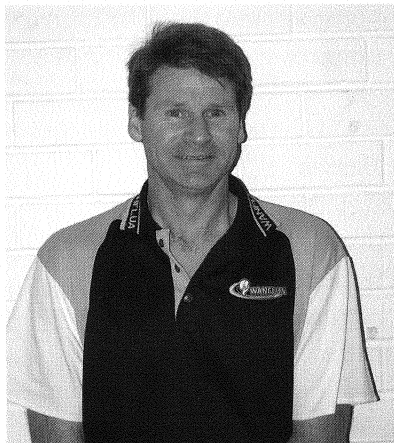

President's Report



This will be the last time that you hear from me as President of the Association. After 5 years as President I believe that the time is right for me to step aside and let some of the younger group take up the challenge and inject some new energy and direction into the Association. I will not be leaving the committee altogether as I will remain on as the Vice President to assist the incoming President in what will be a pretty important year.

2006 will be the final year of our current agreement with the WAFC and a new agreement will need to be negotiated.

My 5 years as President have been some of the most rewarding years of my umpiring career and I would encourage all umpires to consider nominating for the committee at some stage.

When I took on the role as President there were 3 key things that I wanted to achieve.

1. Celebrate our 50th anniversary in style.
2. Improve on the existing fees and conditions agreement to ensure that all umpires are recognised as employees of the WAFC.
3. Review the criteria for Life Membership.

At the AGM in February 2005 the Constitution was amended to change the criteria for Life Membership. This was the culmination of a very thorough process involving a number of members across all umpiring disciplines and existing Life Members.

In summary the changes mean that Life Membership will, subject to the umpire's conduct, be granted automatically to umpires who have:

- Umpired in 200 senior league games; or
- Completed 15 years of service as an active member.

Members can still be nominated for Life Membership once they have completed 10 years of service as an active member and they have contributed in some way to the Association for at least 5 years. These nominations are considered by a committee of 5 retired life members. If endorsed they are then forwarded to the membership to be voted on at the AGM, with only a simple majority being required for the nomination to be successful.

As a result of the changes a total of 21 new Life Members were admitted to the Association. These comprised a mix of umpires who had completed 15 years of service and umpires who had umpired in 200 senior league games.

I have to admit that it was a very enjoyable job contacting each of the umpires concerned to inform them that they had been admitted as Life Members of the Association. Some of them were literally speechless when I told them.

It provides a certain level of comfort that we may have got the Life Membership criteria pretty close to being right when you consider that all of the new Life Members are all worthy recipients of this honour.

The new criteria will hopefully also provide an incentive for umpires to continue their career to achieve Life Membership. It is arguable that a number of former umpires may not have retired when they did if this criterion was in place.

As is the case almost every year the start of the 2005 season brought with it some changes to the coaching staff. Peter Repper took over as the Field Umpires Coach and Colin Shawcross took on the role as the Goal Umpires Coach with John Hauswirth focusing solely on the AFL Goal Umpires Coaching role. The experience gained by Repp and Col as assistant coaches in 2004 prepared them well to take on the top job in 2005.

After Rob Duffield accepted a position at Bathurst University 2005 saw a new fitness coach appointed in former boundary umpire Rob Suriano. Rob is currently studying his PhD in Sports Science at UWA and he is also a triathlon coach.

There was also a change in our training staff with Daryl Chat being appointed in the role as the Head Trainer. Daryl was previously a trainer at the Perth Football Club and has been a terrific addition to the team. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank Daryl and all of his trainers for their contribution during the year.

As with last year the trainers were officially recognised for their invaluable contribution at Harry's Night, which as always was a wonderful night. Thanks to Jo Smith and Mae Jardine for their Culinary delights.

The 2005 Hal Symons (Pre-season) Fitness Camp was shifted to a new location at Moore River. The format of the camp was similar to previous years being based around a team building concept. The venue was a winner with all who attended and the 2006 camp will also be held there. A highlight of the camp was the number of Life Members that attended. As a result additional accommodation is being found so that more Life Members can attend.

The 2005 season brought with it a number of retirements, some expected and others not. There were also a number of other changes in personnel that should not pass without mention.

On the retirement list are Cos Martino, George Pampacos and Craig Hartnett. Greg Smith also retired from AFL ranks but intends to return to WAFL ranks to take on Peter Frusher's games record.

Wayne Hendrie also announced that he would be transferring to Karratha for 3 years in order to further his career in the Police Service.

All of these umpires will be greatly missed and they have all achieved outstanding success in their careers. I am sure that we will not have seen the last of them.

After 4 years as Bar Manager Cat Sharland has decided to hand in the keys so that she can focus on her studies. 2005 was another outstanding year for the bar with profits again being over \$3,000 for the year. It is great to see that more umpires are staying back and socialising after training. I would personally like to thank Cat for her contribution over the last 4 years, taking on a job that no-one else wanted to do. If it wasn't for Cat the Liquor Licence would likely have been handed in and the bar would have been no more.

In another change which was not expected Mike Ball decided to take up a new position with his former employer and resigned from the WAFC at the beginning of December. I would like to thank "Bally" for his contributions in the role of General Manager of Umpire Development.

The end of 2005 also brought with it the termination of two sponsorship arrangements that have been valuable support for umpiring and the Association for a number of years.

Both Rick Hart and Taylor Woodings advised that they would not be continuing their sponsorships in 2006.

We respect the reasons for their decisions not to continue and would like to thank them for the years of support that they have given to umpiring in WA.

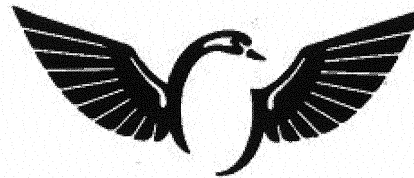

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank my fellow committee members over the past 5 years for their contribution and support.

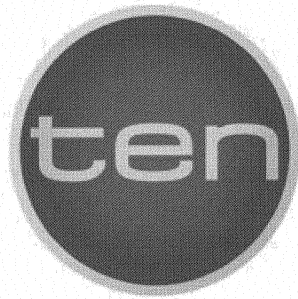

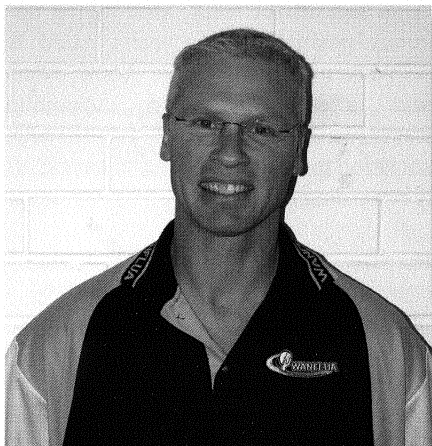

This year hasn't run entirely according to plan, but as with most things the more you do it the better you get at it. I would like to thank those umpires, both past and present, that have given the Committee constructive feedback throughout the year in order to make this Association what it is, and I look forward to an even better 2006.

Treasurer's Report



During the year ended 31 October 2005, the Association recorded a net operating profit of \$3,035 (2004: \$1,715) an increase of 77% compared with the previous year.

Revenue from ordinary activities increased by approximately 4%. This was due to an improvement in attendees to Association held functions which resulted in revenues of \$23,100 (2004: \$18,976)

exceeding the previous year by \$4,124. Also contributing to the increased revenues were the raffles and interest received on term deposits.

Currently, the Association has a \$22,000 (2004: nil) term deposit on a four month term. Membership revenue was consistent with the previous year with a 100% collection resulting in \$14,195 (2004: \$14,310). The implementation of a payroll deduction process enabled the collection and ensured no fees were outstanding at the end of the year.

Expenses from ordinary activities decreased by \$124 to \$15,178 (2004: \$15,302). The decrease in expenses can be attributed to the Association being able to successfully negotiate some trophy expenses being paid by the WAFC and collecting all membership fees during the year thus reducing the bad and doubtful debt expense.

The Association's results could have been significantly better, however, the committee has decided to accrue for half of next years costs in providing new polo shirts at \$2,000, be prudent in writing off the cost of merchandise items including old ties and life members' badges, and reduce the value of the new ties, resulting in a cost of \$1,942. The asset register was reviewed and assets were written off that had been lost or donated to a value of \$1,180. Additional depreciation of \$924 that should have been charged in 2004 was accounted for, and correction made to the 2004 membership fee income that had been double counted.

With all of the above taken into consideration, the Association should have an adjusted net operating profit of \$9,231.

The Association's Statement of Financial Position is in good shape with an increase in the net asset position of \$3,035 to \$42,395 (2004: \$39,360). The cash position also increased by \$10,409 to \$33,560 (2004: \$23,151). We need to be mindful that in 2006, new polo shirts will cost approximately \$4,000 and this occurs every two years.

Overall, the committee has adopted and enforced tight financial procedures to ensure the Association's financial position is maintained and improved upon.

The following financial report has been audited and a copy of the Auditor's Report accompanies the financial report.

I look forward to your continued support in 2006.

1 Summary of significant accounting policies

Basis of accounting



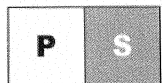

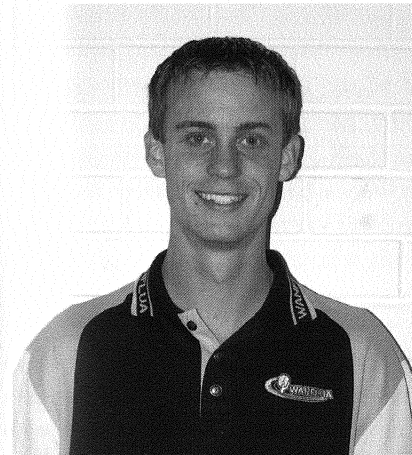

Further thanks to all the committee members that helped on the night and also helped with selling tickets.

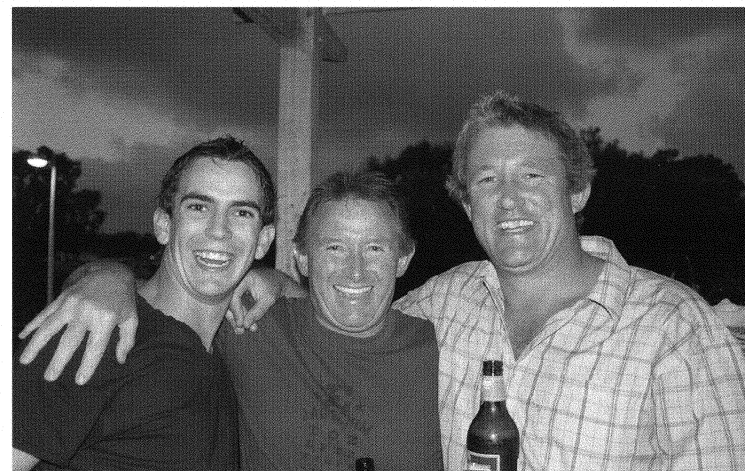

The WAFL needs to be the main instigator in this process in order to successfully reach these desired outcomes.

Field Umpires' Coach Report



When appointed Field Umpires Coach for the 2005 season, I decided to change the past philosophies of umpiring coaching.

Gone would be the philosophy that sitting in a lecture theatre every week watching videos and listening to non-specific information until everyone was blue in the face was the best and only way to go in regard to coaching and feedback. Gone would be the minimal feedback on match

day. Gone would be the term observer and out would be these observers walking into change rooms and standing in the corner, saying nothing, like naughty boys. While still using DVD, whiteboard and video at pertinent times, the emphasis was on match day. Match Day Coaches are now appointed to games to do exactly that - coach. They now provide a pre game address, coach the umpires during all breaks and initiate thorough feedback post game and during the week. This has helped the group in their ability to improve, because that is an important trait as a coach - to strive for improvement.

So, equipped with a terrific team of Match Day Coaches (MDC's), and a new outlook on coaching, we got stuck into season 2005.

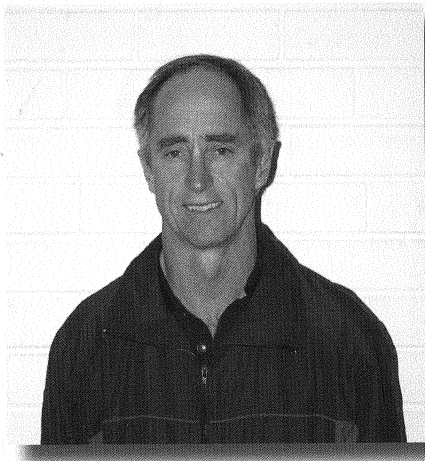
To all the other coaches and our wonderful support staff, a big thankyou for your advice and contribution to Field Umpiring in 2005.

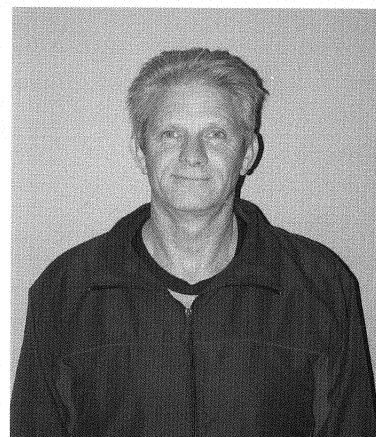
AFL

Fitness Coach's Report



Overall the season seemed to progress with few injuries or fitness problems reported on game days. Thank you to Daryl Chatt and his trainers for attending to, and monitoring, any injuries and their constant feedback to me. I hope that it was a combination of a successful fitness program and injury prevention and management plan which resulted in this outcome.

Having come from a background in boundary umpiring (a number of the current umpires remembered me from my time (2000-2002) as a member of the WAFL umpiring panel), it was an interesting year to be on the "other side" of the fence. I believe that my past umpiring experience served as a useful background to the skills and fitness levels required by all umpires. Furthermore, as I had observed how the program had been previously run and having personally known the previous two fitness coaches I'm hoping that the transition was smooth. I attempted to utilise elements from the previous programs and blend in some new ideas and training sessions for the group.

Professionally, it is sometimes a difficult task to coordinate the fitness training for such a large group while ensuring that all umpires trained at their optimal level. To control this, the sessions often involved different training regimes for the field, boundary and goal umpires. This was based on the recognised needs of all three groups which were differentiated with respect to endurance, speed and agility requirements.

Personally, I thoroughly enjoyed the experience and look forward to another year if my contract is renewed. Next seasons program see the further development of the program, adding elements that I believe are critical to successful on-field performance. Thank you to all involved; Darryl Sinclair, Mike Ball, the coaching staff, Daryl Chatt, the trainers as well as all the umpires for making it an enjoyable and successful year.

Possible Improvements for 2006:

Strength training:

This was a suggestion by my predecessor and one that I would like to follow through during season 2006.

Developmental Fitness Squads:

As previously stated, it is near impossible to monitor all components of fitness for every individual umpire. It would be possible to identify a small number of umpires from each group and target them for individual fitness evaluation and improvement above and beyond the general program and fitness testing sessions. This will be further discussed with the individual coaches.

Game day warm up:

A standard warm up procedures for game days that are effective and realistic given game day circumstances and requirements should be implemented.

Game day monitoring:

Modern sports science allows for the monitoring of umpires in a game situation (e.g.; heart rate, distance covered, perceived rate of exertion). The benefit of such testing would be to replicate training practices to more realistically simulate actual workloads experienced during games.

Other:

Continued variations in sessions including strength (e.g. plyometrics) agility and decision making exercises under fatigued conditions to further improve match-day performance.

The group has been provided with a pre-season fitness program to lead them into the 2006 season with the first training session to commence on Tuesday December 20 and then from January 2, 2006 onwards.

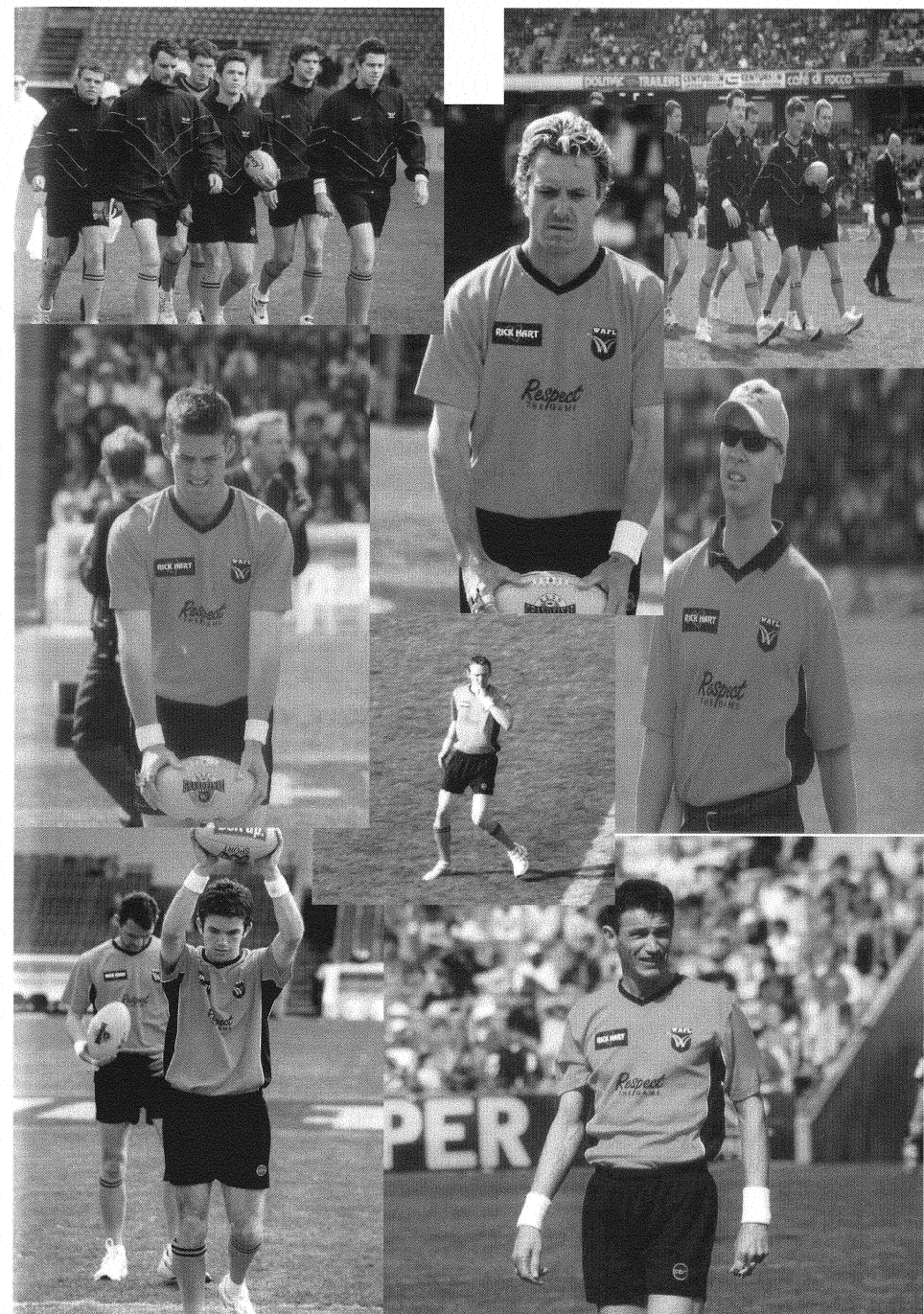

AFL Report

It is always difficult to back up a successful year. However, even though we didn't get an umpire through to the Grand Final we again proved that we have quality umpires in WA with 2 goal umpires and 1 boundary umpire officiating in the finals series.

2005 also saw the curtain fall on the AFL careers of 3 great umpires in Cos Martino, George Pampacos and Greg Smith (although Greg intends to umpire in the WAFL in 2006). Wayne Hendrie also put his AFL career on hold with a transfer to Karratha for a 3 year period. The contribution made by all of these umpires to football at WAFL and AFL level will long be remembered.

The 2005 year started off on a positive note for David Shawcross who was selected to umpire in the Wizard Cup Grand Final between Carlton and West Coast at the Telstra Dome. Although only a pre-season game it was still a Grand Final and was a wonderful experience.

With the finals panel for goal umpires now firmly set at 8 it was always going to be tough to get selected. Consistency is always the key. After both having very good seasons Andrew Curtis and David Shawcross were selected on the finals panel. This was significant in that all the other finals goal umpires came from Victoria. WA has consistently produced 2 finals umpires every year, which underscores the quality of our goal umpiring ranks in WA.

Both Andrew and David started off their finals campaign at AAMI Stadium, even though there was West Coast game at Subiaco Oval. Although he umpired well one minor glitch did not see David progress any further in the finals series. Again the new finals structured allowed Andrew to go through to the second week of finals again umpiring at AAMI Stadium.

As with 2004 Andrew umpired better in his second match and was looking good to back up his Grand Final Success. Unfortunately Andrew's season came to an end in the Preliminary Final after some player contact. It is a very fine line in finals and the smallest of things can have the biggest consequences. Andrew had another stellar season and was unlucky not to go back to back falling just one game short.

As for our other goalies Wayne Hendrie again had a consistent season but again narrowly missed out on finals selection. Cos Martino in what was to be his last season was not up to his brilliant best but still finished the season strongly. It could be said that after a terrific debut year in 2004 that Mike Spear suffered from second year blues. I know that Mike was very disappointed in his year and intends make up for it in 2006.

With both Cos and Wayne moving on a lot rests on the shoulders of Andrew, David and Mike in 2006. It has also opened up the opportunity for 2 new umpires at AFL level. Initially only 1 new umpire was going to be appointed, but after of a change of heart 2 new goal umpires were appointed for 2006 in Dale Edwick and Adam Peacock. Congratulations to both these guys on their appointments.



Our goal umpires weren't the only ones to have success in 2004. Boundary umpire Jamie Giles was again rewarded for an outstanding season with finals selection. Jamie joined Andrew and David in the final at AAMI Stadium.

After what appeared to be an excellent performance Jamie's finals campaign was short lived. Although the coach said that he ran well enough to make it through one of his investigations came up on the negative. Again it is the little things that make all the difference in finals. It is very difficult after a long hard year to not make it past week 1 in finals and I know that Jamie was shattered by the result. Jamie certainly has the ability, passion and desire to make it and I know he will give it a good crack in 2006.

After the retirements of Greg and George, and with Nathan Doig in his second year and Alan Zanich in his third a lot will fall on the shoulders of Jamie in 2006.

As for Nathan and Alan they both had very consistent seasons and will be more than capable of filling the shoes of Greg and George.

Although there were 2 vacancies in the boundary umpire ranks a decision was made to only fill 1 of them, with Haden Martin being added to the panel. Haden has had a meteoric rise through the ranks which is testament to his ability.

Dean Margetts in his fourth year and Craig Hendrie in his third year also had consistent seasons. Without taking anything away from the achievements of our goal and boundary umpires it would be fair to say that it is more difficult to achieve finals selection as a field umpire. I am sure that with their dedication and commitment the rewards of finals will come.

After being selected to trial for 2005 David Corcoran decided to go to England and play professional cricket. An interesting end to what was a controversial umpiring career. Unfortunately Mark Fussell and Luke Farmer were not successful in the trials, although Luke was rewarded with a rookie contract for the 2005 season. This gave Luke the opportunity to sit on the bench for a number of AFL games and would no doubt provide an incentive for 2006.

2006 will see both Luke Farmer and Greg Bandy trial for a position on the AFL Panel. It is a very tough road for a field umpire to make it through to AFL ranks and these 2 blokes have our full support.

As for 2006 our pre-season training has been underway for some time and on 15 December 2005 we had our first time trial, with all umpires making the bench mark. It was a terrific effort by everyone and showed WA umpiring in a very positive way to Rowan Sayers who flew over to officially time the run.

It was also great to see some many of the other blokes come down for support. We all really appreciate your support.

To finish off the 2005 year Andrew Curtis and David Shawcross were selected to umpire in the International Rules game between Australia and Ireland at Subiaco Oval. This was a fantastic achievement for these guys and a real honour.



The end of the season also saw Andrew Curtis and Jamie Giles appointed to umpire in the exhibition match in Los Angeles in January 2006. Well done guys on this appointment.

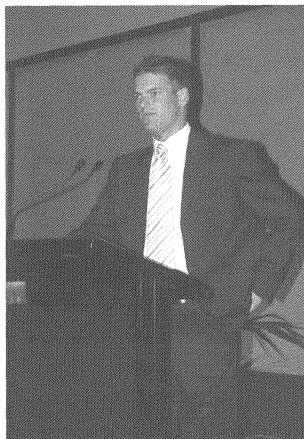

When sitting down as the Field umpires selection panel to choose our Vernon Medallist, there was no doubt in anyone's mind Chris Pattinson was the clear winner.

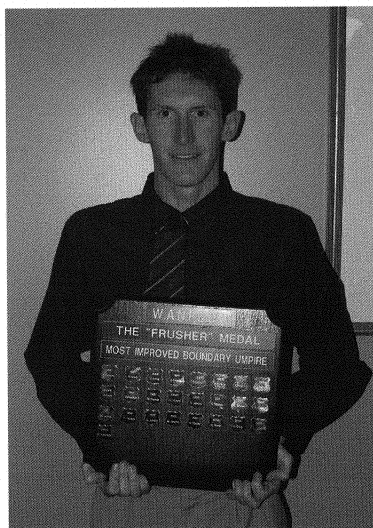

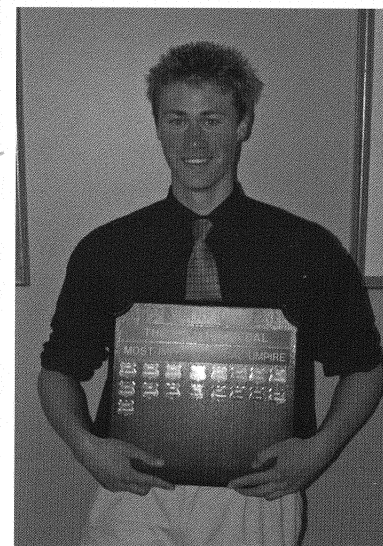

The changes in the Constitution were passed at a Special General Meeting after a review Committee led by Life Member John Devine, reformed the previous selection criteria to recognise 15 Years Long Service and the 200 Game Milestone.

In keeping with these changes to the Life Membership eligibliity criteria an additional 21 umpires have recieved Life Membership.

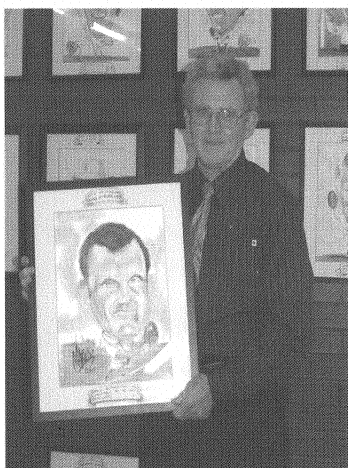

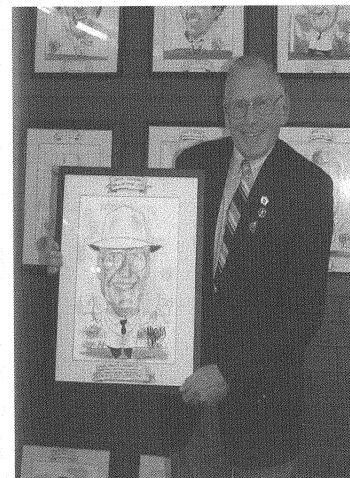

Gareth's Gaelic Gabble

The Irish experience is not one I will forget quickly. With thirty of the best under 17 footballers in Australia and a some of the sharpest football minds outside the AFL system, my trip to Ireland and Northern Ireland with the AFL AIS Academy in March and April 2005 was without a doubt the highlight of my time in football. And short of a WAFL grand final or AFL football, I cannot see anything topping it.

A warm-up match and the first of three tests were played in Northern Ireland, the first time any senior or junior international rules match had been played in that part of the Emerald Isle north of the partition. Based in Belfast, the experience was as much a cultural and historical one as footballing, with visits to the Falls Road and other infamous battlegrounds of The Troubles. We even ran into Gerry Adams on the street outside the office of Sinn Fein – a hero or a terrorist depending on your point of view.

On the field, the Australian boys accounted for a cobbled-together representative side with ease in the warm-up match at Belfast's Casement Park. Perhaps this made them overconfident, as they were smashed 73-32 when the real stuff started in County Armagh. The Australians blazed away in comparison to their Irish opposition's skill with the round ball. The most remarkable feature of the game was that it was held immediately adjacent to a British army barracks, with gun turrets overlooking the ground and army choppers taking off and landing.

With much to prove, it was off to Dublin, the Republic's capital for the second test. The match was played at Parnell Park, the home ground of former "Dub" Jim Stynes. The Australians had learned from their mistakes, and with a game plan overhauled by coach Alan McConnell, they carried the ball in a possession game, getting up to beat their hosts 56-44.



In contrast to the cosmopolitan bustle of Dublin, the final test was played in the country town of Killarney at Fitzgerald Stadium, home of Kerry, the



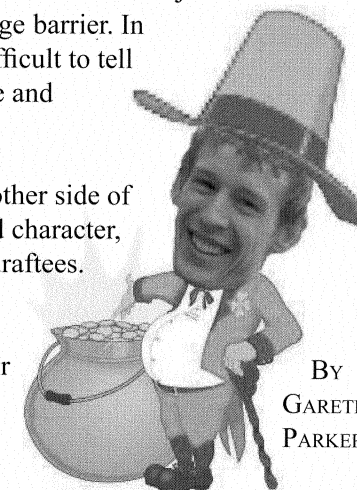
FITZGERALD STADIUM:

county of Tadhg Kennelly. In a spectacular setting with a centuries-old abbey overlooking the pitch, the match was the best of the three – hard-fought and tight throughout. The lead changed several times, including in the final quarter, but a six-point goal by the Irish with just two minutes remaining gave them an unassailable break. The game finished at 39-31 in Ireland's favour and they retained the Peter McDermott Cup.

In an officiating sense, the series was quite foreign and the most challenging aspect, aside from quickly grasping a completely new set of laws, was dealing with an entirely different footballing culture. Seemingly small things, like tagging a player with light physical contact, would set the Irish players off, while they were quite accustomed to screaming directly at you and physically manhandling you. No disrespect or aggression was intended – just a different culture. The other significant issue was the language barrier. In theory both nations speak English. It was often difficult to tell on the field, or indeed in the referees rooms before and after the matches!

It was a privilege to represent my country on the other side of the world in a squad filled with so much talent and character, with many of my touring companions 2005 AFL draftees.

I have to thank Kevin Sheehan, the AFL's game development manager and Irish cultural attaché for organising such a brilliant trip, and also to Adrian Panozzo, for giving me the opportunity after the 2004 National Under 18s Championships.

Sinclair continued to dominate and the second set was again one sided with Sinclair winning 21/13. Sinclair the defending champion outclassed an inept Parry. Sinclair was unstoppable and Parry could not come to terms with the pressure of grand final pong.

The third set commenced in controversial circumstances with Parry denying Sinclair a drinks break and Parry choosing to receive coaching from a non-playing member. This strategy infuriated Sinclair and the tactic appeared to take affect on Sinclair who trailed 4/1 then 7/3. The third set continued to be marred by verbals of abuse between both players and Umpire Hayes had difficulty controlling the players. Sinclair after a warning from Umpire Hayes knuckled down and returned to his early form and pegged back Parry to lead 14/11. Parry looked a frustrated beaten man who had offered so much, but delivered so little. Sinclair sensed premiership glory and with some superb passing shots and deft backhand strokes raced to a 21/13 victory.

For Sinclair victory was sweet against at times an undisciplined Parry who did not cope with the intensity that comes when playing in a grand final. His tactics and outbursts backfired and to loose in straight sets 21/9, 21/13, 21/13 was disappointing.

Sinclair and Parry both face difficult decisions as both players have been invited to join the metropolitan Table Tennis Circuit. Either love him or hate him you can't deny Sincas the little master of three consecutive premierships.

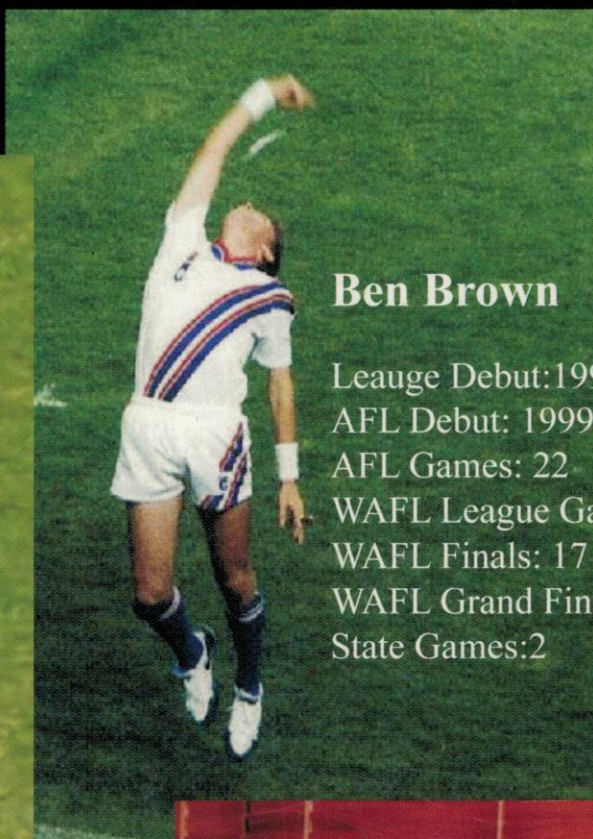

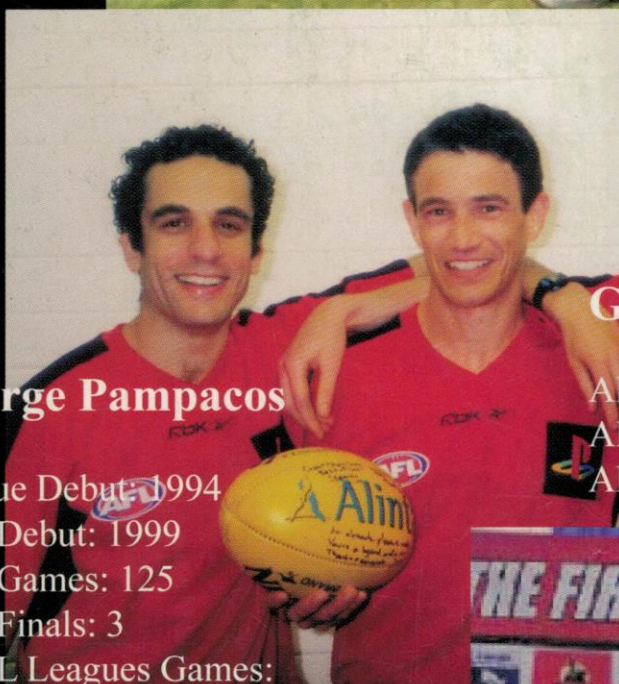

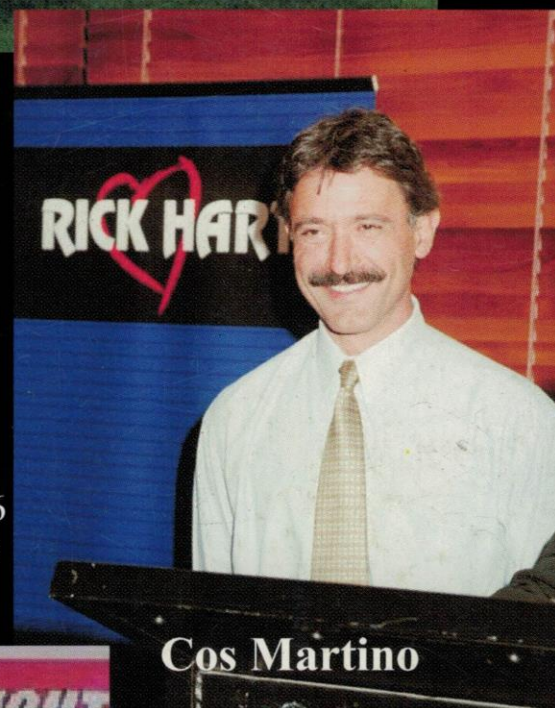
