
In the new year, the WAFL umpires will be in new training gear with great work done behind the scenes - Australia National Removals Group have agreed to a two year sponsorship deal. This partnership will ensure both terrific exposure for the company in an elite state wide competition, but also provide running umpires with a new streamlined uniform for training and match day.

We also rolled out WANFLUA match day casual jackets, which were made available to running and past members of the Association. These can still be purchased from the association and can be embroidered with either Life Member, PUMP or Hall of Fame Umpire to those past running Association members. This initiative has given all umpires an identity on match day and has further enhanced our professional approach in 2009.

The WANFLUA has implemented an email contact list and also produced a couple of updates which have been forwarded to members throughout the year to keep all members up to date with the goings on of the Association. Along with this new form of communication the WANFLUA also has a Facebook page, which is one of the fastest growing communication mediums world wide and assists members to find out about upcoming events, read articles about members and view function photos.

To the entire Committee, I would like to thank you for your time and support in what was a eventful and busy 2009. It was a year in which the Association moved forward and has drastically improved for the benefit of all its members. The 2009 year was a solid one for the association from a financial point of view. We returned to an operating surplus (\$2,656) after a challenging 2008 year.

We continued with our policy of subsidising junior umpires by offering them an \$80 reduction in their subscriptions, however an increase in full subscriptions to \$230 allowed us to increase our collection from 2008 by 15.5%.

A big positive for the Association during the year was the continued resurgence of The Peter Repper Bar. Sales were doubled for the year, up to \$12,873, leading to a profit for the association of \$2,988. The increased activity can be attributed to many factors,

including new functions (Singstar and 20/20 cricket), a bigger turnout to existing functions (especially Hall of Fame and WANFLUA Derby) and the wonderful ongoing efforts of Gregory Rolfe who manned the bar on most occasions during the year and ensured it was open on most training nights. Some bets by senior umpires (mostly involving the Kangaroos) also led to more money than usual being handed over the bar.

The introduction of a WANFLUA jacket was an extra source of income for the year and while the profit was small (\$357) it was another service which the Association has successfully introduced.

Panel Night and Presentation Night were well catered for this year and indeed all functions under the tight stewardship of Kendall Ball were run very well. The marquee event of the Grand Final Dinner Dance was the only event to run at a loss - our subsidising policy which has been in place for a few years ensuring a great night for all at an affordable price.

The other revenue and expenditure items for the year were largely in line with previous years and can be seen in our Financial Statements, which have again been audited by Mark Power. I would like to acknowledge once again the ongoing time given by Mark in being the Association's auditor which is much appreciated.

I would like to thank the committee for their assistance during the year and in particular the support of our Secretary Beau Wardman and President David Panagopoulos who's presence will be sorely missed next year and must be congratulated for his time as President of our Association.

The year ahead should be another one of consolidation for the association. Sponsorship of our training uniform organised by David and Beau will hopefully provide the association with more financial flexibility. The outlook for the Association is stable and positive and best of luck to those involved again next year.

The WANFLUA cannot thank you enough for your support and help each and every year with making Harry's Night continue to be one of our best traditions. Harry's Night was a very special night this year as we introduced our 2009 trainers to the group but we also recognised John McKay for his contribution, dedication and success with the WANFLUA, by naming the life member's trophy in his honour. It was wonderful to be able to have John and his wife Georgie at the function as he thanked the association and its members for allowing him to have a fantastic career in umpiring. John was a great man and member of this Association, and will be greatly missed by all.

In June, the Hall of Fame evening was our most successful with 145 people in attendance for the induction of Ron Buckey, George Pampacos and Cos Martino. With family and friends in the room to help celebrate their achievements, George and Cos reminisced on remarkable careers. Joan Buckey was also there to accept Ron's award and share his special umpiring stories with guests. The DVD presentations from Craig O'Donoghue were excellent, the Walk of Fame opened the night and it was fantastic to have so many Hall of Fame inductees there to help celebrate with Joan, George, Cos and their families. This function continues to grow as previous attendance numbers have been around 90-100, so I look forward to seeing many of you at the future Hall of Fame dinners.

This year the committee decided to put on a purely social function, so we put on the 'WAFU Umpires Sing Star' night. Paul Pitchers was the organiser of the night and did a magnificent job in setting up the competition. People dressed up to impress the judges

and although numbers weren't as high as anticipated, the people who did attend had a fantastic time. Once the competition was over, anyone could give their voices a go on the mic and they did!! Alan did an outstanding job in planning and organising this event. The amount of time and work he put into it was truly amazing. People don't realise the time and work that goes into organising events like this and for Alan, who is not on the Committee, to give up his free time is greatly appreciated. It was a fun-filled day with a wine & cheese tent set up for the ladies to enjoy whilst watching the Fieldies/Goalies vs. Boundaries. It was great to see members bring along family and friends to support the day and we hope to get a bigger crowd next year to see if the boundaries can make it three in a row.

So as you can see, it was a very busy year for our members and it was great to see many of you bring your partners along to the events. This year we set up 'Social Membership' for coaches, past umpires and partners to encourage greater involvement at the functions. This has been something that had dwindled off over the years but we had 20 people sign up this year and will hopefully see even more sign up in 2010.

There were many new things that we tried in 2009: functions, membership, green shirt initiative and the re-introduction of ASB Marketing Umpire of the Round. This award is given out three times a year to an umpire who has stood out amongst the group from Rounds 1 – 7, 8 – 14 and 15 – 23. The recipients are nominated by their peers and they were announced at EJ after training on the Thursday. The Association took this as an opportunity to have guys stay back after training and socialise with one another so we put on a BBQ for our members. A big thank you goes out to Bruce Wheatland for organising hamburgers and sausage sizzles throughout the year, this was a massive help to the committee who were out on the track. We also had 'Betty's Spaghetti Night' which was held on the Thursday leading up to the Semi-Finals for the announcement of umpire of the round. 
100 hungry ump's after a run!! Thank you to Betty and Alan for putting together this night, I look forward to having some more of Betty's Spaghetti in 2010.


have some 20 individual coach's covering our three disciplines, and via Darryl's leadership we are providing one of the best coaching environments outside of the AFL.



At the commencement of the 2009 season, after a restructure of WAFC Umpiring into market sectors, the role of the State Umpire Coach was changed to focus on high performance.

Primarily the role of the position is to coach 100 WAFL umpires (including 15 AFL Umpires), manage 16 Match Day Coaches, and oversee the Medical & Trainers department and Fitness Coaches.

The High Performance position sits under the structure of the WAFC Umpiring and reports directly to the General Manager of Umpiring. However, the role does liaise closely with the WAFL Football Operations

Manager. This position attends weekly WAFL meetings and meets with the WAFL football managers monthly.

The new structure ensures that the High Performance Coach is able to work closely with other WAFC Umpiring staff to ensure a consistent approach to coaching is implemented across the various market sectors, and that best practice coaching principles are adopted state wide.

Some highlights of Season 2009 were as follows:

- The further development of the three umpire system for WAFL Boundary Umpires;
- The implementation of four boundary umpires during the WAFL League Finals series;
- The introduction of a three umpire system for field umpires in one WAFL Colts game each week;
- The WAFL Umpiring Academy was reintroduced in 2008 and continues to fast track umpires with potential through talent pathway;
- Conducted three Professional Coaching Development seminars;
- Revised Coaching Manual and circulated to umpire coaches throughout WA
- Updated the WAFL Umpires Procedure and policy manual;
- Introduced information technology strategies to enhance feedback to umpires;
- FootyWeb updated to include every umpire who is contracted to the WAFL Team;
- The selection of three WA umpires onto the AFL List; and
- The selection of two female goal umpires in a WAFL League game.

Some further detail on other aspects of Season 2009 are as follows:

Training Facilities

- Training is conducted twice per week at the EJ oval based in South Perth;
- Coaching is conducted weekly and umpires are provided with USB thumbdrives to enhance their performance. Laptops are used for one-on-one coaching; and
- Goal Umpiring coaching sessions are conducted in the Scout Hall and the Boundary Umpires are coached in an area open to public access.

In relation to the training facilities, the following are some identified areas of improvement that will require attention going forward:

- The building cannot cope with heavy rains and the rooms are often flooded;
- The oval surface is uneven, however the condition of the oval has improved; and
- The ground is a free range reserve and regularly dogs interfere with umpires who are running on the oval.

WAFL Talent Academy

- 13 Umpires were accepted into the Academy and are coached weekly by the Talent Academy Coach;
- These umpires officiate in the WAFL Colts competition and also umpire with the Community Football League; and
- Four academy umpires officiated in the WAFL Reserves competition and two umpires umpired the WAFL Colts Preliminary Final.

Umpire Trainers

- The trainers provide a service twice per week and on match days; and
- The trainers provide massage and rehabilitation to the umpires to ensure umpires are prepared on match days.

Accreditation

- 15 Field umpires participated in the Level 3 program conducted by Jim Cail from the AFL; and
- Goal and Boundary umpires were accredited at the WAFL by senior coaching staff.

WAFL Field Umpires

- The standard of umpiring was a highlight in 2009 in particular the finals series;

- Umpires access vision of their games and can self assess performances;
- 13 umpires were inducted into the WAFL Academy and these umpires officiated in CFL, WAFL Colts and Reserves football throughout the session;
- This season the three umpire system was introduced to Colts competition to enhance the talent umpire career path;
- With the introduction of the three umpire system in Colts, it prepares umpires for Reserves and League matches. It also allows umpires to umpire in a consistent manner as they can position themselves to adjudicate on the new Laws of the game (e.g: hands in the back, ruck contests and scrimmages, etc); and
- The Academy received special tuition from the Academy Coach and the High Performance State Umpires Coach.

WAFL Boundary Umpires

- 32 Umpires officiated in the WAFL Competition including nine debutants;
- This year, due to age of the boundary team several skills sessions were conducted so that the umpire's development could be fast-tracked;
- Boundary umpires train twice per week and attend team building sessions with the goal and field umpires;
- During the final series four umpires were used in the league finals so that these umpires could be assessed under the same competencies prior to being accepted on the AFL list; and
- It is expected that several of the younger umpires will remain boundary umpiring in 2010.

Goal Umpires

- 26 Umpires officiated in the WAFL Competition including one debutant;
- Several skills sessions were conducted including video and theory sessions;
- Goal umpires train twice per week and attend team building sessions with the boundary and field umpires; and
- It is expected that only one goal umpire will not umpire in 2010.

Special Events

WAFL v SANFL State Game

In May this year WA played SA at Medibank Stadium. The WAFL Field, Boundary and Goal Umpires represented the competition and performed well.

AFL National Women's Championships

The National Championships were conducted in Perth and the High Performance Coach and other WAFL Match Day Coaches coached the umpires throughout the championships.

Future Direction

It is crucial that we continue to identify and develop talent to enhance the pathway of umpires. Three umpires in the Colts competition will assist in this process and have them prepared for Reserves and League football.

It is paramount that we continue to develop the facility at EJ so that umpires can be coached in a learning environment (e.g: coaches rooms for DVD's, rehabilitation and gym facilities and an acceptable running surface).

It is acknowledged that the WAFL clubs promote umpiring milestones, however this needs to be continued. The WANFLUA provide fellowship to the umpires and the WAFC needs to work in partnership so the fellowship remains strong.

We need to continue to promote the umpiring talent pathway, umpire coaching pathway and ensure the umpire industry is appropriately marketed.

Jace Collingridge was invited to umpire at the U/18s carnival in Melbourne and acquitted himself very well. He is certainly an exciting prospect for the future.


My thanks go to Steve Hargrave and Darryl Sinclair who have been very supportive of me and have always been very positive towards the efforts of the boundary umpires.





Well done to the 26 umpires who represented the WAFL Goal Umpire Panel in Season 2009. Once again, you serviced the three grades of the WAFL competition in a very professional manner. Four of our umpires form the WA-based AFL goal umpire team and a further 10 umpires officiated in WAFL senior football in 2009.

Success in goal umpiring at WAFL does not come easy or quickly. Four goal umpires were selected to WAFL senior finals in 2009 - Brett Rogers (90 games), Matt Laycock (70 games), John Stamatiou (59 games) and Dave Shawcross (300 games). Each of these umpires has shown years of leadership through dedication to

fitness, skill and knowledge development.

Their approach to season 2009 demonstrated again the winning formula they follow to achieve their success. They take no short cuts. Each season begins in early November with off-season fitness maintenance, then nine weeks of preseason in January to March and finally 27 weeks of home and away games, leading to Grand Final weekend. Each of these umpires leads by example, demonstrating a commitment to personal fitness which far exceeds the benchmark, outstanding off-field leadership as they represent our team and consistent on-field performances every weekend at the highest level of professionalism with skill, polish of presentation, fitness, knowledge and accuracy.

At the next level, we have a number of dedicated umpires on our panel who are striving to achieve the same level of success. But, it is only right that the road to success in WAFL football (or any field of endeavour) should be tough, making the goal all the more valuable. The skills of goal umpiring are not easily learned and it takes a number of seasons of focussed dedication and learning to be able to apply those skills consistently at the highest standard over the 24 weeks of home and away games and two weekends of lead up finals to finally gain appointment to a WAFL Grand Final.

Well done to Brett Rogers who umpired his third WAFL senior Grand Final and to Matt Laycock who umpired his first WAFL senior Grand Final in Season 2009.

In 2009, we adopted a new finals selection format for goal umpires. This was to add greater value and meaning to finals selection, to better reward those who had demonstrated the necessary level of commitment to fitness and training, and to better reward delivered on-field performances throughout the season that were consistently polished and skilful. Twelve (12) goal umpires only were selected to the finals panel and the nine grand final umpires were selected from them, based on performances during the two weekends of lead-up finals. The coaching staff expect to continue with

this format in future seasons.

There were two new faces in WAFL senior football in 2009 - Brody Payne (9 games) and Lauren French (4 games). They have both had a look inside the door to see the hard work required to remain at the senior level and to experience the rewards of being a member of that elite group. I am sure they will capitalise on this achievement, demonstrating the necessary dedication and hard work to cement for themselves a permanent position on the senior panel in season 2010.

Mark Chamberlain returned to the goal umpire panel in the first half of season 2009 after several years absence to concentrate on his studies, and Ben Lester joined the goal umpire panel after a successful season 2008 in Community A-grade football. Ben has already demonstrated notable dedication to developing his skills and fitness and should achieve high levels in seasons to come. Unfortunately, Mark is unable to continue with us beyond 2009.

Two umpires have indicated they will not return in season 2010. John Stamatiou will devote more time to his career and will reconsider his umpiring future at the commencement of Season 2011. John umpired 59 WAFL senior games and his contribution on and off the field will be missed. Martyn Tompkins has been recruited to the Match Day Coaching team and will bring many years of field umpire experience and a number of years WAFL goal umpire experience, including 10 senior games, with him.

Other highlights for season 2009 were goal umpiring award winners:
 Brett Rogers – Carter Medal – Goal Umpire of the Year 2009
 Lauren French – Smith Medal – Most Improved Goal Umpire 2009
 David Shawcross – Rose Medal – Best Pre-Season Goal Umpire 2009

Dave Shawcross umpired his first interstate game, WA v SA at Leederville Oval on 23 May 2009. Dave also umpired his 300th senior game in the South Fremantle v Subiaco 2nd Semi Final on 5 September 2009. His career includes 106 AFL games, a number of AFL finals, two WAFL Grand Finals and one interstate game.

Other milestones in season 2009: Mike Spear 200 games; Dale Edwick 150 games; Matt Laycock and John Stamatiou 50 games.

History was made on 1 August 2009 when Claremont v Swan Districts played the first

WAFL senior game in which two lady goal umpires officiated. Well done to Kendell Ball and Lauren French. Lauren is the 3rd lady goal umpire to officiate in the history of WAFL senior football.

My thanks to John Marrapodi, Robert Davis and Rick Payne, who formed our Goal Umpire Coaching panel in 2009. John is our AFL coach who also provides considerable input at WAFL level as a Match Day and Training Day coach. Robert is tireless in his work and brings a wealth of experience and knowledge to our panel. 
But the game goes on and Season 2010 will present many opportunities for our young goal umpire panel and promises to be exciting and rewarding for us all.







Rather than provide my usual report on the "year in fitness", I have taken the opportunity to reflect on my past five years in the position and offer some insights into the future.

Although many of the faces were similar at the start of 2005 as they were at the end of 2009, I believe that there has been a major evolution in the group dynamics over that time. Although some umpires may still see the physical aspect of training as a "chore" that "must" be completed to continue as an umpire, there is a growing number of umpires who realise that, if they are to be the best umpire that they can be and progress as far as possible, then physical fitness is a major requirement. As such, it has been pleasing to see an increase in number of umpires desiring to achieve a higher level of fitness. This may involve completing extra sessions and ensuring all aspects of their fitness (including recovery, nutrition, flexibility and strength) are adhered to. Over the years, I have observed an increasing number of umpires approach me for advice on how they can achieve a higher level of physical fitness. Hopefully some useful advice was forthcoming!

Another pleasing aspect over the past five years was to observe an "ownership" of training by the umpiring group. At most training sessions during the last couple of seasons, I would be able to set the program and have confidence that it would be carried out without continuous monitoring. The professional attitude of the group was appreciated as this allowed me time to communicate with various umpires and coaches regarding fitness issues rather than "controlling" each training session. Furthermore, it was a welcome addition in 2009, that the WAFL umpiring department employed the services of Holly Shawcross and Mick Adams to assist with various aspects of the training program. I appreciated their assistance and knowledge during the course of the season and it further added to the evolving "professionalism" of this group.

I stated in my 2005 Yearbook report that "it is sometimes a difficult task to coordinate the fitness training for such a large group while ensuring that all umpires trained at their optimal level." For the next couple of seasons, the sessions often involved different training regimes for the field, boundary and goal umpires as I attempted to match these individual requirements. However looking at this years' training, it appears that this has come full circle and a greater majority of the sessions were completed as one group. I believe that this has reflected the slight change in physical requirements within the group. For example; with three boundary umpires at WAFL league and four at AFL, boundary umpires now require a greater amount of speed and goal umpires are now expected to maintain a higher level of physical fitness and physique than what was previously expected. As the game continues to change, the physical demands of umpiring will also change and this will be reflected in your training programs.

Fitness testing remained to be an important focus for physical training. While everyone dreads the 4km time trial and there will always be numerous debates on what tests should be conducted, I noted with some interest the proposed changes for the AFL fitness tests to be incorporated for the 2010 season and I presume that these will be filtered through to the WAFL panel in due course. Although the data from GPS and heart rate devices is always useful to the fitness professional, I believe that, for the foreseeable future, the umpire will still be required to possess an exceptionally high level of cardiovascular fitness. While short bursts of speed are critical in maintaining position, these "short bursts" are required to be completed numerous times during a quarter of football, requiring a large "aerobic engine". The majority of your endurance fitness will be established during your pre season, so I encourage you to maintain the intensity and focus of this training phase.


While "acute" injuries (those caused by a one-off impact or event) will continue to occur, I can't remember too many umpires having to retire from chronic (overuse) injuries during the past few years. Its great to see some of the longer serving umpires to continue to train and run games even though they may not be at the level they once were. My key point at the start of 2009 was that you are all individuals and you should be all continually be self assessing you own level of physical fitness and deciding what you, as an individual, require in terms of training loads, recovery etc.. The goal at training should no longer be to "smash" yourself at every training session, every week. This leads to chronic overuse injuries and eventually retirement due to injury. While we don't currently have the manpower to manage the training load of each individual umpire, I implore you to monitor your own training load and train "smart". This is not a case to be slack (if you don't train hard you will be found out wither in testing or on game day) but train smart and realise when you, as an individual, should adjust your training load.

I'm sure it will be a smooth transition to the new fitness staff. Although, many of you will be glad to see the back of me, the bad news is that I have provided Holly with all my training programs so I'm sure many of the sessions that you thought may be gone will return in season 2010 and beyond. I wish you every success for your remaining days as an umpire and hope that you continue to practice a healthy lifestyle when you leave umpiring and are no longer "required" to complete regular training. In my professional role as an exercise physiologist, I note that 60% of the population is overweight and do not exercise at a level to maintain basic health. You are currently all well above the average fitness level of the general population and some of you are truly in the elite 0.01%.

I thoroughly enjoyed my time with the group and will continue to watch the continuing development of this group.






Coming from an athletics background, Jace always keeps himself in terrific shape. 2009 was no exception.

David was delisted from the AFL Panel at the end of 2008 and made a decision to commit to the WAFL Panel for at least a couple more seasons.



It would be remiss of me to commence the 2009 AFL Season Report without recognising the achievement of Brett Rosebury, who became the first field umpire who commenced his umpiring career in the WAFL to go on and achieve the ultimate – umpiring an AFL Grand Final. Brett was awarded his second consecutive All Australian Field Umpire, and umpired 26 games during the season. It is a worthy achievement for someone who made the move to Melbourne at the end of the 2001 season in an attempt to scale the peak of an AFL Grand Final.

Congratulations to the WA-based AFL squad for their combined efforts during the 2009 season. The efforts of Dean Margetts, Craig Hendrie, Luke Farmer, Todd Keating, Jeff Dalglish, Jamie Giles, Alan Zanich, Nathan Doig, Haden Martin, Richard Heptinstall, Mike Spear, Dale Edwick, Adam Peacock and Brett Rogers highlight the commitment and sacrifices required to umpire at the highest level. Training began not long after the 2008 season came to a close, with many of us starting to run in October 2008.

We headed to Melbourne at the end of January for a pre-season seminar and fitness testing in Ballarat. We welcomed Richard Heptinstall and Brett Rogers onto the respective boundary and goal lists, and both performed very well at the seminar. Jeff Dalglish, Stuart Parry and Gavin Statham were also invited to trial during the NAB Cup pre-season competition. Unfortunately Stuart was injured and unable to trial, and Gavin was unsuccessful, however was offered a AFL Rookie List contract. Jeff impressed by blitzing the field umpires in the 4km time trial, and was rewarded with a position on the field umpires panel.

During the season Luke Farmer struggled with injury, and completed 4 games during the season. Richard debuted in the Round 1 match between Fremantle and Western Bulldogs. Jeff's first game was the ANZAC day clash between Fremantle and Sydney, while Brett made his debut in the round 9 game between West Coast and Collingwood.

In the Round 22 match between West Coast and Richmond Jamie Giles achieved the milestone of 200 AFL Games, which is an amazing achievement. 2009 was also Jamie's 10th year of AFL service, and he received life membership of the AFLUA as a result. In the same match Haden Martin umpired his 50th AFL match.

Apart from Brett Rosebury umpiring AFL finals during the 2009 season, WA was represented in the finals series by Jamie Giles and Nathan Doig. They umpired on the boundary together in the first elimination final Adelaide vs Essendon at AAMI stadium. Jamie umpired exceptionally well and progressed through to the semi final and preliminary final. Unfortunately, when umpiring at the top of his game during the St Kilda vs Western Bulldogs preliminary final, Jamie succumbed to a calf injury.

It proved to be his final game of AFL football. Jamie retired at the end of the season citing family and work commitments. After 203 AFL matches, Jamie has pulled the curtain down on one of the finest careers by a Western Australian umpire. Jamie has been an example to all umpires in regards to his training and preparation, and his consistency and regular finals appearances have been just reward for his commitment.

At the end of the 2009 season, we were all disappointed to learn that Craig Hendrie and Haden Martin had been informed that their contracts would not be renewed. Gavin Statham also missed out on the opportunity to trial again, despite umpiring his 3rd consecutive WAFL Grand Final. Craig finished his AFL career on 69 games, while Haden's 50th game was also his final AFL match. Both were rewarded with the WAFL Grand Final to round out the 2009 season.


Dean Margetts, Todd Keating and Jeff Dalglish will be flying the WA flag in the field umpiring ranks in 2010, as Luke Farmer has made the move to Melbourne in attempt to further his AFL career. We wish Luke all the best for his umpiring in the 2010 season, and hope that the move will see his goals fulfilled. The NAB Cup in 2010 will see Stuart Parry trial for the one vacant field umpires position.

Alan Zanich and Nathan Doig now find themselves the "elder statesmen" of the boundary umpires panel in WA, while Richard Heptinstall will be aiming to build on his excellent first season of 13 games. They will be joined by Jace Collingridge and Brett Dalglish, who have offered positions on the boundary umpires list for 2010. Their promotions have been just reward for excellent 2009 seasons in which they umpired the WAFL Grand Final.

2010 offers a new opportunity for our goal umpires in Mike Spear, Dale Edwick, Adam Peacock and Brett Rogers. While Brett had an exceptional first year, umpiring 6 matches at the highest level and umpiring his 3rd consecutive WAFL Grand Final, Mike, Dale and Adam were disappointed to miss out on finals selection.

Congratulations on the performance of our AFL umpires during the 2009 season. 2010 offers all of us new opportunities, and the depth of our umpiring panel will be tested with the loss of plenty of experience at the highest level, however I believe we have the talent and the ability to cover these losses and grow together to achieve greater success.





The Academy is managed by former AFL Umpire Brett Allen and the program consisted of a pre season camp, professional development workshops and teleconferences, personal and community development projects.






- Although he did mention they would not have performed so well had they not been forced to dig deep by their worthy adversary.











Notes to the financial statements

for the year ended 31 December 2009

1 Statement of significant accounting policies

The significant policies which have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report are:

Basis of accounting

The financial report is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared for its members in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations, other authoritative announcements and the Association Handbook in a form appropriate for a sporting association.

It has been prepared on the basis of historical costs and except where stated, does not take into account changing money values or fair values of non-current assets.

The accounting policies have been consistently applied, and, except where there is a change in accounting policy, are consistent with those of the previous year.

Statement of compliance

The financial report complies with Australian Accounting Standards, which include Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (AIFRS). Compliance with AIFRS ensures that the financial report, comprising the financial statements and notes thereto, complies with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS).

This is the first financial report prepared based on AIFRS and comparatives for the year ended 31 December 2005 have been restated accordingly. There was no impact on Members' funds and operating result of adopting AIFRS from previous Australian Generally Accepted Accounting Principles.

(a) Revenue recognition

Revenues are recognised at fair value of the consideration received.

Membership – Membership revenue is driven through subscription fees. All membership income is recognised in the financial year in which it has been received to accurately match membership revenue with events held.

Interest – Interest income is recognised as it accrues, taking into account the effective yield on the financial asset.

(b) Receivables

Subscriptions shall be payable in the case of an Active Member immediately on notification of appointment as an Umpire and in all other cases no later than the 31st of May each year.

Collectability of debtors is reviewed on an ongoing basis. A provision for doubtful debts is raised where doubt as to the collection exists and debts which are known to be uncollectible are written off.

(c) Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment is stated at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Acquisition – All acquisitions of assets (except caricatures but including the updating on all honour boards, photos and framing of posters) are recorded at the cost of acquisition, being the purchase consideration determined as at the date of acquisition, plus costs incidental to acquisition.

Caricatures - They are anticipated to have indeterminate useful life. Their service potential has not, in any material sense, been consumed during the reporting period and as such, no amount for depreciation is recognised.

Depreciation - Is calculated on a diminishing value basis using the following rates:

Honour boards, photos and posters	10%
Plant and equipment	10%

(d) Cash assets

Cash assets are carried at face value of the amounts deposited.

Notes to the financial statements
for the year ended 31 December 2009

(a) Inventories

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Net realisable value is determined on the basis of each inventory line's estimated selling price.

(b) Payables

Trade creditors represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the Association prior to the end of the financial year and which are unpaid. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

(c) Taxes

The Association is exempt from the payment of income tax under the Income Tax Assessment Act.

Goods and services tax (GST) - Revenue, expenses, assets and liabilities are recognised inclusive of the amount of GST.

(d) Transition Year

This year has been a transition year as the Association changes from a Financial Year finishing on 31st October to 31st December. Therefore these figures cover 14 months from 1st November 2008 - 31st December 2009. The association does not trade during November or December and as such, the additional months have not had a material impact on the comparative nature of the figures.

AUDIT REPORT

To The Members of The West Australian National Football League Umpires' Association (Inc.)

Scope

I have audited the Financial Records of The West Australian National Football League Umpires' Association (Inc.) ("WANFLUA") for the period 1 November 2008 to 31 December 2009. The WANFLUA is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the Financial Records and have determined that the accounting policies used are consistent with the financial reporting requirements of the Association and are appropriate for the needs of the members.

I have conducted an independent audit of the Financial Records in order to express an opinion to the members of The West Australian National Football League Umpires' Association (Inc.)

The income and expenditure statement has been prepared for distribution to members for the purpose of fulfilling the Committee's financial reporting requirements under its constitution. I disclaim any assumption of responsibility for any reliance on this report or on the income and expenditure statement to which it relates to any person other than the members, or for any purpose other than that for which it was prepared.

My audit has been conducted in accordance with the Australian Auditing Standards to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the Financial Records are free of material misstatement. My procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the Financial Records and the evaluation of accounting policies and significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether, in all material respects, the Financial Records are presented fairly in accordance with Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements in Australia, the Associations Incorporation Act (WA) and the WANFLUA's Constitution so as to present a view which is consistent with my understanding of its financial position and the result of its operation and its cash flows.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

As is common for organisations of this type it is not practical for the WANFLUA to maintain an effective system of internal control over subscriptions, functions, bar sales and other activities until their initial entry in the accounting records. Accordingly, my audit in relation to subscriptions, functions, bar sales and other activities was limited to the amounts recorded.


AUDIT OPINION
