



It is with great pleasure that I report to you for the first time as President of the WANFLUA.

In taking over from David Shawcross I felt I had big shoes to fill and as a result was not afraid to lean on him for advice and assistance throughout my inaugural 12 months. As David is now vacating the committee, I would like to take this opportunity to thank him for his help in getting me settled and his assistance as Vice President in 2006. His previous 5 years as President and 8 years on the executive committee is testament to his passion and dedication to the Association. On behalf of all members, thank you David.

2006 certainly presented its challenges for our group, however it also formed a platform from which I can see the association moving to a much stronger and more secure position. It was the final year of our agreement with the WAFL and we have all but concluded negotiations with the league for the next 3 years. While our match fees will continue to increase in accordance with the CPI each year, significant conditions have been agreed upon which will give running umpires much better security and working conditions into the future. These include:

- An official contract between the WAFL and the umpire signed by both parties and a separate agreement between the WAFL and the Association outlining fees, conditions, rights and responsibilities.
- Workcover insurance for all umpires following an official training program all year round.
- A \$3,000 subsidy from the WAFL for Association functions, enabling us to hold significant events such as Panel and Presentation nights at the home of football, Subjaco Oval.
- Training uniforms of match day quality to be supplied on day one of pre-season by the WAFL.
- Match day polo shirts to be supplied by the WAFL as of 2008 which should result in a reduction in subscription fees for running umpires next season.
- Significant improvements in fees and conditions for our trainers; including an increase in match day payments, the introduction of pre-season remuneration, function subsidies as well as uniforms and bags.
- 36 footballs to be to be supplied each year by the WAFL for training and skills sessions.
- A significant improvement in the processes clubs must adhere to when requesting umpires for pre-season intra-club matches, as well as the timing and length of those matches.

These conditions have been a work in progress for some time now, however much of the credit for them actually coming to fruition must go to Steve Hargrave, General Manager Umpiring WA. Steve took on the role in 2006 with no umpiring background at all, however he has proven to be a great fillip for WAFL Umpiring and the Association thanks him for his ongoing support.

We also continue to talk at length about the "home" of the WANFLUA, Ernest Johnson Oval. As junior football in the South Perth region continues to grow, our position at EJ has become compromised and possible alternative venues need to be considered. 2006 saw the WAFL umpiring panel train at Subiaco Oval for the first time in a number of years and we look forward to doing so again throughout the course of 2007. The WAFL have also employed a venue/facilities manager who is evaluating potential new venues for the elite umpiring group in this state to base themselves. A full report should be handed down sometime this year.

As for the rest of the 2006 season I think it can only be described as a success. On the field we had a solid season which culminated in a League Grand Final that saw 5 umpires make their debuts; Gareth Parker, Todd Keating, Chris DeBoer, David Kennedy and Adam Tilly. Congratulations go not only to these men, but to everyone who was selected to umpire on the biggest day on the WAFL calendar.

Off the field there were two significant retirements from the coaching ranks. Peter Repper and Peter Frusher relinquished their positions as head coaches of the field and boundary umpires respectively. These men will be missed, not only as coaches but as personalities. Although with the pair being Life Members, I'm sure we will see their involvement and support of the Association continue for many years.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank my fellow committee members for their support and hard work throughout the course of 2006. Most are staying on in 2007 and I look forward to reporting to you next year after another successful season on and off the field

TREASURER'S REPORT



In keeping with last year a lot of focus was directed towards trying to keep the Life Members of the Association informed of what was going on throughout the year. One the most important ways of doing this is through our web site, which is updated regularly through the year with relevant information such as functions and the weekly appointments. However, towards the end of the season the WAFC offered to take up the running of the WANFLUA web site and updates are currently being made to the site. The new WANFLUA site will be linked to the official WAFL web site and the new site address will be sent out soon.

The new website will also have an email address function, so that we can eventually correspond with all Life Members by email. The intention is to gather a data base so that information can be passed on quickly and accurately, avoiding the complications associated with members changing postal address throughout the year, thus making it easier to keep in touch.

The Association was saddened to hear about the sudden passing of one of our Life Members this year in Les Leicester. He was a very cheerful character and enjoyed his time with the current WAFL umpires as "Head Chef" of the Hal Symons Fitness Camp for many years. He will be missed by all past and present umpires. A plaque has been struck to honour Les for his services to the WANFLUA, with the kitchen at all future preseason camps to be named 'The Les Leicester Kitchen'. I'm sure the plaque will take pride of place.

This year has been very rewarding with the Association working hard to increase the prestige of our functions, with the Presentation Evenings now being held at Subiaco Oval. In particular we have worked to elevate the status of the Hall of Fame evening to one of the most important on the WANFLUA calendar.

Thank you to the Committee for all the hard work and progress made throughout the year. Thanks also to those who have continued to support the Association either by donating their time, money or interest. I hope the progress made this year can continue to improve for many to come, and will continue to improve our great Association.

During the year ended 31 October 2006. the Association recorded an operating surplus of \$1,084 (2005: \$3,035) a decrease of 64% compared with the previous year. However, the Association's result was excellent considering there were some major adjustments and one-off expenses within the accounts. The result included the accelerated depreciation of approximately \$6,000, purchase of 25 life member badges totalling \$1,880 and the write-off of merchandise stock totalling \$660. The adjusted operating surplus should have been approximately \$9,600.

Total revenue increased by approximately 1% or \$497 as compared to the previous year. Total members subscriptions remained consistent to the previous year with the payroll deduction process enabling collections.

Total expenses including depreciation increased by \$2,448 to \$48,823 (2005: \$46,375). The overall increase can be attributable to the following:

- Depreciation has increased by \$5,887 to \$7,280 (2005: \$1,393) due to the decision to accelerate the depreciation charge for the year. This has enabled the Association to only carry the caricatures expenditure in the Balance Sheet; and
- Trophy expenses reduced by \$3,460 as in 2005 the expenses were over accrued by approximately \$2,100 and adopted the agreement with WAFC paying for trophies:

The Association's Balance Sheet is in good shape with an increase in the cash position of \$9,263 to \$42,823 (2005: \$33,560).

Again, the committee has adopted and enforced tight financial procedures to ensure the Association's financial position is maintained and further improved upon.

The following financial report has been audited and a copy of the Auditor's Report accompanies the financial report.

I look forward to your continued support in 2007.

FITNESS COACH'S REPORT

Five new goal umpires joined our WAFL panel in 2006. Tom Barratt, Joseph O'Leary, Martyn Tompkins, Peter McAndrew and Brandon Simpson joined us after they each had an excellent season 2005 in community football. All 5 were excellent additions to our panel with Tom Barratt establishing himself at the Reserves football level in his first WAFL season.

My thanks to John Marrapodi, Robert Davis and Trevor Pescud, who formed our coaching panel in 2006. John, a recently retired AFL Goal Umpire, is our AFL coach and he also provides considerable input at WAFL level as a Match-day and training coach. Robert is tireless in his work as a Match-day and training coach and brings a wealth of experience and knowledge to our panel. Trevor is a former AFL and current community football Goal Umpire who makes a significant practical contribution to the skill development of our panel.

Hargrave, Daryl Sinclair, the coaching staff and all the umpires for making it an enjoyable and successful year.

This season consisted of 38 training weeks (76 sessions). The breakdown of these were as follows:

- 62 sessions (Tuesday and Thursday) were dedicated fitness training sessions
- There were 7 dedicated skills sessions
- One Drugs in Sport lecture
- One week (2 sessions) dedicated to a mid season break
- Two sessions were lost to public holidays
- Two sessions were dedicated as "group activities" where the umpires were encouraged to engage in another activity away from the track within their groups.

The group as a whole generally demonstrated a strong attitude to training. I was particularly impressed with the improvement in the dedication of the goal umpires to the fitness training sessions.

I attempted to further separate the three disciplines into different training groups to concentrate on their various fitness requirements. This was based on the recognised needs of all three groups respect to endurance, speed and agility requirements. For this to be successful, with a large group, each group is required to be autonomous in their attitude to training and this was often evident. Each group, generally with the assistance of a few leaders within each discipline, were able to follow through a set training program without continuos monitoring. This demonstrates a level of training maturity within the group and allows me time to communicate with various umpires regarding fitness issues rather than "running" the training session.

TRAINING SESSIONS

Although the use of EJ by multiple groups posed a difficult task, as access to the main part of the oval was restricted until 6pm, I appreciated the motivation of the group to complete the warm up in a professional manner as I often was required to complete the set up of the training track.

I have proposed that the umpiring department invests in some more training equipment (eg. agility training equipment) to further assist the training and allow for more variation within the program. I believe that the investment of the spin cycle for use by umpires with running injuries was a positive step.

The group will be provided with a pre-season fitness program to lead them into the 2007 season with the first training session to commence on Tuesday January 16, 2007.

Dave Shawcross was selected for AFL finals this year and was very unlucky not to follow in the footsteps of Cos Martino and Andrew Curtis and make it all the way to the AFL Grand Final. Dave was the only non-Victorian goal umpire in the finals panel this year which is a terrific achievement. Dave's final saw him walk out onto the MCG in front of a crowd of 86,000 people to officiate the game between Collingwood v Western Bulldogs.

Dave's disappointment of not being more involved in the 2006 Finals Series would have been short lived after he was selected to umpire in the exhibition game between Geelong and Port Adelaide at the Brits Oval in London. He was accompanied by our own Brett Rosebury.

Mike Spear had a solid year and would be extremely close not to have won a berth in September action. Mike will be back better than ever next year and determined to make his mark on AFL footy.

2006 also saw the end of a very successful umpiring career. Andrew Curtis retired from Goal Umpiring after deciding to take up a work opportunity in Brazil. Andrew's record speaks for itself.




## Richard Heptinstall

HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

Greg Scroop, Dan Gooch and Ray Parkhouse (dec.) are the latest umpires to be inducted into the WANFLUA's prestigious Hall of Fame. Established by the Association in 1995, the Hall of Fame acknowledges the outstanding on-field achievements of the "cream of the crop" of West Australian umpires.

Around 130 people were on hand to witness the induction of Scroop, Gooch and Parkhouse at a formal dinner held at the Earnest Johnson clubrooms. The night not only provided an opportunity for the current generation of WAFL umpires to acknowledge the accomplishments of their elite predecessors, but also to appreciate the football of a by-gone era, as guests were treated to some entertaining footage of past Grand Finals featuring each of the inductees.

Perhaps the most entertaining video highlights were those featuring goal umpire Ray Parkhouse officiating in the 1966 Grand Final between Perth and East Perth in which Barry Cable kicked six goals playing as rover. A World War II veteran, Parkhouse began umpiring in 1957 and went on to officiate in three Grand Finals and three state games.


Scroop's list of achievements include a total of 255 senior games, 130 of which came at AFL level, along with three consecutive WAFL Grand Finals between 1992 and 1994. He was also President of the Umpires Association for three years, and the WAFL Field Umpires coach from 2000-2002, a time in which he had a strong influence on the careers of many of the current running umpires.

Not to be outdone Gooch's honour roll consists of four Grand Finals in a 199 game career, two of which came at football's highest level, AFL. He still retains the honour of being the only West Australian boundary umpire to reach the pinnacle of umpiring in an AFL Grand Final.

Both Scroop and Gooch expressed their pride and satisfaction on the night at being inducted into such an elite group umpires. The 12th annual Hall of Fame night was an outstanding success, and could not have been made possible without the efforts of President Greg Bandy and his committee. Special mention must be made to Dave O'Neill who put together all the old footage for night, and to Social Secretary Kendell Ball for coordinating such a fantastic evening.







### Notes to the financial statements

for the year ended 31 October 2006

### 1 Statement of significant accounting policies

The significant policies which have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report are:

#### Basis of accounting

The financial report is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared for its members in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations, other authoritative announcements and the Association Handbook in a form appropriate for a sporting association.

It has been prepared on the basis of historical costs and except where stated, does not take into account changing money values or fair values of non-current assets.

The accounting policies have been consistently applied, and, except where there is a change in accounting policy, are consistent with those of the previous year.

### Statement of compliance

The financial report complies with Australian Accounting Standards, which include Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (AIFRS). Compliance with AIFRS ensures that the financial report, comprising the financial statements and notes thereto, complies with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS).

This is the first financial report prepared based on AIFRS and comparatives for the year ended 31 October 2005 have been restated accordingly. There was no impact on Members' funds and operating result of adopting AIFRS from previous Australian Generally Accepted Accounting Principles.

### Revenue recognition

Revenues are recognised at fair value of the consideration received.

Membership - Membership revenue is driven through subscription fees. All membership income is recognised in the financial year in which it has been received to accurately match membership revenue with events held.

Interest - Interest income is recognised as it accrues, taking into account the effective yield on the financial

#### (b) Receivables

Subscriptions shall be payable in the case of an Active Member immediately on notification of appointment as an Umpire and in all other cases no later than the 31st of May each year.

Collectability of debtors is reviewed on an ongoing basis. A provision for doubtful debts is raised where doubt as to the collection exists and debts which are known to be uncollectible are written off.

### (c) Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment is stated at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Acquisition - All acquisitions of assets (except caricatures but including the updating on all honour boards, photos and framing of posters) are recorded at the cost of acquisition, being the purchase consideration determined as at the date of acquisition, plus costs incidental to acquisition.

Caricatures - They are anticipated to have indeterminate useful life. Their service potential has not, in any material sense, been consumed during the reporting period and as such, no amount for depreciation is recognised.

Depreciation - Is calculated on a diminishing value basis using the following rates:

Honour boards, photos and posters
Plant and equipment

(d) Cash assets

Cash assets are carried at face value of the amounts deposited.

### (e) Inventories

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Net realisable value is determined on the basis of each inventory line's estimated selling price.

### (f) Payables

Trade creditors represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the Association prior to the end of the financial year and which are unpaid. The amounts are unsecure and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.
