We have also witnessed the re-painting of the coaching room, cleaning and re-organization of our storage rooms for training and medical staff as well as further growth of the bar after the great work of Greg Rolfe in 2009. We moved panel night back to EJ which was welcomed as a massive success and planning has begun for the 2011 edition. 2010 AT A GLANCE...



Treasurer's Report



The 2010 year was another solid one for the Association from a financial point of view. An operating surplus of \$2,471 means the Association stays in a strong financial position.

A change to our social calendar this year saw Panel Night held at Ernest Johnson reserve with great success. The more relaxed 'Panel' style was not only well received, the function was able to run at a considerably lower cost than previous ones at Subiaco Oval. This enabled more of our umpires subscriptions (\$9,580, up from \$7,370 in 2009) to go towards other services during the year. All other events ran smoothly and in a similar vein to previous years thanks to the outstanding efforts once again of our Social Secretary Kendell Ball. Our capstone event for the season, The WANFLUA Grand Final Dinner Dance, retained its status as an elite function with ticket prices kept at reasonable levels thanks to subsidisation from the WAFC and the Association. A loss on the event of \$736 a good result in the circumstances.

The Peter Repper Bar continued to trade at a high level, the big loss of Greg Rolfe as Bar Manager being alleviated by the added efforts of all members of the Association to keep the Bar open as much as possible during the year. A profit on trade of \$3,014 (up 0.9%) a testament to the Bar was organised and maintained during the season.

It is worth noting that cash on hand at the end of the year was \$30,263 (down from \$33,341) despite the profit. This can be partly attributed to increased merchandise on hand (up \$1,645 to \$2,745) and bar stock on hand (up \$580 to \$1,219), however the main factor is a decision by the Association to purchase some capital items during the year which we used to hire for our yearly functions. With a strong cash position, this decision will save hiring costs in future years and leave the Association in a stronger position. Capital acquisition for the year totalled \$3,508 and included a projector, projector screens and trestle tables.

Sponsorship from National Removals Group saw an additional \$1,500 in revenue which was the first of a two year deal which has assisted the Association gain some flexibility in our revenue generating capability from uniform sponsorship. Other revenue and expenditure items for the year were largely in line with previous years and can be seen in our Financial Statements, which have again been audited by Mark Power. I would like to acknowledge once again the ongoing time given by Mark in being the Association's auditor which is much appreciated.

This year will be my last as Treasurer as injury will see me out of umpiring for the coming season. I would like to thank the committee for their assistance during the year and in particular the support of the two Presidents I have served under, Beau Wardman and David Panagopoulos who have invested an enormous amount of time and effort to their roles and made my job much easier. Thanks to everyone else for their co-operation over the past three years and good luck moving forward.

Boundary Umpires' Coach Report



2010 was a year that we were going to struggle again for numbers, but I was confident that with the recruiting we had done in 2008 and 2009, this young group would be prepared to take up the challenge and get the job done.

To say "ignore youth at your peril" was never more evident and when they were given the opportunity they grabbed it with both hands and did not let the coaching staff or the competition down. The thing that excited me about this group was they wanted to achieve as much as possible and from a coaching viewpoint I could not have asked for anything more.

A few long term injuries and illnesses along the way also impacted on the group and at times there was some inconsistent performances and this is one area I would like to see improvement in next year.

The pre-season started with 32 boundary umpires and we gained another seven as the year progressed. Training was of a high standard and Dom Strambolini and Ryan Sinclair were rewarded for their efforts in the pre-season by being selected to debut in league football in round 1.

Goal Umpires' Coach Report



Twenty-five umpires represented our WAFL Goal Umpire Panel in season 2010, servicing the three grades of the WAFL competition in a very professional manner. Four of them formed the WA-based AFL goal umpire team and a further ten officiated in WAFL senior football in 2010.

A number of colts games were also umpired by community football goal umpires: Corey Buscall, Teegan Lincoln and Shean Gilday and umpire coaches Rick Payne and Martin Tompkins. It is hoped Corey, Teegan and Shean will join the WAFL goal umpire panel in season 2011. Other new faces in WAFL football were Michael Scaffidi, Emmy French and Steve Touchell. All have made an excellent start to their goal umpiring and will look to build on their skills in season 2011. Reuben Garlett returned to WAFL football after several seasons absent. Reuben spent most of season 2010 in reserves football and finished a successful season umpiring the colts Grand Final.

There were two debutants in WAFL senior football in 2010, Luke Edwards (9 games) and Jared Warren (4 games). They have both had a look inside the door to experience the hard work and commitment required to remain at the senior level and to enjoy the rewards of being a member of that elite group. I am sure Luke will capitalise on this achievement, demonstrating the necessary dedication and hard work to cement a permanent position on the senior panel in season 2011.

Jared is taking a break from umpiring to pursue his trade. Simon Thomas (91 games), Jack Crawshaw (26 games), Ben Lester and Kevin Beermier have also indicated they may not be returning to goal umpiring in season 2011. Thanks to each of them for the service they have given to our Association and to the game, we wish them every success in their future endeavours.

For the 2010 finals campaign we continued the practice of selecting a minimum goal umpire finals panel. Thirteen goal umpires were selected and they delivered quality goal umpiring throughout the finals campaign.

The four goal umpires selected to the senior finals were Dave Shawcross (324 games), Brody Payne (30 games), Kendell Ball (65 games) and Simon Thomas (90 games). Their approach to season 2010 demonstrated again the winning formula they follow to achieve their success. They take no short-cuts. Their campaign for each season begins in early November of the previous year and continues for 11 months until finals. It's a long journey, but the reward of a senior final and possibly a grand final are well worth the effort. Each of these umpires leads by example, demonstrating a commitment to personal fitness; outstanding off-field leadership as they represent our team; and consistent on-field performances every weekend at the highest level of professionalism with skill, polish of presentation, fitness, knowledge and accuracy.

At the next level, we have a number of dedicated umpires on our panel who are striving to achieve the same level of success. But, it is only right that the road to success in WAFL football should be tough, making the goal all the more valuable. The skills of goal umpiring are not easily learned and it takes a number of seasons of focused dedication and learning to be able to apply those skills consistently at the highest standard over the twenty-seven weeks of home and away games and finals.

Strength & Conditioning Coach Report



Season 2010, well I guess most would look back and say it was a year of many changes and opportunity for all, right from the umpires through to the fitness staff. This year was the first year I was appointed as Strength & Conditioning Coach, having to fill the knowledgeable and experienced shoes of former fitness coach Rob Suriano, who had been with the club since 2005. I was taken under Rob's supervision as a practical student back in 2008 and spent 2009 as his assistant coach.

I would like to thank all the umpires and coaching staff for allowing the change-over in roles to be a smooth and extremely supportive transition. The first few months of the season I was still finding my ground and establishing a good relationship with the umpires, but as the season progressed things eventually began to settle and I became less nervous in the way I conducted training. I have certainly learnt a lot over the season and when I look back I can see what works, what doesn't, what to change and what to improve on to keep both enjoyment and fitness consistency.

I was very impressed to see so many of the umpires coming into the season with a solid established fitness base, it shows the majority of you took it as a responsibility to rest properly and commit to a solid pre-season. Therefore I cannot stress it enough to do the same thing again for 2011, allow for some off time and well needed recovery over the break, hang the runners up for a little, then get the motivation and discipline rolling by recommencing your pre-season so you are ready to go in February.

The team atmosphere and leadership of the senior umpires this year was a solid driving force in keeping the groups motivated to turn up to training, with a lot of you pushing to "take responsibility" out on the track. It is hard training week after week with no competition goal really in sight. However, looking outside the box, the fitness training associated with being an umpire provides you with a stable exercise routine to keep yourself fit, strong and healthy. This is particularly important overall health and well-being as well as helping pursue your umpiring career goals. If you didn't belong to WANFLUA would you train as hard as you do with the group? Would you be motivated to train through scorching heat or heavy rain all on your lonesome? As a group you excel in your delivery in umpiring and it is great to see the majority of you have the same motivation and drive for your fitness goals.

Although keeping a few of Rob's favourite sessions on board this year, I did my best to mix up the variety a little, but also transition my coaching style across as easily as I could in small doses. I have received lots of feedback from the umpires and coaching staff on the sessions I have provided which I will take on board for next year to ensure the 2011 program brings a fresh feel and a high level of fitness like 2010 brought us.

My advice to you all is to remember to continue to train successfully and not competitively. Know your body and your limits. Combine this with a good healthy diet, adequate recovery and plenty of variety in your training. Include some flexibility and strength training to keep your body strong. Enjoy your training and make the most of your time off from pounding those runners into the ground. Try something different over the summer, a boxing class, pilates, or even swimming even. Set your goals for 2011 both on the field for umpiring and for your training and let's make it an even better year for umpiring in WA. See you all next season!

Head Trainer Report

The 2010 season saw the split of WAFL with AFL umpires, which enabled more dedicated care to the WAFL umpires. The WANFLUA appointed a new head trainer and a familiar face in Kylie Hansen as deputy. The focus of the medical trainers for 2010 was to keep the umpires on the track through prehabilitation and rehabilitation. We had a strong and enjoyable start to the season with the introduction of early morning core at the camp. Presentations throughout the season kept the umpiring group informed of new injury reporting protocol and various rehab and prehab options they had to keep them on the track.

Communication was a major part of keeping the total number of games missed, down in season 2010. Umpires, coaches, fitness and medical staff worked very well together to keep the injuries to a minimum. Each injury concern was documented and the coaches informed, allowing injured umpires adequate time to heal without the pressure from coaches unaware of the situation.

2010 was a great year for keeping preventable injuries low, especially towards the end of the season leading into finals. The most common injuries seen this season were to shins, ITB, hamstrings and calves, all of which can be improved with the correct preventative strengthening exercises. Heading into season 2011 WANFLUA will introduce a new head trainer in Kylie Hansen. I am very confident that she and the medical staff will continue the efforts and do a great job next year. Thanks for a great season and best of luck in the future.

AFL Report

2010 saw a number of changes to the WA- based AFL umpiring unit. Jace Collingridge and Brett Dalglish were appointed to the AFL boundaries list and umpired consistently well all year, with Jace umpiring his first AFL final between Fremantle and Hawthorn after 'Z' had to pull out due to illness. Luke Farmer made the move east to get closer to the main field umpiring group in Victoria. A move that saw him, again consolidate himself as an established AFL umpire. He umpired 19 games including the round 6 Carlton v Collingwood blockbuster as well as a number of Friday night games. Brett Rosebury, WA's favourite ex-pat backed up his 2009 effort to be appointed to his second AFL grand final, which for only the third time in history ended in a draw. The following week Brett umpired his third grand final in the grand final replay and officiated in his 200th AFL game to become the most decorated umpire to have hailed from WA since the inception of the national competition.

The WA goal umpiring team impressed again with their professionalism and attention to detail. Second year goal umpire Brett Rogers continued to show why he is an emerging leader within the goal umpiring ranks with his work ethic and dedication. Adam Peacock had another superb season in 2010, flying under the radar beautifully. Dale Edwick had a standout season, often seen smashing himself on the training track, the ex-field and now goal umpire extraordinaire continues to set the benchmark for professionalism and work ethic. Mike Spear showed his style in 2010 with a very consistent season. Unfortunately at the end of 2010 Speary was not offered a contract for 2011, which paved the way for Matthew Laycock. Fortunately for WA umpiring Speary will be seen strutting his stuff in the WAFL for a few seasons yet, returning to contribute his services and experience to the young WAFL goal umpiring group in 2011 and hopefully beyond.

Nathan Doig had an outstanding season, being appointed to three finals including the Preliminary Final between StKilda and Western Bulldogs, as well as officiating in his 100th AFL game between West Coast and StKilda. 'Doigy' as he is affectionately known, now has five finals credited to his name. Alan Zanich, self appointed leader of the WA clan, had a very successful season which saw him go past 100 AFL games in the round 15 clash between West Coast and Adelaide and be appointed to the Elimination Final between Fremantle and Hawthorn, only to be struck down by illness the day of the match. Richard Heptinstall in his second year on the list consolidated his spot as an AFL boundary with a very consistent year. Jace Collingridge and Brett Dalglish also performed well in their first years in the big league with 19 (including a final) and 17 games respectively.

With field umpire Luke Farmer opting for the café strips and freezing weather of Melbourne for the 2010 season, Dean Margetts, Todd Keating and Jeff Dalglish were left to represent Western Australia. Dean Margetts had a very strong year moving into his 10th as an established AFL umpire. Dubbed the 'Road Warrior' Dean travelled 65,000 km over the course of the season, which saw him appointed to a number of big games that even Greg Scroop would be envious of. No stranger to giving away signed No. 6 guernseys to young and budding umpires, Dean, being a man of the people finished up the year being appointed as emergency umpire for the Fremantle v Hawthorn Elimination Final. Todd Keating continued to consolidate himself at AFL level with a solid and consistent year. Left without a rookie for 2010, the WA based field umpires were often required to double up as an emergency umpire on a weekly basis.

It would also be remiss of me not to mention the coaching and support staff who week-in week-out provide advice and support to the WA-based team. Darryl Sinclair was recognised for his efforts over the past five years by being promoted to the National High Performance Coach role in which he oversaw the National 18s carnival. John Marrapodi continued to critique his goal umpiring crew to a new level – some say he has been heavily influenced by Colin Shawcross' 143 steps to goal umpiring hypothesis, which will be available in novel format at all good book stores soon. Sean Fairfoul, filed a record 93 investigations for the year – a tally that was met by VIC, QLD, NSW and SA combined. Some are now suggesting he undertake a compulsory eye examination with our main sponsors OPSM. Finally our fill-in observer, Trevor Garrett, graced the group with his knowledge and expertise when he was available. Thank you to these coaches for sharing your knowledge and experience as we look for ways improve as individuals and as a team.

Trainers and support staff are often considered to be the glue that holds a team together, and as well as keeping a few body's from falling apart in 2010, the support team in WA, Head trainer Darryl Chat, young veteran Alyse Newman and head physio Ebony Riggio are no exception. Thank you for helping the boys get up week-in week-out, your work never goes unnoticed.

Looking ahead to 2011, just like WA Golden Eggs, the foundation has been 'laid in WA' for a successful year. The Challenge for the group is to maintain its unwavering level of commitment, dedication and professionalism as they take a one team approach to get the best results for our group, but for football in general.

FOOTY WILD

Taking the game to Africa



The AIS AFL Academy, which comprises 30 of Australia's best young footballers, flew to South Africa after a practice match against the Sydney Swan's reserves.

Based at the High Performance Sports Centre in Pretoria, the cultural part of the trip was heavily emphasised.

We visited the shanty town of Soweto. Its name, an abbreviation for "South Western Township", refers to its origins as a black township under South Africa's Apartheid Government. Soweto was home to both Desmond Tutu and Nelson Mandela and the scene of several watershed events in the struggle against Apartheid.

In Johannesburg we also visited the Apartheid Museum, where we learnt about Mandela and South Africa's history. We were also lucky enough to take in a safari in Pilanesburg National Park where we saw much of Africa's unique wildlife, including lions and elephants - a real highlight.

The team then travelled on to Cape Town to play the South African National Team, the Lions, at the historic Newlands Cricket Oval. Newlands is a spectacular venue set against the backdrop of Table Mountain. Although the AIS boys defeated the Lions by 20 goals, it was a very physical contest. The Lions tackled strongly, but the Australians were just too precise, skilful and strong. Seeing the passion and the way South Africa has embraced Australian Rules was terrific. Despite the loss, they sang and danced after the game.

Football in South Africa has only had a significant presence since 1997 when the Australian Defence Force took the game to the North West Province. But the game has grown quickly. It is now played in 144 schools across four provinces and has approximately 15,000 participants. Fremantle, West Coast, Carlton, and Collingwood have aligned themselves with a province and have committed to help grow the game. The locals affectionately refer to AFL as "Footy Wild" and are attracted to the fast and unpredictable nature of our game. I even met a young man who was so enthralled with AFL that he named his son 'Burgoyne' after his favourite player from Port Adelaide.



In Cape Town we ran a development day for AFLSA staff, coaches and umpires, visited Nyanga township, went to local schools and ran football clinics. This was probably the most fun and rewarding moment of the trip as we taught the kids the "Big 5" skills - kicking, marking, handball, defensive skills and evasive skills. Seeing the kids smile and laugh showed how much they appreciated us being there. AFL is the only sport that actively gets out into many of the townships across South Africa.

From Cape Town we also went to Roben Island, the prison island home to Mandela for 27 years, and climbed Table Mountain.

The trip finished in Perth, as the team played a curtain raiser against West Perth before West Coast played Essendon. The South African experience is not one I will forget quickly, and even though I only spent 11 days there, the Rainbow Nation left an impression on me that will last a lifetime.

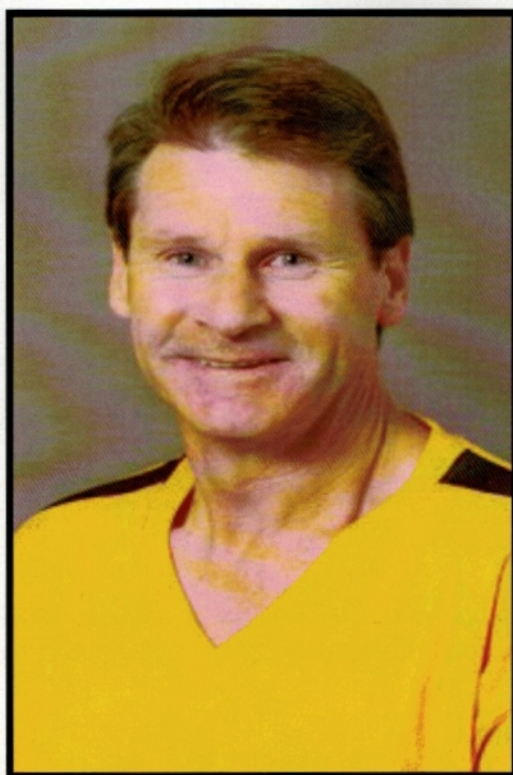

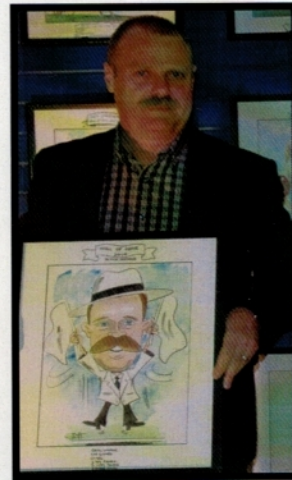

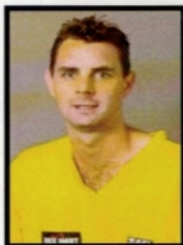

MONTGOMERY MEDAL - CRAIG HENDRIE

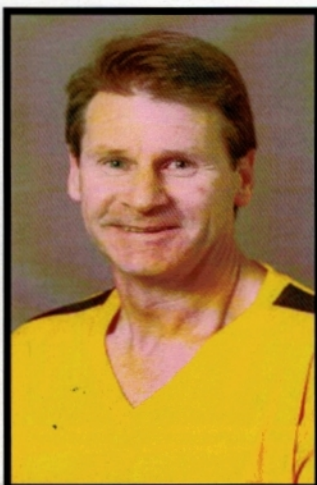

Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2010

1 Statement of significant accounting policies

The significant policies which have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report are:

Basis of accounting

The financial report is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared for its members in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations, other authoritative announcements and the Association Handbook in a form appropriate for a sporting association.

It has been prepared on the basis of historical costs and except where stated, does not take into account changing money values or fair values of non-current assets.

The accounting policies have been consistently applied, and, except where there is a change in accounting policy, are consistent with those of the previous year.

Statement of compliance

The financial report complies with Australian Accounting Standards, which include Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (AIFRS). Compliance with AIFRS ensures that the financial report, comprising the financial statements and notes thereto, complies with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS).

(a) Revenue recognition

Revenues are recognised at fair value of the consideration received.

Membership – Membership revenue is driven through subscription fees. All membership income is recognised in the financial year in which it has been received to accurately match membership revenue with events held.

Interest – Interest income is recognised as it accrues, taking into account the effective yield on the financial asset.

(b) Receivables

Subscriptions shall be payable in the case of an Active Member immediately on notification of appointment as an Umpire and in all other cases no later than the 31st of May each year.

Collectability of debtors is reviewed on an ongoing basis. A provision for doubtful debts is raised where doubt as to the collection exists and debts which are known to be uncollectible are written off.

(c) Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment is stated at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Acquisition – All acquisitions of assets (except caricatures but including the updating on all honour boards, photos and framing of posters) are recorded at the cost of acquisition, being the purchase consideration determined as at the date of acquisition, plus costs incidental to acquisition.

for the year ended 31 December 2010**

(e) Inventories

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Net realisable value is determined on the basis of each inventory line's estimated selling price.

(f) Payables

Trade creditors represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the Association prior to the end of the financial year and which are unpaid. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

(g) Taxes

The Association is exempt from the payment of income tax under the Income Tax Assessment Act.

Goods and services tax (GST) - Revenue, expenses, assets and liabilities are recognised inclusive of the amount of GST.
