and achieving the 200 game milestone.

With two of the boundary umpires sidelined with injury this left only three umpires, Greg Smith, George Pampacos and Jamie Giles to run all the games in the AFL. This was a big ask and certainly took its toll on the guys both physically and mentally. To help ease the burden Ben Brown had his AFL career resurrected for three matches during the middle of the season. Ben backed this up with his fifth WAFL Grand Final...watch out John Devine. I am sure that a recall to the AFL is a possibility for Ben sometime in the future.

The 2003 season also saw its share of disappointments for the goal umpires. After his grand final in 2002 Cos Martino started the season in good form, umpiring in the Wizard Cup grand final. Unfortunately a tough scoring decision late in the season saw Cos miss out on finals selection. Fortunately the disappointment was lessened to some degree with Cos being selected to umpire in the exhibition match in London between Collingwood and Fremantle.

After three years in a row with no scoring errors it was always going to be tough to back this up again in 2003. Unfortunately this proved to be the case with a couple of scoring errors. It just goes to show that we are all human and even the best can make a mistake.

The 2003 season did not smile on John Marrapodi or Andrew Curtis, with both missing out on the opportunity to umpire in finals. I know that both these guys will put the disappointment behind them and come back better than ever in 2004.

Our other two goal umpires Wayne Hendrie and David Shawcross were both rewarded for their consistency with selection on the AFL finals panel. After sitting on the bench in the 2002 finals Wayne was not satisfied and hit the gym with a view to going one better in 2003. The hard work and commitment paid off for Wayne who umpired in the historic final between Fremantle and Essendon and then following this up with a Preliminary Final appearance at the MCG, placing him in the top four umpires for the year.

Although David was selected to umpire with Wayne in the Fremantle v. Essendon match he was struck down with a 'mystery illness' the

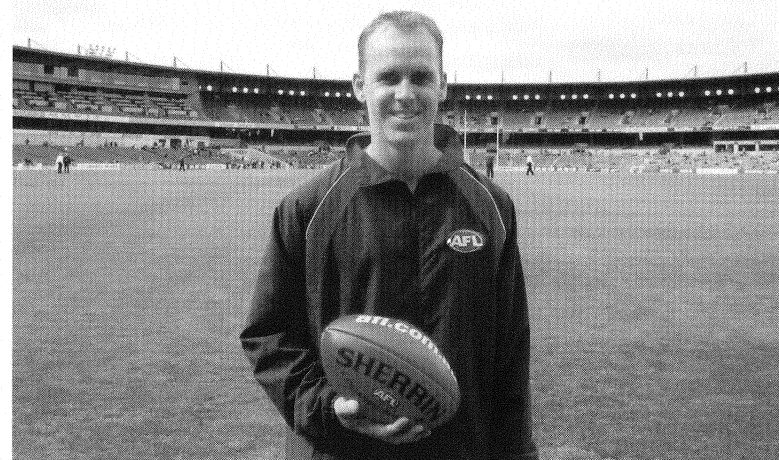
day before and had to withdraw. He was then selected to umpire the following week in Adelaide in the Port Adelaide v. Essendon match. Unfortunately for David the virus persisted and he had to withdraw again, taking him out of the finals altogether. Although disappointing there are some things that you can't control and you just have to accept it and move on.

Despite all the disappointments the year ended on a high note for George Pampacos, Jamie Giles, David Shawcross, Wayne Hendrie, Andrew Curtis and John Marrapodi who were all selected to umpire in the International Rules Match between Australia and Ireland at Subiaco Oval on 24 October 2003. Cos Martino was also selected as the third scorer for this Match. These types of opportunities are rare and all of the guys thoroughly enjoyed the Match and the atmosphere. It will be long remembered.

I know that we all learnt something from the 2003 that we can build on for next year. Enjoy the break because it won't be long before we are back into it again.

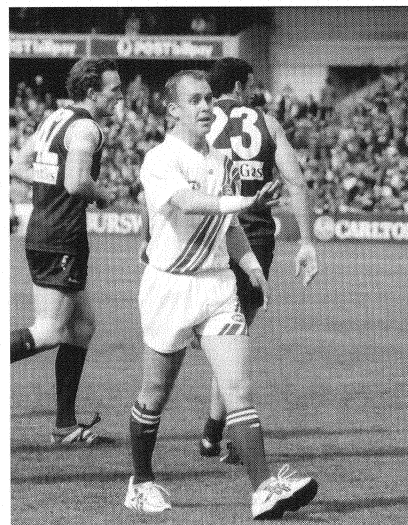

On Saturday 2nd August, Craig made his AFL debut alongside his brother, Goal Umpire Wayne Hendrie in the Round 18 match between Fremantle and Richmond at Subiaco Oval, completing the Hendrie family AFL trifecta. Craig went on to umpire another two AFL matches before finishing the season with his third consecutive League Grand Final.

Consistency and hard work have finally paid off for the 'good guy' of Umpiring. A popular recipient, we wish Craig all the best in his AFL career.

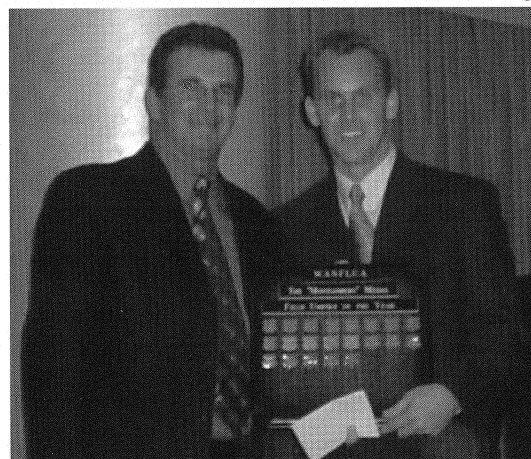

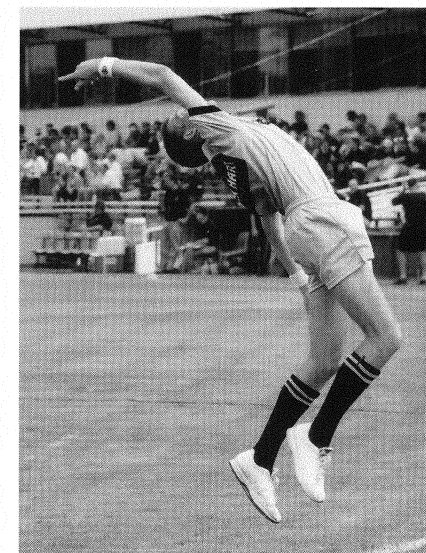

Ben Brown 2003 Devine Medalist

Another umpire who stepped into elite company in 2003, Ben Brown now finds himself second only to umpiring great John Devine in number of League Grand Finals umpired by a boundary umpire. Nicknamed 'Rambo' by Boundary Umpires coach Sean Fairfoul, Brown set the standard in 2003 from start to finish, umpiring an incredible 26 games, including the State Game, and rescuing WA's injury ravaged AFL boundary contingent. Brown acquitted himself admirably in his three match return to AFL ranks, staking a solid claim for a permanent contract in the future with his fifth League Grand Final.

A leader and highly regarded Committee member, Brown's work ethic on the field and on the training track sets the standard across disciplines. Always the first to acknowledge the fact that umpiring is a team game, at 25 Brown now finds himself in the 'veteran' category and an inspiration to a new generation of umpires. With a role model of the character and talent of Ben Brown, the future of boundary umpiring is certain to be well catered for.

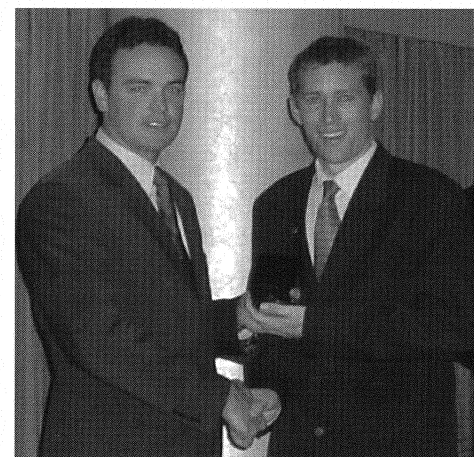

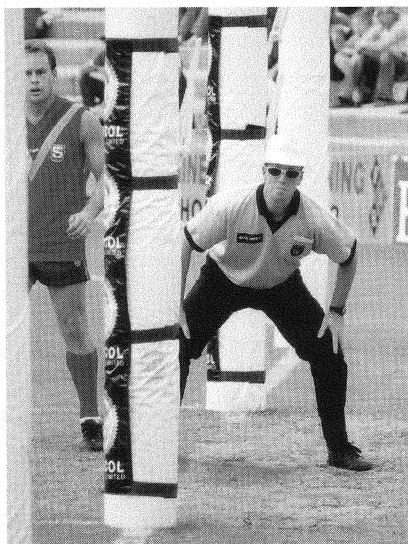


Boundary Umpires Coach Sean Fairfoul presents Ben Brown with the 2003 Devine Medal.

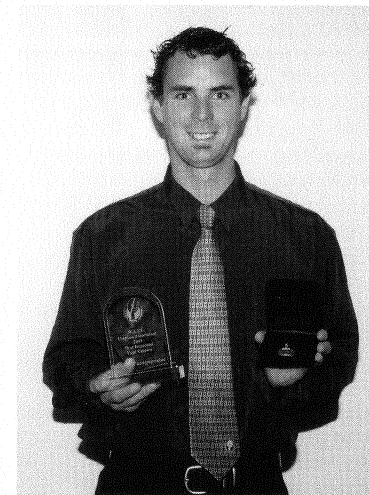

The WANFLUA Hall of Fame was inaugurated in 1995 to recognise umpires who have excelled in their chosen discipline. In order to be eligible for induction into the Hall of Fame, an umpire must have been retired for at least three years. Prior to this year, 26 umpires had been inducted, all with similarly impressive achievements in football, regardless of the era in which they umpired. Following the success of 2002's 50th Anniversary function, the 2003 Hall of Fame evening was expanded into a combined Hall of Fame and past umpires function. Held at the Association clubrooms at Ernest Johnson Pavillion on the weekend of the State Game, it is hoped that this will continue to remain an annual event.

In 2003, three more legends received the honour of joining this prestigious group. Field umpire Bob Phillips and contemporary greats Peter Frusher and Paul Smith.

Perhaps best known for ending Ross Capes' historic run when he was appointed to the 1980 Grand Final, Bob Phillips umpired 213 games, including the 1982 Grand Final. Unfortunately his career was severely interrupted by knee injuries, with Phillips losing the equivalent of two full seasons.

Peter Frusher, the Boundary Umpire games record holder with 264 games made his WAFL

debut in 1986 as a 33 year old. Despite the late start to his career, he went on to umpire AFL football in 1989 officiating in a total of 24 AFL games, along with four League Grand Finals (1989, 90, 91, 99), six Reserves Grand Finals and five State Games, including the 1989 State of Origin game between Victoria and Western Australia when he replaced an injured Phil Nolan.

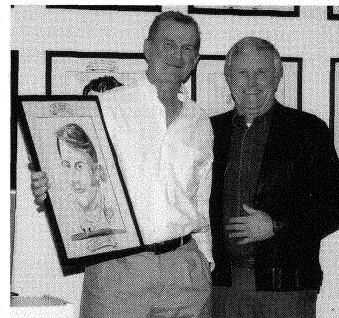
The Association games record holder, Goal Umpire Paul Smith retired in 1999 with 319 senior games, including 109 AFL. Smith began his WAFL career in 1984, was elevated to the AFL panel in 1988, becoming the first WA goal umpire to officiate in an AFL finals series. He went on to officiate in four WAFL Grand Finals (1987, 1991, 92, 94) and six AFL finals series.

All Hall of Fame inductees are presented with a personal caricature, which are proudly displayed alongside those of previous Hall of Fame inductees in the Association clubrooms. The WANFLUA Management Committee again thanks Peter Frusher for his invaluable assistance in maintaining the Hall of Fame's visual impact.

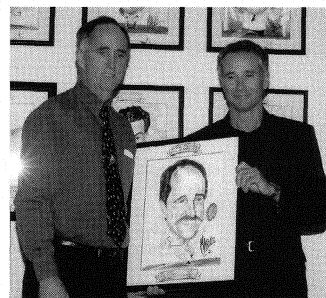
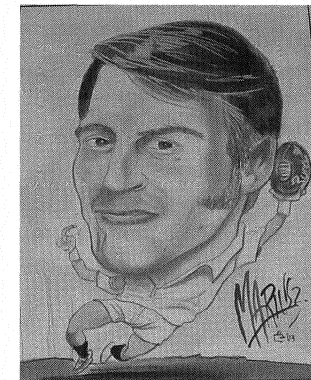
