# Treasurer's Report



This year was always going to be a challenging year financially, with the WANFLUA committee deciding early on that we would run our 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary function at a loss to ensure that the event was affordable to all past and present members. However, I am proud to announce that the association still posted an operating surplus for 2012.

It has to be noted that without the extremely generous sponsorship provided by The Weather Wizard, the association would have been left rather exposed by the increase in function expenditure. I will also take this opportunity to encourage all our members both past and present to support our major sponsors. This will ensure that we can continue to attract these great sponsorship deals into the future, which will enable the provision of quality gear and events at affordable prices.

A mention must also go to Chevron for providing us with a grant to buy training equipment. Jerome Mohen was instrumental in securing this grant and hopefully all members will benefit from the equipment. Thanks Jerome.

The number of subscriptions was again a lot higher than two years ago, however I encourage anyone who has outstanding fees from 2011 and 2012 to pay before the 2013 home and away season starts. It is not fair that some umpires benefit from the hard work of the committee and the money from other fee paying members, while not accepting financial responsibility themselves. In 2013 I will be monitoring this more closely, however you can help by ensuring your 2013 subs are fully paid by the start of round 2 of the home and away season or by signing the authority to deduct form that will be available at panel night.

The bar was once again superbly managed by Ryan Shelton with the assistance of the other committee members. This year we saw the introduction of more confectionary items, and coupled with the increase in attendances both after training and at functions, have enabled the bar to contribute quite substantially to our association for the second year in a row. # Boundary Umpires' Coach Report

# Strength & Conditioning Coach Report



Season 2012 came with its highs and its lows – the low point being that sadly it was my last season as head conditioning coach with the WANFLUA after a total of five years with the club (one year as a prac student, one year as an assistant and three years in the head role). On a positive note, I personally felt that this season was best season by far with the team under my watch. The year started out with everyone following their pre-season plans and coming in to start the official season with a really sound fitness base. As usual, I hit the group with one of my harder sessions to see who had done the hard work over the break and who hadn't, and I was pleased to see that the majority of umpires had done the work.

I was lucky enough to have prac student Hannah Rodoreda take up a role as an assistant to myself and Kylie Hansen, and together we structured a successful rehab program which Hannah supervised. This rehab group saw injured umpires who had been cleared by Kylie given specific rehab exercise programs, and train under Hannah's watch until they were able to transition back into full training with the team after passing a fitness test. The introduction of this program resulted in minimal recurrence of injuries throughout the season, and together with my restructure in the training cycles, resulted in less of the common overuse injuries occurring than in previous seasons.

Education and more core and strength training were also incorporated this season. I was very pleased to see more umpires following the advice of Kylie and myself to undertake gym/weight training programs to supplement their running training in order to improve their overall running and umpiring performances. Across the board, umpires excelled and improved their time trial times and their yo-yo beep test scores, which was a testament to the umpires and indicated that their training was doing the job.

Being my third full season as head conditioning coach, I was able to test out my training knowledge somewhat and did create a few harder sessions throughout the year which many of the umpires will probably remember for quite some time. As in any season, we also had the small handful of sessions that didn't go as planned, fell short or exceeded the mark, however conditioning and trying new formats is always a trial and error process. I thank all the umpires for persevering through those sessions, and after all, they all came out the other end just fine.

In summary, I want to thank each and every umpire for allowing me to train you to greater heights in your fitness levels and umpiring abilities. I hope that you have taken onboard everything I have tried to teach and train you on over the last three seasons. Not only have you grown individually and as a club, but I consider my time with WANFLUA to have been extremely valuable, as working here has assisted me into growing into a better fitness professional. However, as they say, all good things must come to end at some point, but with that comes new opportunities. Therefore, I would like to wish everyone all the best in season 2013 under the reins of Hannah. My final piece of advice as a trainer and athlete myself, is: "If it's important to you, you will find a way. If it isn't, you will find any excuse". So... how important are your umpiring and fitness goals for 2013, and how bad do you really want it?

# AFL Report

The beginning of the 2012 season started in the early weeks of November 2011, with the three disciplines running the streets of Perth in preparation for the fitness tests that the national umpiring camp would bring in the last week of January 2012.

A fit and fresh WA-based AFL squad made the trip to Victoria for the annual camp, including field umpires Dean Margetts, Luke Farmer and Jeff Dalglish; boundary umpires Alan Zanich, Brett Dalglish, Jace Collingridge, along with first year umpire Adam Bastick; goal umpires Adam Peacock, Dale Edwick, Brett Rogers and Matthew Laycock. Field umpire Beau Wardman accompanied the AFL umpires on the trip as a part of the AFL Academy Program.

Trialling field umpires Scott McPhee and Justin Orr worked hard enough to secure rookie contracts for season 2012, while unfortunately David O'Neill missed out. The boys will no doubt be looking to secure a spot on the field umpiring panel for 2013.

Goal umpire Brett Rogers had a delayed start to the season with injury forcing him out until Round 3. This injury put a bit of pressure on the remainder of the panel to umpire all of the preseason, practice, NAB Cup and Challenge matches. Adam Peacock seemingly thrived in this new found limelight and was appointed to the NAB Cup Grand Final between Adelaide and West Coast at AAMI Stadium as a result of his performances early in the pre-season.

2011 AFL Grand Final boundary umpire Nathan Doig made the decision in early 2012 to take up an exciting career opportunity in pursuing his passion in massage therapy with elite athletes. This absence left open a place on the panel which Callum Brown was given the opportunity to fill.

Callum Brown debuted on June 2 in the Fremantle vs Adelaide match at Patersons Stadium and went on to umpire 11 AFL matches, while the other first year boundary umpire, Adam Bastick, debuted on April 14 when Fremantle hosted Brisbane. Adam finished his 2012 season with 13 AFL matches.

Jace Collingridge officiated in 21 games in 2012, passing his 50 game milestone in the process, taking his total of games officiated to 60. Jace continues his exceptional form, appointed to the finals panel for a 3<sup>rd</sup> successive year, culminating in a Preliminary Final at MCG between Hawthorn and Adelaide.

Brett Dalglish was also appointed to the finals panel for a 2<sup>nd</sup> successive year, progressing through to the 1st Semi Final at AAMI Stadium between Adelaide and Fremantle. Brett officiated in 20 AFL matches in 2012, also passing his 50 game milestone in the process, taking his total AFL games to 58.

Alan Zanich completed his 9<sup>th</sup> season in the AFL, officiating in 20 AFL games in season 2012 taking his total match tally to 146. Like fellow boundary umpires Brett and Jace, Alan was appointed to the finals panel officiating in the 2nd Elimination Final between Geelong and Fremantle at the MCG.

With goal umpire Matthew Laycock establishing himself on the panel in his second year by umpiring eight matches, Adam Peacock, Dale Edwick and Brett Rogers shared the remainder of the matches with 12 each. Brett Rogers just missed out on an on-field appointment but was rewarded for his consistent season by sitting on the bench in the First Elimination Final between West Coast and North Melbourne at Patersons Stadium.

Adam Peacock announced midway through season 2012 that it would be his last AFL season in the white coat. Adam celebrated his 66 game AFL career with a strong second half of season 2012.

Luke Farmer had his break out AFL season in 2012 which culminated in his first final between Adelaide and Sydney at AAMI Stadium, which was just reward for his 22 quality games throughout the season. This enabled Luke to position himself in the top 12 umpires for season 2012, and Luke will no doubt be looking to build on that as we launch into 2013. Luke will also hit the 100<sup>th</sup> AFL game milestone in season 2013.

Jeff Dalglish also had his most consistent season in umpiring 18 AFL matches. His back part of the season was as good as any umpire in the land and Jeff will be looking to take that to the next level in season 2013. With his fitness knowledge, Jeff is always challenging the team with exercises that leave the guys sore for days, and it would have to be said that these sessions paid off. Jeff will also hit the 50 AFL game milestone this season.

Despite umpiring 23 Home and Away games, Dean Margetts proved that one mistake at the elite level can be costly with a highly controversial decision in the round 22 Sydney v Hawthorn game derailing his year. That said, he still made the top 16 and sat as the emergency umpire in the West Coast vs North Melbourne Final at Patersons Stadium. Dean will umpire his 200<sup>th</sup> AFL game and 300<sup>th</sup> senior game during season 2013.

Scott McPhee and Justin Orr also provided great support to the WA-based AFL field umpiring team and it was pleasing to hear that even interstate umpires commented on how thorough and professional they were all season in their roles as emergency umpires.

Former WA umpire Brett Rosebury confirmed his status as one of the game's greatest ever umpires, by notching his 250<sup>th</sup> AFL match on September 1 between Geelong and Sydney and being appointed to a 5<sup>th</sup> successive AFL Grand Final.

Season 2012 saw the WA panel rewarded with a recently unprecedented number of umpires reach the finals panel. The team is looking to build on this achievement and making more of an impact in September 2013.

The WANFLUA would also like to congratulate Dean Margetts on being awarded the Bishop Shield. The Bishop Shield is a peer-voted award presented to an AFL field umpire who demonstrates involvement in the ALFUA affairs while also achieving on-field success. Dean's professionalism, leadership in coordinating the WA-based umpires and his enthusiasm towards umpiring despite his heavy travel load were key factors in him receiving this award. Well done Dean.

# Smith's Marvellous Milestone

Boundary umpire Greg Smith chalked up an astonishing milestone in July when he officiated in his 400<sup>th</sup> league game.

The 400 game barrier had rarely been reached at any level. Only two West Australian players – Barry Cable and Brian Peake – managed 400 games and Smith was the first umpire.

The 43-year-old began his WAFL career in 1994, went on to umpire 159 AFL matches and two WAFL grand finals. His AFL career ended after the 2005 season, but he returned to the WAFL and has been a staple on the boundary ever since.

Speaking on the eve of the round 18 game between West Perth and Claremont, Smith said he found it hard to comprehend that he would be umpiring his 400<sup>th</sup> match. "It's a strange feeling," Smith said. "There's a lot of guys who have done milestones this year and when I hear someone is doing their 250<sup>th</sup>, I think 'wow, that's a lot of games' and then it hits me that I'm about to do 400. That's a really long time. We had the umpire association's 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary function this year and I caught up with a lot of guys who haven't umpired for a really, really long time but I umpired with them.

"It was a year by year process when I came back. I wanted to come back because I enjoyed it and since then every year has gone by. I want to improve every year and the younger guys challenge me and push me. Seeing the young guys develop is really exciting. But my goals are always to improve every year."

By joining the 400 Club, Smith guaranteed himself a unique place in WA football history. The milestone came just weeks after Cable's outstanding career for Perth, East Perth and North Melbourne was celebrated with his elevation to Legend Status in the Australian Football Hall of Fame. Cable said Smith deserved enormous credit for what he'd achieved during 19 years of league football. "It's a great achievement," Cable said. "Anyone who can get to 400 games has displayed longevity and shown the ability to excel. It takes a lot of dedication, commitment, ability and hard work. It's not easy to do and it won't be easy in the future. It will continue to be hard but Greg has shown that it is not impossible."

Smith is a legend of WA umpiring. He was picked in the WANFLUA's Team of the Decade at the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary function, the umpiring change-rooms and the most improved boundary umpire medal are named in his honour and he is a life member of the association.

But his deeds have also inspired and taught others. "He's an icon," 2011 AFL Grand Final boundary umpire Nathan Doig said. "Whenever I have a question about boundary umpiring and what I should be doing on the field, Smithy's the person I go to."

WA's Dan Gooch, who umpired two AFL grand finals, said Smith's commitment to be an elite athlete was astonishing. "We all hated it when the skinfolds test happened because he was impossible to compete with," Gooch said. "He didn't have a bit of fat on him. I reckon he'd still have one of the lowest skinfold counts too. He's a marvel."

Fellow AFL umpire Alan Zanich, who began his time at the elite level in 2004, said Smith was the most humble person he'd met in football and his career proved that it is crucial to get the basics right. "My coach pointed out to me that Greg was the most consistent thrower of the ball that we had," Zanich said. "He wasn't the highest, he wasn't the longest but he was the most consistent. So, I stole the last half of his technique which is his release. He has a really controlled, single handed, straight release. Most guys sling it out but Smithy is very controlled with his palm in front of his face. Now, that's what I show other people and tell them that is what Smithy does."

While at 43 years of age Smith is no longer among the elite runners, AFL boundary umpires' coach Geoff O'Neill said it was amazing he had maintained such strong fitness levels beyond his 40<sup>th</sup> birthday.

Three time WAFL grand final umpire Richard Heptinstall said Smith made the game look easy. "In my first year, we were doing a game at East Fremantle and it was 35 degrees and more than 40 goals got kicked," Heptinstall said. "I was exhausted and looked across to the other side of the ground and Smithy barely looked like he was sweating. He told me after the game that he found it quite hard that day, but he is a machine."

Smith is often appointed to run with developing umpires so he can pass on his experience. One of those, Brodie Ward, said all of the inexperienced boundary umpires lapped up the opportunity to work alongside a legend of the craft. "When you're coming through, he's the perfect person to look at because no-one does it better," Ward said. "You should watch and learn but he's always there to help you and tell you what you need to do if you need it. He gives the most constructive feedback that you could ever ask for."

Smith is still considering whether to umpire for a 20<sup>th</sup> season, but he's described himself as a year by year proposition since 2005. He's closing in on 250 WAFL games, so there's another significant milestone which few umpires have achieved.

One thing is certain – it will take a herculean effort for any umpire to break his record.





# Team of the Decade

The judges had to select three field umpires and one emergency, four boundary umpires, two goal umpires and a third scorer. They also had to name the team in order. Multiple AFL Grand Final umpire Brett Rosebury was the clear choice as the number one field umpire and was joined by Dean Margetts, Craig Hendrie and emergency Luke Farmer on stage.

"It was a huge honour to be recognized as umpire of the past decade with so many great umpires being nominated," Rosebury said. "I have made a lot of great friends and I have enjoyed sharing my success over the past 10 years with everyone on the WANFLUA. Rosebury flew to Perth for the event, as did the number one boundary umpire, Nathan Doig. He was working with Steffensen in London but arrived back in Australia on the day of the function to accept his award in a team that also included Jamie Giles, Greg Smith and George Pampacos.

"To be named boundary of the decade and be up there with guys that I respect and looked up to as I started umpiring was nice. I think any of us could have been the boundary of the decade," Doig said.

"It's not about the awards – I believe it's for the enjoyment and I know I wouldn't be here if I didn't enjoy it."

The goal umpiring team comprised enormous strength. Andrew Curtis edged out Cos Martino for the number one position after both men officiated in AFL Grand Finals during the 10 year period. David Shawcross was named the third scorer.

The night also celebrated Grant Vernon's induction into the WA Football Hall of Fame and he was joined on stage by the members of previous teams of the decade. In other highlights of the evening, AFL Umpiring Manager Jeff Gieschen addressed the group and John McGrath MLA was a notable guest.

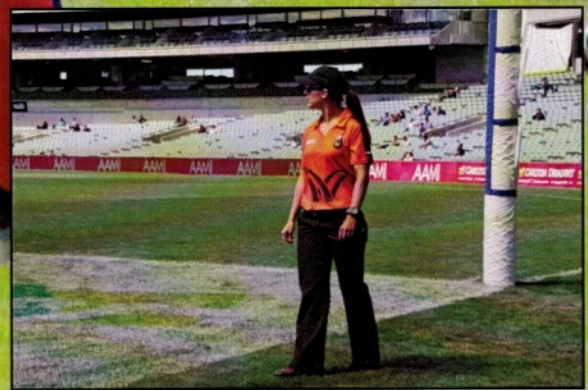

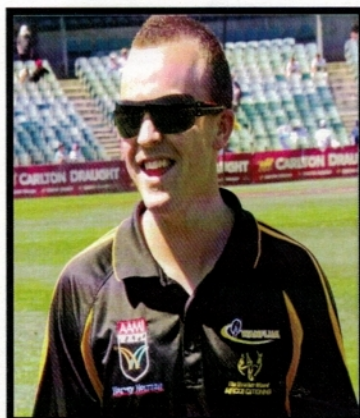
## MONTGOMERY MEDAL - Scott McPhee

## Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2012

### Statement of significant accounting policies

The significant policies which have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report are:

#### Basis of accounting

The financial report is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared for its members in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations, other authoritative announcements and the Association Handbook in a form appropriate for a sporting association.

It has been prepared on the basis of historical costs and except where stated, does not take into account changing money values or fair values of non-current assets.

The accounting policies have been consistently applied, and, except where there is a change in accounting policy, are consistent with those of the previous year.

#### Statement of compliance

The financial report complies with Australian Accounting Standards, which include Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (AIFRS). Compliance with AIFRS ensures that the financial report, comprising the financial statements and notes thereto, complies with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS).

#### (a) Revenue recognition

Revenues are recognised at fair value of the consideration received.

Membership - Membership revenue is driven through subscription fees. All membership income is recognised in the financial year in which it has been received to accurately match membership revenue with events held.

Interest - Interest income is recognised when it is credited.

#### (b) Receivables

Subscriptions shall be payable in the case of an Active Member immediately on notification of appointment as an Umpire and in all other cases no later than the 31st of May each year.

Collectability of debtors is reviewed on an ongoing basis. A provision for doubtful debts is raised where doubt as to the collection exists and debts which are known to be uncollectable are written off.

#### (c) Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment is stated at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Acquisition - All acquisitions of assets (except caricatures but including the updating on all honour boards, photos and framing of posters) are recorded at the cost of acquisition, being the purchase consideration determined as at the date of acquisition, plus costs incidental to acquisition.

Caricatures - They are anticipated to have indefinite useful life. Their service potential has not, in any material sense, been consumed during the reporting period and as such, no amount for depreciation is recognised.

Depreciation - is calculated on a diminishing value basis using the following rates:

Honour boards, photos and posters	10%
Plant and equipment	30%

**(d) Cash assets**

Cash assets are carried at face value of the amounts deposited.

**(e) Inventories**

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Net realisable value is determined on the basis of each inventory line's estimated selling price.

**(f) Payables**

Trade creditors represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the Association prior to the end of the financial year and which are unpaid. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

**(g) Taxes**


