

The development of the web site has been long and sometimes difficult process to ge all the information of what the Association is doing, but as with all new things v are working through the kinks. At thi stage I would like to thank Scott McPhe

who along with Steve Hargrave initiated the incorporation of the umpires website with the WAFC's website (wafootball.com) where the umpires can now be found along with the rest of the football family. Scott took up the challenge of helping to maintain the site writing articles, and adding umpire profiles and photographs along with the history of ol association to the site.

For the last few years now there has been a big push by the committee to make our function more elite and the work that Kendell Ball has done in this area has been outstanding. O functions are opportunities that we as an association can present to people outside umpiring that we are the tenth team in the WAFL. I would also like to thank the support fro Steve Hargrave and the WAFC Umpiring Department. Without this support our function could not be held in the home of football, Subiaco Oval.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Greg Bandy for the last two years as Preside of the Association. His ability to negotiate our current agreement with the WAFC has put the Association in good stead for the next three years. Greg's work behind the scenes in h Presidency, particularly this year, has been very professional and he is to be commended for his leadership in this area.

The members of the committee also need to be thanked for another good year. Having solid committee working well together helps our Association move forward to bigger ar better things.

During the year ended 31 October 2007, the Association recorded an operating surplus of \$3,607 (2006: \$1,084) an increase of 233% compared with the previous year.

Total revenue for the year increased by approximately 8% (2006: 1%) or \$ 4.017 (2006: \$497) to \$53,924 (2006: \$49,907) due to increased participation in Association held events. Member subscriptions were paid in full with the payroll deduction process enabling collections.

Total expenses for the year increased by \$8,774 to \$50,317 (2006: \$41,543) in line with



the additional participation of members at Association held functions. The Grand Final Dinner Dance cost overruns totalled \$2,975 (2006: Loss \$28) as the band, audio visual equipment and GST on food and beverages were not allowed for in the ticket prices to members. The Association also purchased a digital camera and external hard drive during the year.

Bar trading revenue significantly decreased by \$4,125 to \$4,964 (2006: \$9,089). down 45%, as the WAFC requested the bar only be open one night instead of two nights, as in previous years. This directly impacted patronage in the bar.

The Association's Balance Sheet remains in good shape with a cash position of \$39,258 (2006: \$42,823).

Again, the committee has adopted and enforced tight financial procedures to ensure the Association's financial position is maintained and further improved upon.

The following financial report has been audited and a copy of the Auditor's Report accompanies the financial report.

The season commenced with a later alart (Jan 16, 2007) compared to past seasons. Although the WA-based AFL timpires were well into regular training and time trials prior to Christmas, the delayed start to training for the WAFL group was hopefully a welcomed addition.

The group completed their first 4km time frial at Perry Lakes on Thursday, January 10. While many umpires performed well, showing the results of some dedicated training during the off season; some umpires received a wake-up call on required fitness levels. With a follow up time trial to be completed in 8 weeks, many umpires had some work to do to meet required fitness targets.



Pre season training included more sessions away from EJ Reserve (City Beach, Kings Park) with one of the tougher sessions being the repeats up the side tracks of Reabold Hill. Bessions at EJ continued to focus on aerobic intervals to improve cardiovascular fitness for all three disciplines.

The Hal Symons Fitness Camp held over the weekend of February 9-11 was held at Woodman Point. After a thorough reconnaissance mission by yours truly, the major (now infamous) training session for the weekend was held around a 600m roadway track. With weather warming up by mid morning the group completed the demanding session with vigorous energy and determination. I'm sure the life members enjoy watching the current umpires push themselves to their limits. Thanks to Luke Farmer and his cronies for taking the group for a "beach wrestling" session on Sunday morning.

The second time trial on March 13, 10 days before the commencement of the season, demonstrated the hard work of many of the umpires over the preceding weeks. The group were now ready for the season that awaited them.

We then settled in for the regular season. The major goal from here on in was to maintain peak fitness, avoid injury and be physically prepared for the weekend matches. While the three basic elements of aerobic conditioning, speed and agility were included for all umpires, the training for each disciplines varied according to their individual requirements to successfully complete their position.

It was pleasing to observe a number of leaders to stand up in each group to maintain the focus of a set training program without continuous monitoring. The professional attitude of the individual groups was appreciated as this approach allows me to time to communicate with various umpires and coaches regarding fitness issues rather than "controlling" the training session. Each individual umpire must continue to maintain their own professional

attitude during training regardless of the level of supervision. During 2008, there will be further dedicated "recovery" weeks when the athlete can reduce the level and intensity of training and allow the body and the mind to recover.

The change of training time to 6pm progressed with a smooth transition. This alleviated the problem of restricted access to the oval until 6pm. Those who were able to arrive prior to 6pm spent time with light warm up activities (jogging / stretching) and practicing bouncing and throw-ins.

During July, all groups completed a Beep Test at Christ Church Grammar School to assess fitness levels. It is planned to complete this test on a regular basis in 2008. Toward the end of the season we employed the services of Alan Pearson from SAQ International to instruct the group with some agility focussed training. Following the positive feedback (despite the rain that continued throughout the majority of the session) this type of training will be utilised during the upcoming season.

The group was provided with a pre-season fitness program to lead them into the 2008 season. On December 18 we completed a "test" time trial to provide the umpires an indication of their fitness level prior to the commencement of training on Tuesday January 22, 2008.

A huge thank you to Daryl Chat and his trainers for attending to umpires, monitoring any umpire injuries and their constant feedback to me. Further thanks to Darryl Sinclair, Steve Hargrave the coaching staff for their support and feedback during the season. Finally, congratulations to all the umpires on an enjoyable and successful year. I trust you have given due thought to what individual improvements you can fulfil in season 2008.






Luke Farmer had an outstanding debut season in the AFL, umpiring 16 matches and earning himself the Coates Medal for the best first or second year AFL umpire.

David O'Neill & Scott McPhee





HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES



Sam Kronja, Bernie Roberts and Brian Collett are the latest umpires to be inducted into the WANFLUA's prestigious Hall of Fame. Established by the Association in 1995, the Hall of Fame acknowledges the outstanding on-field achievements of the "best of the best" West Australian umpires. One hundred and forty guests, including 33 Life Members and past umpires, were on hand to witness the induction of Kronja, Roberts and Collett at a formal dinner held at the Earnest Johnson clubrooms. The night not only provided an opportunity for the current generation of WAFL umpires to acknowledge the accomplishments of their elite predecessors, but also to appreciate the football of a by-gone era, as guests were treated to some entertaining footage of past Grand Finals featuring each of the inductees. Also a highlight on the evening was footage from the 1980's and 1990's that showcased an era of moustaches, tight shorts and bad hair cuts.


One man to feature prominently in these highlights was the field umpire inductee Sam Kronja. Kronja's list of achievements included 157 WAFL games, 4 consecutive league Grand Final's ('93, '94, '95, '96), 11 WAFL finals matches, a State Game, and 9 AFL games, as well as being named Umpire of the Year 3 times. Remarkably he achieved all of this before retiring at the age of just 27. Ten years down the track Kronja, now 37, said he had felt as though his umpiring career belonged to another lifetime, but when he entered

the Ernest Johnson clubrooms on the evening many memories came flowing back to him. The atmosphere and culture of the umpiring clubrooms combined with the familiar faces of many past and present umpires had made it seem like it was only yesterday he had been part of the action. Kronja also expressed his pride and satisfaction at being inducted into such an elite group, and recalled many of the more humorous moments that dotted an extremely successful career.

Temporarily living in the Pilbara town of Roebourne, goal umpire Brian Collett was unable to attend on the night, but sent a pre-recorded video statement to show his appreciation on being elevated to Hall of Fame status. A veteran of 124 WAFL Games Collett officiated in three Grand Finals ('71, '74, '76), and three State Games in a classic era in which the majority of WA's best footballers stayed based in the WAFL.

Boundary umpire Bernie Roberts' glittering 200 game career included 164 WAFL games, 10 finals matches, 2 State Games, 3 Grand Finals ('94, '96, '99) and 36 AFL games. Uniquely his achievement was celebrated with his brother Dave, who also officiated as boundary umpire in the 1990's. Along with his Grand Final appearances Roberts said the most satisfying memory of his career was umpiring with his brother. The Roberts family connection with umpiring is set to continue in 2007 with Bernie's nephew Matt Dodgson now part of the colt's field umpires' panel.







TALES FROM THE TOP END

Just a week after the final siren had sounded at Subiaco Oval to bring the 2007 WAFL season to an end I jumped on a plane to Darwin to do it all over again in the Top End. The first thing you notice when you arrive in Darwin is the intense heat and ever present humidity that makes things uncomfortable at the best of times, and takes a severe toll on your body when out on the football field. The conditions are something that take 3-4 weeks to adjust to, and fortunately for myself and the four other interstate umpires we were eased into things on our first weekend in the Territory, umpiring no less than 9 games over 3 days in the NTFL's Umpires Carnival

This is an annual preseason carnival that is sponsored by the Australian Defence Force and designed to promote community and regional football, along with the start of the NTFL season proper. The Carnival is split into two divisions with the 8 NTFL clubs playing in the Premier Division and 16 teams from all around the Northern Territory contesting the Community Division. Whilst the senior teams used the carnival as a warm up to the season, the Community Division was fiercely contested with the winner earning the right to play in the curtain-raiser to the "Dreamtime at the G" match between Essendon and Richmond

The football played in the Community Division was amazing with a smorgasbord of indigenous talent on display. The fast, skillful and unpredictable nature of a game between two all aboriginal sides is something that leaves you in awe of their natural talent and makes you appreciate the excitement indigenous players bring to our great game. The community Grand Final pitted Santa Teresa, an all aboriginal team from a community 70 km south-east of Alice Springs, against another indigenous team from the Tiwi Islands. The Santa Teresa boys had traveled for 17 hours in a mini-bus just to play in Darwin and I

think this gave them some added incentive in the final as they ran out 5 goal winners sparking wild celebrations amongst both the team and their supporters. I'm sure the experience these boys will have later this year at the MCG will be just out of this world for them, given that most are used to playing in bare feet on red-dirt ovals in 30 plus degree heat.

The following weekend was Round 1 of the NTFL season, and I lined up for my first official senior game in the Territory. The match I umpired had added significance because it was the first ever game for one of the teams taking part, newcomers the Tiwi Bombers. I have to say the excitement and public interest generated by the inclusion of this predominantly indigenous team from the Tiwi Islands into the competition has been an amazing success for the league, and speaks volumes for a league that is proactive and willing to take a chance to enhance their competition. In general the NTFL fixture a triple header at Marrara each Saturday with the three league games being played back-to-back at 2.30pm, 5pm and 7.30pm, and a Sunday fixture held at 4pm at an away venue. The dreaded 2.30 fixture is



not one you want to hear your name called out for on appointments night but even if you get a later game it is not uncommon for the temperature to still be over 30 degrees by the start of the 7.30 game. The umpires rely on each other to run water throughout the game, and everyone helps each other out on this front, as the conditions demand it, and its just taken for granted that you run water for others when your game is finished. With an age range from about 16 to 60, the umpires group is a little different to

back home, but they are all fantastic people and there is a strong camaraderie amongst the group. They have all been very supportive of the interstate umpires in helping us to set up our house and taking us out on the town, making settling in to a new place very easy. They even looked after us when Cyclone Helen

came through, with none of us quite sure how to prepare for such a fierce tropical storm

The standard of the senior NTFL football has been pretty good and allows your umpiring to continue to develop and mature. Not only has my umpiring benefited but I have made some lifelong friends and had the opportunity to see an interesting and spectacular part of Australia. The landscape, the wildlife, the crocodiles, the fishing, and the waterfalls are just amazing, with trips to the National Parks around the Litchfield and Kakadu areas the highlights of my time here The indigenous communities have also been

a pleasure to visit and I have been fortunate enough to make two trips across to Bathurst Island to umpire footy "Tiwi Islands style". Never will you meet people more passionate about aussie rules footy, and from two very small islands they are able to generate a 6 team competition meaning everyone in the community is involved in the game in some way.

Currently I am working for a civil and mining earthworks company called CDE Capital and my boss is a former West Coast Eagles scout and coach of NT and NSW/ACT Teal Cup sides, so needless to say we spend most of our time talking about football. I have also just discovered the house I am living in with four other interstate umpires is only a few hundred meters from the one Gavin Statham and Brett Rosebury lived in back in 98/99. The shared living arrangement has been a lot of fun and you're never short of someone to have a few beers with or go for run with in the evenings. The 6 months i have spent living in the Northern Territory has been a fantastic experience. It is one I am so glad I have had the opportunity to be apart of, and one that I would recommend to anyone considering it in future seasons. If you are interested in umpiring in Darwin I'd love to have chat.







for the year ended 31 October 2007

Statement of significant accounting policies

The significant policies which have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report are:

Basis of accounting

The financial report is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared for its members in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations, other authoritative announcements and the Association Handbook in a form appropriate for a sporting association.

It has been prepared on the basis of historical costs and except where stated, does not take into account changing money values or fair values of non-current assets.

The accounting policies have been consistently applied, and, except where there is a change in accounting policy, are consistent with those of the previous year.

Statement of compliance

The financial report complies with Australian Accounting Standards, which include Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (AIFRS). Compliance with AIFRS ensures that the financial report, comprising the financial statements and notes thereto, complies with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS).

This is the first financial report prepared based on AIFRS and comparatives for the year ended 31 October 2005 have been restated accordingly. There was no impact on Members' funds and operating result of adopting AIFRS from previous Australian Generally Accepted Accounting Principles.

Revenue recognition

Revenues are recognised at fair value of the consideration received.

Membership - Membership revenue is driven through subscription fees. All membership income is recognised in the financial year in which it has been received to accurately match membership revenue with events held.

Interest - Interest income is recognised as it accrues, taking into account the effective yield on the financial asset.

Receivables

Subscriptions shall be payable in the case of an Active Member immediately on notification of appointment as an Umpire and in all other cases no later than the 31st of May each year.

Collectability of debtors is reviewed on an ongoing basis. A provision for doubtful debts is raised where doubt as to the collection exists and debts which are known to be uncollectible are written off.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment is stated at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Acquisition - All acquisitions of assets (except caricatures but including the updating on all honour boards, photos and framing of posters) are recorded at the cost of acquisition, being the purchase consideration determined as at the date of acquisition, plus costs incidental to acquisition.

Caricatures - They are anticipated to have indeterminate useful life. Their service potential has not, in any material sense, been consumed during the reporting period and as such, no amount for depreciation is recognised.

Depreciation - Is calculated on a diminishing value basis using the following rates:
