

President's Report

2004 was a landmark year for the WANFLUA with the successful negotiation of a new 3 year agreement with the WAFC. The main feature of this agreement was that for the first time WAFL Umpires would be officially recognised as employees of the WAFC. At the beginning of the season every Umpire signed a letter of employment with the WAFC. This was underpinned by a detailed policy and procedures manual which sets out the Umpires' terms and conditions of employment.

On the financial side of things the new agreement has resulted in:

- A 10% increase in home and away match payments over the 3 years.
- A significant increase in Grand Final match payments.
- An additional pool of funds each year to be used for the benefit of all umpires, which in 2004 was used to purchase training gear.
- The WAFC paying for the on-going running costs of Ernest Johnson, including insurance, alarm monitoring and milestone awards for games and years of service. The savings to the Association in a full year will be between \$3,000 and \$4,000.
- The WAFC will supply and pay for the awards for Umpires of the Year, Most Improved Umpires as well as new awards for the Best Pre-season Umpires for Boundary and Goal Umpires.
- The WAFC will also fully fund the preseason camp.

At the end of the season a further agreement was reached in which the WAFC will cover the cost of the Grand Final Certificates in return for the Association contributing \$1,000 towards the cost of the camp to fund the attendance of Life Members.

Although this will not save the Association any money it will greatly benefit the umpiring group by having more Life Members attend.



The involvement of our Life Members in the pre-season camp has been an integral part of the culture of the Association and it is crucial for this to continue.

Overall the new agreement has resulted in significant benefits for the Association and its members. It is a testament to the much improved relationship between the Association, the WAFL and the WAFC, which was extremely strained only two years ago.

The improvement in the relationship was further highlighted at the Grand Final Dinner Dance where Clint Roberts, the Operations Manager of the WAFL, presented the League Grand Final Umpires and Trainers with a Grand Final Medal. This will be extended next year to the Reserves and Colts Umpires and Trainers.

The new agreement also meant that the Association could provide every umpire with a new Association Polo Shirt for no increase in annual membership subscriptions. A big thanks to Cat for arranging the design and supply of the Polo Shirts.






Boundary Umpires Coach Report

Cat Sharland and Brett Rodgers made their debut WAFL grand final appearances and are among a number of promising young goal umpires on the panel for the future.

History was created in 2004 when Cat Sharland became the first woman to goal umpire a senior WAFL game when she officiated at Arena Joondalup (West Perth v Peel Thunder) on 17 July 2004. We expect women goal umpires to become commonplace in years to come with Cat and several other women on our panel showing a lot of promise.

During the year Andrew umpired in 9 in season games followed by 4 finals in a row.


Andrew over the last few years has been knocking on the door to achieve this honour; I'd like to congratulate him from myself on an outstanding year. Well done Andrew.

The 2004 season again saw success for our AFL umpires, with Andrew Curtis umpiring in the 2004 AFL Grand Final.



2004 Devine Medalist: Boundary Umpire of the Year Nathan Doig





2004 Carter Medalist: Goal Umpire of the Year Michael Spear

2004 was another successful year for Michael Spear, who umpired his second consecutive State Game and League Grand Final, and was named Goal Umpire of the year for the second time. This year also marked the arrival of the 'big fella in Perth' on the AFL scene, where he umpired six games, including one where he collided fairly heavily with a player, a scene that graced television highlights packages across the nation in slow motion for much of that weekend. Making his AFL debut shortly after the infamous 'Goal Umpire from Hell' incident in Queensland, Michael decided immediately that he wasn't having a first AFL game, but rather two second games and umpired accordingly, aguitting himself well in his debut and every game thereafter. Assuming the full AFL load in 2005, Michael Spear is certainly a man to watch over the coming years.

2004 Vernon Medalist: Most Improved Field Umpire Justin Orr

Recruited from the Field Umpiring Academy mid-season during 2002, Justin Orr came of age during the 2004 season. Having a physical appearance more akin to what is expected of a football player rather than an umpire, Justin's on-field consistency and fittness were rewarded when he made his league debut midway through the season. He umpired three league games during 2004 and finished the year as the emergency field umpire in the Colts Grand Final.

In what was perhaps the defining moment of his season, Justin found himself in the midst of one of the most difficult on-field incidents of 2004, when he was forced to send a player from the ground for threatening an umpire. To his credit he handled the situation with aplomb, keeping control for the rest of the game and at the tribunal where the player received one of the longest suspensions handed down by the WAFL tribunal. In the midst of a dynamic group of umpires, Justin's on field presence and off field leadership have him in good stead to push for a regular league berth in 2005.





2004 Frusher Medalist: Most Improved Boundary Umpire Leigh Cook

One of the younger members of the boundary umpiring group at 16, Leigh Cook broke through to umpire reserves football in this his first year of umpiring in the WAFL. Another typically gifted athlete and a hard worker on the training track, Leigh established himself as a future league umpire with a wealth of outstanding on field performances in 2004.

The departure of a number of senior boundary umpires prior to the 2005 season presents Leigh with the opportunity to exert some pressure on those remaining and push for a league berth. Given his age and outstanding ability, there is no doubt this will not be the last we hear of Leigh Cook.

2004 Smith Medalist: Most Improved Goal Umpire Catherine Sharland

The first woman to umpire league football in WA, Catherine Sharland's league football career began in extraordinary fashion, with Peel Thunder defeating reigning premiers West Perth at Arena Joondalup. The following week, Catherine was standing the goal line as Peel held on to beat eventual Preliminary Finalists Swan Districts at Steel Blue oval (Bassendean), and her third league game saw wooden spooners East Fremantle edge out West Perth. When asked to remain at Rushton Park for the league game for an ill Mike Spear some weeks later, Peel won again. At this point, Goal Umpires coach John Hauswirth banned her from Peel Thunder matches for upsetting the law of averages.

Joining WAFL ranks amid much hype in 2001 from Sunday League as a 16 year old, Catherine quickly became known as the enfant terrible of goal umpiring, and spent three years tormenting coaching staff, fighting injury and on-field brain fades. A shoulder reconstruction following an on-field collision at the end of 2003 and numeroous off-field incidents forced Catherine to reassess her place within the group. In 2004 she emerged as not only an on field force, but also an off field leader. Catherine finished the 2004 season with four consecutive league games and officiated in the Colts Grand final, which was conincedentally won by Peel Thunder. She is also the smallest person to goal umpire league football since games record holder Paul Smith.

A committed student of the history of the WANFLUA, perhaps Andrew's most significant contribution to the association has been his willingness to locate the some of the forgotten legends of umpiring and ensure that they are recognised and remembered through the WANFLUA Hall of Fame. The most significant example of this is evident in his successful efforts in finding goal umpiring legend Merv Rose and the family of Grand Finals record holder, the late Bill Carter. Without Andrew's efforts, these two greats may have remained lost forever. Similarly, Andrew's work in uncovering statistics, information and photographs for the 50th Anniversary yearbook was invaluable to yearbook editor Catherine Sharland. Andrew was also the WA AFL state representative from 2000-2002, a role that in 2003 was allocated to the association president. One of few gentlemen in the current goal umpiring ranks. A man who fell into umpiring by accident. David Shawcross has become one of the WAN-FLUA's greatest servants of the modern era. Despite playing an enormous role in the 50th Anniversary celebrations and formulating the Team of the Half Century concept, David's most significant contribution as President has been his dedication to umpire welfare. His first act as President in 2001 was to rescue a near doomed and over budget fees and conditions agreement, by bringing it in under budget and still ensuring all umpires received a pay rise. During a turbulant 2002 season, David put both his job and life on hold to respond to both internal and external criticism of the umpiring group, and having weathered the storm, set about improving relations with the WAFC, WAFL, the football clubs and the media in 2003. In 2004, David set a new benchmark in the associations' relationship with the WAFC, by engineering a legally binding Employee agreement that ensures all umpires have the same rights as other contracted employees of the WAFC. The defining characteristic of David's presidency has always been his committment to the welfare of all umpires, and he continues to provide them with strong representation. A fifth term as President in 2005 will see David become the associations third longest serving president behind Eddie Crisp and Ross Capes who both served six years in the top job.


