

President's Report

After a couple of years in the position of President, I think the committee has really capitalised on the strong position the association is in. In 2011 we celebrated Craig Hendrie breaking the field umpire games record, the induction of Craig O'Donoghue, Luke Farmer and Alan Zanich as Life Members and added John Morris and Andrew Curtis into the WANFLUA Hall of Fame.



Our functions were again a fantastic success in 2011, and special tribute should be paid to our social secretary, Kendell Ball, for her outstanding efforts behind the scenes in getting these functions up and running. Panel Night was again held at Ernest Johnson with terrific success and saw our highest attendance in a number of years. The Hall of Fame function continues to be the highlight of the year and the modified format in 2011 was well received. In 2012, our focus moves to the Team of the Decade which will be a significant event for the WANFLUA, and I look forward to seeing a number of current and former members at this night celebrating the last decade.

In addition to the formal functions of 2011, the Peter Repper Bar was again fully operational under the management of Ryan Shelton, who put in many hours and new initiatives to help the post-training social environment thrive. We introduced special food nights and the bottle top quizzes provided much banter throughout the year. The Umpire of the Round functions were also highlights, and it was great to see a number of Life Members and past umpires come down for these nights.

After many months of dedicated work over the last couple of years, David Panagopoulos, along with more recently, Darryl Sinclair, have completed the heritage numbers project. In 2010, David commenced a project to list all umpires who have ever umpired league football in order. Whilst this project seemed like it was going to be relatively easy, both men had to trawl through decades of year books, Football Budgets and appointments to rank every umpire. It is hoped that we will be able to present these numbers in 2012. I would like to thank these two men for their work and research in compiling this list; it is greatly appreciated by myself and the committee.

Off the field we have been able to secure a new major sponsor for 2012/13 with the Weather Wizard signing up. I would like to thank Michael Spear for committing to the WANFLUA and the deal will hopefully see a number of mutual benefits for both organisations. In addition to signing a new major sponsor, we resolved a very prosperous negation with the WAFC regarding our Memorandum of Understanding. We have secured a number of deserved benefits in this agreement, not least bringing the payments of reserves and colts umpires back into line with where they were some six years ago. I would like to thank Steve Hargrave for his commitment to WAFL Umpiring and the support he provides to the WANFLUA throughout the year, as well as the professionalism with which these negotiations were carried out.

This year we had Mark Bowden move to Sydney mid-way through the season to pursue a new work opportunity. Mark was a committed committee man, and was really missed; however I was grateful of the service he gave over a number of years. At the end of the season Paul Pitchers was offered a new position within umpiring at the WAFC, which he accepted and subsequently retired as a WAFL umpire. To avoid any conflicts of interest, Paul also resigned from the committee effective from 2012. Paul has been umpiring with the WAFL group for 14 years and more recently has served on the committee, instigating the SingStar night, as well as running the 2011 Quiz Night. Paul also served on the Hall of Fame committee during this time and provided valuable support for the committee as a liaison with the WAFC. We wish Paul all the best in his new role, and know that he will still have a strong relationship with the committee in the years to come. Also leaving the committee at the end of 2011 is Brad Hunt. Whilst Brad is still heavily involved in the association, he will concentrate on his leadership and umpiring opportunities. Brad provided a lot of support to the association in his short time on the committee, with his major project being the WANFLUA weekly newsletter released in 2011. Whilst this will now be managed on our new website, Brad's initiative ensured a higher level of communication with our members.

I would like to thank my committee members for the power of work they have done behind the scenes to ensure our members have some fantastic benefits and create a great culture. Whilst much of the work may not be visible, the sacrifices made are immeasurable. Our committee members are the first to functions and the last to leave; they put great hours into the preparation of events, nominations for awards of members, as well as seeking ways to improve the professionalism of the group and the overall enjoyment of being a part of the WAFL Umpiring scene. A special mention to Steve Gaensler, who this year stepped up as vice-president and has been a rock in my corner providing enormous support, especially with regards to the sponsorship, MOU and more recently as webmaster. Craig was appointed to the Round 1 League game Swan Districts v East Perth which would be his 314th League game, surpassing Vernon and assuming the title of Games Record Holder. It was fantastic to have many life members in attendance and it was a great opportunity not only for the life members to see how the pre-season went for the umpiring group, but for the current umpires to meet the umpiring greats of this association. Hopefully meeting and chatting to our life members gave the up and coming umpires something to aspire to both on and off the field.

As always, Harry's Night was next on the calendar. Unfortunately numbers were lower than previous years, but the people who attended had a brilliant time. Jo Smith and May Jardine once again cooked up a lovely meal for all to enjoy. We introduced our trainers for the 2011 season and thanked them for all the work they do for us throughout the season. After all the formalities were out of the way, the music was turned up and we danced the night away.

Hall of Fame continues to be the biggest event on the WANFLUA social calendar. In excess of 120 people were in attendance to witness the induction of Field Umpire John Morris and Goal Umpire Andrew Curtis into the Hall of Fame and to help celebrate their wonderful careers. The format was changed this year to be a cocktail function rather than a sit down dinner because the attendance at this event has continued to grow, meaning that EJ cannot comfortably seat that many people in winter. The new format seemed to work well and we received positive feedback on the changes.

This year the Association replaced 'SingStar' Night with a Quiz Night. A big thank you to Paul Pitchers and Alan Zanich for organising this event. Paul did a terrific job as Quiz Master and Alan organised all the auction items for the night. With over 80 people in attendance it was a good night out for all who attended and it was great to see friends and families of umpires attending and supporting the association. These three umpires had an outstanding season and I wish them all the best in 2012. The night closed with the announcement of the Semi Final appointments.

The Grand Final Dinner Dance was to follow. We held the 2011 Dinner Dance at the Esplanade in Como. There were over 120 umpires and partners in attendance. We try to keep formalities to a minimum on this night as we want everyone to be able to celebrate and have fun. We acknowledged the Grand Final umpires and presented them with their certificates. A special mention must go to Scott McPhee, Callum Brown and Luke Edwards, who officiated in their first league grand finals. We also acknowledged and presented the Umpire of the Year medals to Stuart Parry, Adam Bastick and Michael Spear. All three had amazing years and it was great to see that their hard work throughout the year paid off.

2011 AT A GLANCE...



Treasurer's Report

As this was my first year in the position of Treasurer, I am quite pleased to say that the WANFLUA performed well in 2011, posting an operating profit of \$9 188, which is up quite substantially from 2010. With three umpires being appointed in all grades for boundary and field, along with solid recruiting for the goal umpires, the WANFLUA has seen an increase in the number of running members, leading to increased revenues subscriptions and lower overheads at social functions. Along with some helpful grants from the WAFC and sponsorship from National Removalist Group, this has contributed to the rise in operating profit.

In terms of the social events run through the year, the WANFLUA again adopted a policy of running the Dinner Dance at a loss to ensure that the ticket prices for this event were affordable for all members and their partners. A change of venue saw a small saving in terms of venue hire, which explains the reduction in the loss incurred compared to 2010. All other social events were budgeted and managed by successfully by Kendell Ball to ensure these events remain financially viable.

Ryan Shelton was elected to the committee and subsequently offered his services as the bar manager for 2011. This helped ensure that efficient controls in relation to stock purchases were implemented and also resulted in reduced wastage. In addition, given the costs of supplying food and drink has risen over the past few years, the WANFLUA decided that a small price rise over all items sold from the bar was needed. Therefore, while our quantity sold had been reduced, our greater profit margin meant that we exceeded the profit from 2010.

Apart from the website development costs, the WANFLUA had no other major asset purchases in 2011, however if the outlook for profits continue to look promising, then the WANFLUA will consider purchasing assets to benefit the members in 2012. The drastic drop in the carrying value of our property, plant and equipment was due to a prior year adjustment made to write off the caricatures dating back to 1995 which have been incorrectly capitalised.

The cash position for 2011 did not change substantially and the WANFLUA has maintained a term deposit of \$19 000, which we will continue to sustain as a support to the current cash position to ensure a base of funds will be available to future members.

The WANFLUA has a positive outlook financially for 2012 with the introduction of a new sponsor, "The Weather Wizard Air-conditioning", on a two year deal and subscriptions predicted to remain consistent with 2011. We believe that the association is in a good position to provide a greater service to its members, with the results already showing in 2012 with the new training gear and match day shirts already being provided.

General Manager WAFC Umpiring Report

On behalf of the WAFC Umpiring team in Darryl Sinclair, Glenn Omodei, Paul Pitchers, Tim Priest and Ally Samson, I take great pleasure in acknowledging the collective performance from all WAFL umpires during season 2011. The standard and professionalism displayed throughout the season was a credit to every umpire, particularly given some negative environments and individual challenges encountered along the way.



I'm continually amazed at the fortitude, self discipline and integrity that our WAFL umpires take into each game. When one considers these qualities, combined with fitness demands and AFL law knowledge, together with an ability to adjudicate these in pressure situations, one is quick to realize the level of talent, competency and dedication required to succeed as an umpire, particularly at WAFL level and beyond.

There were 115 Umpires involved throughout the season, a number which has increased significantly over the past 3 years as the WAFL progressively introduced the 3 umpire system for field and boundary umpires across all grades. Importantly, this healthy growth has developed a very competitive environment, whilst also facilitating the transition of young umpires as they enter and come to terms with the professional demands required at a state league level.

As witnessed each year, we continue to see some outstanding achievements, personal milestones and recognition for service to umpiring. From first gamers through to Gavin Statham reaching the magnificent 300 game mark and all WANFLUA award recipients, we congratulate and pay tribute to all umpires given their respective achievements in season 2011.

Goal Umpires' Coach Report

Twenty-seven goal umpires were listed on the WAFL Panel in season 2011, servicing the Perth based AFL games and the three grades of the WAFL competition. A number of goal umpires from the Community Football League and the Peel Football League also assisted in the WAFL Colts on weekends when WAFL Panel numbers were insufficient.



Four of our umpires form the WA-based AFL goal umpire team, along with a further 11 umpires, officiated in WAFL senior football during season 2011.

The introduction of the Foxtel Cup provided extra opportunities for WAFL goal umpires in 2011, which led to Reuben Garlett (6 games), Steve Gaensler (5 games), Sally Boud (4 games) and Sam Hunter (3 games) making their league debuts. All four umpired extremely well in their debut season and are expected to cement their place on the senior panel in season 2012.

New faces in WAFL football were Daniel Dobson who joined us permanently from the Peel Football League, Corey Buscall, Cameron Symcox, Paul Flanders, Phil Pryce and Ben Clark. All have made an excellent contribution to the WAFL competition in 2011. Unfortunately, due to work, family and study commitments Corey, Paul and Phil will not be continuing in 2012.



Strength & Conditioning Coach Report

On reflection, season 2011 proved to be another fantastic season both out on the training track and with umpiring performances at all levels. Sadly we lost the assistance of Mick Adams, who last season assisted me with the conditioning of the umpires with his valuable knowledge in sprint coaching. I would like to extend a big thank you again to all the umpires and staff for another smooth running



Pre-season training commenced in the hot summer heat, but this did not deter commitment and keen dedication of the umpires wanting to hit training hard and set their sights on the first time trial of the year, which indeed saw some outstanding times run in all umpiring disciplines. AFL Report

With seven representatives, including Jace Collingridge, Nathan Doig & Richard Heptinstall from the boundary umpiring panel; Dale Edwick, Matthew Laycock & Brett Rogers from the goal umpiring panel; and Jeff Dalgleish from the field umpiring panel, finishing in their respective discipline's 5km time trial inside the top 5 nationally, the WA panel was off to a good start.

The boundary umpiring panel was rewarded for exceptional in-season performances with some big appointments, including interstate Friday night blockbusters, confirming their status on the national selection ladder.

Leading the WA charge into September, Brett, Jace and Nathan were appointed to the finals panel which concluded in a second semi final berth for Brett Dalgleish and a debut appointment to the AFL Grand Final for Nathan.

Matt Laycock was welcomed to the goal umpiring panel and debuted in Round 9, completing another 5 games to round out a great debut year. This season's goal umpiring panel was the most inexperienced of recent times, resulting in a clear focus of laying a foundation from which to capitalise in coming years. Each of the panellists; Dale Edwick (13 games), Matthew Laycock (6), Adam Peacock (10) and Brett Rogers (13) contributed by developing their game while securing first-class air time.

Adam Peacock established himself as an experienced member of the panel, registering his 50th AFL game during the intense Round 18 Western Derby.

Our field umpiring panel was led through a successful season by Dean Margetts, who finished with a finals berth and his 150 AFL game milestone in his pocket. Dean was supported superbly by a panel on the rise, which included Luke Farmer, Jeff Dalgleish and Todd Keating, combining for a total of 36 AFL appearances.

Luke officiated in 15 games, unfortunately curtailed by injury early in the year, and Jeff showed his capacity to perform on the big stage registering 14 games. Look out for these two to break though in 2012.

A season of limited opportunity restricted Todd to 7 appearances at AFL level and has led him to hang up the whistle on his 40 game AFL career, resulting in the AFL's loss of one of umpiring's genuine good guys.

We congratulate Scott McPhee, Justin Orr and Dave O'Neill on receiving invitations to trial for positions on the AFL's national field umpiring list, and wish them all the best as they compete with 15 other trialling umpires from around the country. Each has shown that they have the ability required to succeed at the next level, including outstanding professionalism on and off the field, and are expected to represent WA umpiring with integrity.

Further congratulations are extended to Beau Wardman who has been selected to participate in the AFL Academy Program, taking him a step closer to umpiring in the AFL.

Pouring concrete on season 2011 will do a lot for the future of umpiring in WA, as it will serve as a great foundation for 2012 and beyond. We are well-poised moving into the coming seasons, with lists in each discipline that are capable of grasping the opportunities created and putting forward strong representation in finals football.

This marked the conclusion of the camp, and saw a group of tired and weary umpires head off to try and make the most of what remained of the weekend.

Once again, the Hal Symonds Fitness Camp was a great success, with umpires not only working hard on their fitness, but also learning a great deal from the various presentations and coaching sessions, as well as having a lot of fun in the process and further developing the camaraderie and team spirit within the group. The success of the camp was due to the hard work and support of a number of people, in particular Darryl Sinclair and his team of coaches; Beau Wardman and the rest of the WANFLUA Committee; Holly Shawcross and Kylie Hansen; as well as WANFLUA Life Member Matt Hayes and the team at Woodman Point Recreation Camp. However, even with the outstanding efforts of these individuals, the camp would not have been a success without the participation and support of all the running umpires. The attitude of the group was excellent, with umpires prepared to concentrate and work hard for the serious parts of the camp, as well as enjoying the competition between the teams in the right spirit. Doig's AFL Grand Final

Boundary umpire Nathan Doig became the fifth WA whistleblower to officiate in an AFL grand final when he strode on to the MCG for the season decider between Geelong and Collingwood. Doig joined the likes of Dan Gooch, Cos Martino, Andrew Curtis and Brett Rosebury in a select group of WA umpires to have made it to the last Saturday in September, or in Doig's case, the first Saturday in October.

The 26-year-old massage therapist said it was a privilege to be mentioned alongside some of WA umpiring's greatest names, even if it was a position he never aspired to be in. "I guess if people want to put me in that kind of group now, it's nice, but I'm just glad that I could show the current group of boundary umpires that if you work hard it is possible. When I first started, all I was trying to do was perform the best I could and get to the WAFL grand final and possibly earn a shot at the AFL. Nothing has changed now, at any level or with anything I do. I always strive for the ultimate, but it is almost a bit of a relief to have finally got there."



Doig's rise to the pinnacle of umpiring was just reward for the naturally talented runner, who joined the WAFL umpiring ranks in mid-2002 after making the switch from athletics. He was promoted to the AFL panel in 2005 after officiating in both the 2003 and 2004 WAFL grand finals, and made an instant impression on the big stage by clocking the second-fastest time trial in the pre-season, behind only 11-time AFL grand final umpire Darren Wilson.

Doig has since gone on to umpire 138 AFL games, including eight finals, and was unlucky not to have officiated in the drawn grand final between Collingwood and St Kilda in 2010 after missing out by the narrowest of margins. However, all of that was forgotten when he went one better in 2011.

Doig was a picture of calm on game day, even after getting over the initial excitement of receiving his official grand final shirt. "I have competed at quite a high level in athletics so I was kind of used to pressure, and even though it's not a normal game, I tried to treat it as such," he said. "I also had my wife Ash with me in the whole lead-up and she can always keep me calm. I was able to stay calm even through the national anthem and with the roar of the crowd. It was only when I was on the corner of square and the ball was about to be bounced that I realised this was THE grand final."

Any nerves Doig had disappeared after his first decision, or non-decision – a mark directly over the boundary line early in the opening quarter. The rest of the game remains a bit of blur, he admitted, but the experience is something he will never forget.

Doig's former WA-based AFL coach Sean Fairfoul described his charge as a hardworking, motivated and disciplined individual. "While there have been a lot of really good umpires not do an AFL grand final, there have been very few ordinary umpires who actually get one," Fairfoul said. "To get an AFL grand final is a monumental achievement. It not only means that you have been umpiring at a consistently high standard all year, but that the previous seasons have also been of a high standard. More importantly, Nathan is one of the truly great people that I have met. I could not be more proud of him, and look forward to his continued success in the future."

A special training session was organised for Doig on the Tuesday prior to the grand final and, despite the torrential weather, a number of umpires turned out to lend their support. Fellow AFL boundary umpire Alan Zanich said Doig was an inspiration to all of his WA teammates, both at AFL and WAFL level. "Nathan always has the best interests of the entire WAFL and AFL group at the forefront of his mind," Zanich said. "This was reflected through his development of the WAFL/AFL boundary umpire training program implemented into the group last year, and further displayed through his commitment to the development of our WAFL umpires."

"Upon appointment to the AFL grand final, Nathan provided heartfelt thanks to the WA AFL boundary umpiring group, because he genuinely believes this achievement would not have been possible without the team structure around him. This was further supported by his actions in not accepting any individual praise for his achievement without voicing his adulation for teammates and coaches. I have not heard him speak of this enormous success as anything other than recognition of the WA AFL team as a whole. We have forged a very team-oriented group over the last few years and Nathan is a big part of that."

Doig is confident of umpiring back-to-back AFL grand finals in 2012 despite having a slightly different pre-season campaign than previous years. "I spent most of the summer working overseas with an Australian elite athlete, which was tough work but hopefully rewarding," Doig said. "It's tough work trying to train on a treadmill though."



Hendo Calls Time

Craig Hendrie retired at the conclusion of the 2011 season as one of the all time greats of umpiring in Western Australia. Hendrie commenced umpiring as a 14 year old with the North Suburban Junior Football League in 1988 while still playing football. Despite playing a handful of colts games for West Perth, Hendrie eventually came to realise that umpiring was where his football future lay. After joining the WAFL Panel in 1995, he progressed quickly through the ranks, leading to a league debut in 1996.

Hendrie umpired his first league grand final in 2001, which was soon followed by grand finals in 2002 and 2003, and was the recipient of the Montgomery Medal in all three seasons. He was also appointed to the state games in 2002 and 2003 against Queensland and South Australia respectively.

As a result of several consistent seasons, Hendrie was promoted to the AFL Panel for the 2003 season. The opportunity to umpire at the highest level was a dream come true for Hendrie. "The opportunity to umpire in front of 50 000 people on iconic grounds like the MCG is something I will never forget," he reflected. "You literally get the best seat in the house and get to view the stars of the game up close. I was lucky to be a part of it for 7 years, and the people I have met and the experiences it has given me will last in my mind for a long time."

Hendrie's AFL career came to an end at the conclusion of the 2009 season after a total of 69 games. Despite this, Hendrie returned to the WAFL to umpire for a further two seasons, umpiring the grand final in both seasons, as well as being appointed to the state game and receiving the Montgomery Medal in 2010. "I always had intended to umpire in the WAFL after finishing in the AFL," he said. "How many seasons that was going to be, I wasn't sure. It turns out that it was an extra two seasons and they were some of the most enjoyable in my 17 years on the WAFL and AFL panels."

In his final two years on the WAFL panel, Hendrie contributed a great deal both on and off the field. "Craig was terrific for the group," said WAFC High Performance Umpires Manager Darryl Sinclair. "It was a credit to him that he came back and contributed to the group for two more seasons after finishing up with the AFL. He was a great leader on and off the field."

When reflecting on Hendrie's career as a whole, Sinclair was quick to place him in the upper echelon of umpires in the history of the WANFLUA. "Craig was a model of consistency over 17 years of umpiring," he said. "To umpire 337 games is a fantastic achievement in itself, but in the 180 or so games where I was involved in coaching Craig, I can hardly remember a bad game. In my opinion, he would be comfortably inside the top ten umpires in the history of the association."

Tellingly, Hendrie is held in very high regard by those he umpired with. Stuart Parry, who officiated with Hendrie in three of his six grand finals, commented that "there is no one else you would want by your side in those big games. Craig's composure was obvious to all, however what is often forgotten, was his ability to maintain his sense of humour out on the footy field in big moments, which had a calming influence on those around him."

Four-time grand final umpire Gavin Statham also paid tribute to Hendrie's personality as well as his ability to perform at a high level over a number of seasons. "Off the field, Craig is one of the most likeable people you will ever meet, who loves a laugh and a beer with his mates," Statham reflected. "However, when it came to umpiring, he took it very seriously and always gave it 100%. Come game day he would be very relaxed, but as soon as you walked onto the field, he would switch on and lead his team."

For Hendrie, the decision to retire wasn't an easy one, especially since he was still performing well on the field. "It's always a difficult decision to make, but I came to the conclusion from about half way through the year that I was going to make 2011 my last season," he said. "I've had some great opportunities along the way, from umpiring AFL football, to grand finals, state games and in more recent times, I've had things named after me, which is a little weird, but very humbling. I would not have changed a thing in my time with this team, and I know that the friendships I have formed will last a lifetime."

Hendrie also paid tribute to his wife, Zoe, for her support over his career. "I've known Zoe as long as I have umpired and she has ridden every high and every low," he said. "If you don't have that kind of support in a caper like this, it becomes very difficult."

Despite having hung up the boots on an illustrious career, Hendrie maintains that he won't be lost to the association. "As a life member, I'll be at the functions throughout the year and I will certainly be at the camp next year," he said. "I've grown up with this association and it's a bit hard to shake it. It's in the blood."






EMMY FRENCH




MONTGOMERY MEDAL - STUART PARRY


