It was an honour and a privilege to be elected by as WANFLUA president for season 2022 I have always been proud to represent the group each year I have been elected to do so.

I would like to thank Dean Margetts as the WAFL Umpire Manager and his coaching staff, the coaches along with Andrea Boots continued to support our members throughout the duration of 2022 in what was a year that had changes occurring regularly to umpire availability, training, and all aspects of umpiring.



Was very pleasing this year to have our Development Squad Umpires as a part of the WANFLUA fully in season 2022 and great to see many of these umpires getting involved at our other social functions this year and hopefully these umpires all feel like you are now fully a part of this group and the environment we have.

WAFL MANAGER'S REPORT

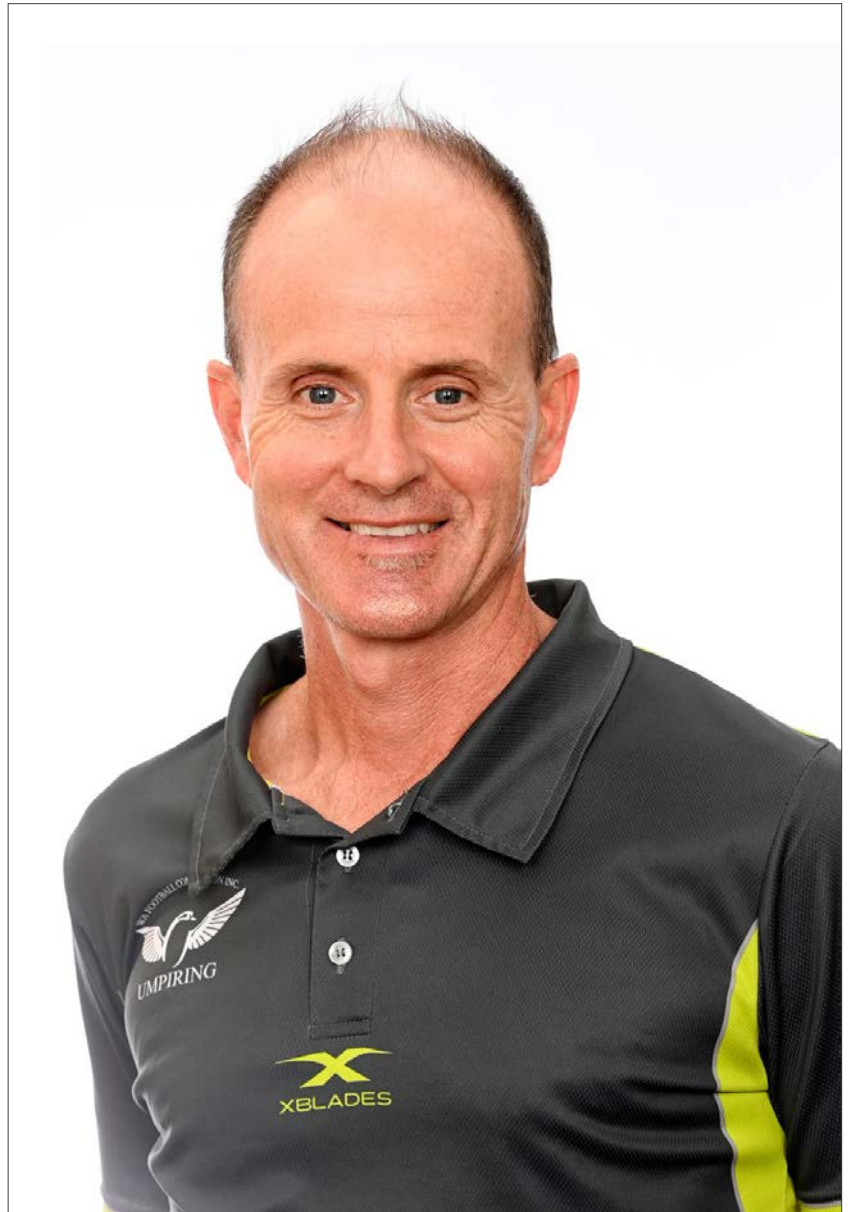

Rob McCaw was appointed to his first State Game after a long journey on the panel. Blake Evans filled the emergency field umpire role.

James Kerr and Jack McCarthy represented the group at the 16's championships. Blake Evans, Oscar Wharton and Mitch Forsyth represented us at the 18's championships.

Through the grind of the season, we performed well. There were some challenging moments, but for the most part I was very proud of our efforts.

Finals selections were tough. Congratulations to Oscar Wharton and Blake Evans on their first league finals. Both capped off an excellent season with AFLW contracts. We also saw several umpires run their first reserves finals which was fantastic.

Choosing the grand final umpires was particularly tough. The smallest of margins separated some umpires this season. It came down to the little things.

At league level, it was fantastic to appoint Rob McCaw to his first grand final. Rob had a standout finals series. Cam Jones also umpired his first league grand final. Cam had an outstanding 2022 season winning the Montgomery Medal. There is no doubt Cam can take the next step to AFL. Matt Adams capped off another excellent season being appointed to his 7th WAFL league grand final. Matt's ability to consistently

2022 saw a return to 'normalcy' for football – border closures were over, summer was hot and long, and games across the country had capacity crowds again. The previous two disjointed years seemed a distant memory as Round 1 kicked off. Some COVID provisions were still active, with testing requirements and isolations in place, otherwise the AFL competition returned to regular programming.

WA's newest addition to the umpiring panel, Jordan 'Rustin' Russell didn't have to wait long to get a taste of AFL football, debuting in Round 1 at Optus Stadium in the blockbuster West Coast v Gold Coast in the coveted 4.40 pm Sunday afternoon timeslot. Boundary umpire heritage number 586 was awarded to Rustin pre-game, and he duly fitted in seamlessly with the transition to the big stage. The Round 1 game also saw Josh Garrett run around in his 100th AFL game, a weight off his little shoulders after sitting on 99 games all off-season.

Jeff Dalglish was an unfortunate casualty for season

2022, suffering a long-term injury that kept him out of action. Jeff managed to keep himself busy though, growing a beard to rival his brother Brett's.

During the first half of the season, goal umpire Sally Boud announced the wonderful news that she was pregnant. Fellow goal umpire Brett Rogers also decided that he had too much time on his hands, and was expecting a third child with wife Alyce.

Sally's pregnancy and subsequent time off caused a reshuffle of the goal umpiring panel, and saw Jason Yazdani promoted to the list from the rookie spot. Jason's opportunity to debut came at Optus Stadium in Round 9 in the West Coast v Melbourne game, and he hasn't looked back since.

Boundary umpire Brett Dalglish umpired his 250th AFL games on a blockbuster Saturday night clash between Fremantle and Sydney in July, which is a testament to his skills and work rate to notch up the milestone in only his 13th year on the panel. As usual, Brett

threatened to retire 15 minutes into the first quarter, but thankfully stuck out the rest of the game, as well as the remainder of the year.

Victorian-based WA field umpire Justin Power had a big year, umpiring his 50th game between GWS Giants and St Kilda at the football mecca of Manuka Oval, at the same time balancing life as a new dad.

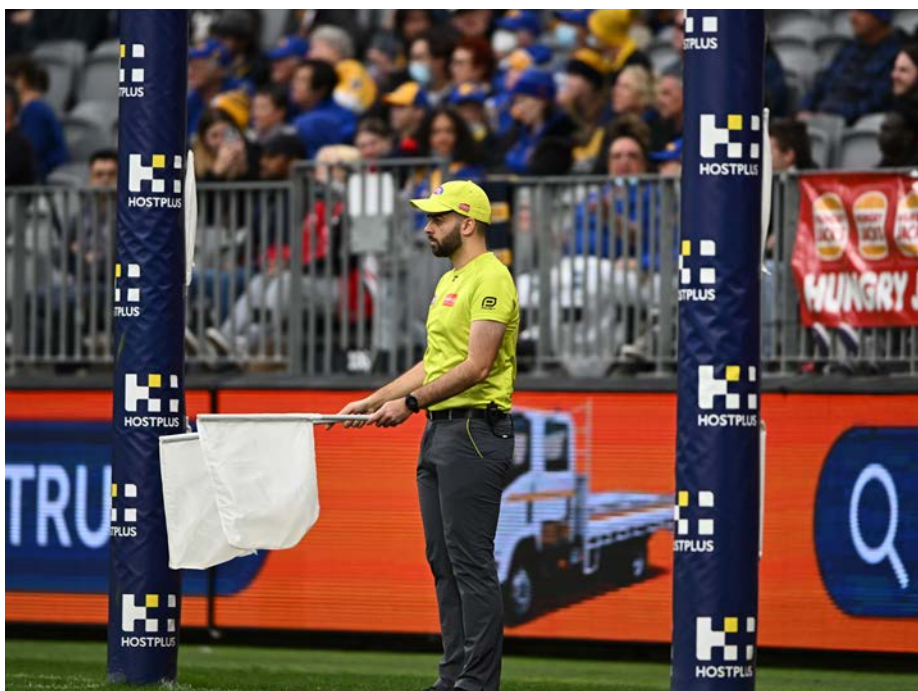

Victorian-based WA field umpires Brett Rosebury, Justin Power and Nathan Williamson were also appointed to the finals series, representing Justin's first finals foray. All Western Australian umpires appointed to the finals series put in strong performances, and represented themselves extremely well.

The conclusion of the 2022 season saw further successes for the Western Australian umpiring panel, with Jordan Russell awarded the Bill Sutton Medallion for the most promising first- or second-year boundary umpire, which was a duly deserved honour for an umpire that is still only 20 years of age.



In addition, field umpires Jordan Fry and Cam Jones got the call that they'd been hoping to receive, appointed to the field umpiring panel for 2023, in recognition of their extremely capable performances in the WAFL. Learning from Jeff and Daniel Johanson, they couldn't be welcomed into a more accepting cohort.

As a group we can only get better through the support of coaches, so a big thank you to Geoff O'Neill, David Shawcross and Craig Hendrie. Their genuine passion and desire for us to constantly strive for improvement and sustained success help make WA an extremely strong umpiring group.

A massive thank you also has to go to the trainers for keeping all of the umpires on the field for 2022. Daniel Martin and Olivia Walton returned to the fold for their first full seasons, and we welcomed Eve Matson and Siddhant Mathankar to the illustrious Optus Stadium changerooms.

In off-season news, Sally and her husband Mark welcome baby James into the world, and Brett Rogers and Alyce welcome little Logan to the family. Weddings galore happened, which saw Brett Dalglish and partner Dani, Justin Power and partner Emily, and Dan Johanson and partner Tara tie the knot.

Looking forward to the 2023 season, the WA umpiring group are looking to build on a successful and very busy 2022 campaign, and with the camaraderie and strength of the panel being as strong as ever, the outlook is positive.

STRENGTH & CONDITIONING REPORT

The year 2022 was one of certainty as the pandemic became a more manageable threat to the WAFL and AFL competitions. It was my eighth year involved in umpiring and it came with a new level of responsibility as a support for the medical and fitness staff. Mackenzie Liddelow returned with an increased level of responsibility as our new senior strength and conditioning coach. 'Mack' took charge out on the track for the majority of training sessions and ensured a high level of quality and professionalism. One of our exceptional practicum students from 2021 in Ellie Wilcox returned as well as the new assistant strength and conditioning coach and provided first-rate supervision and individual coaching. Ellie was ever reliable missing very few sessions throughout the year. We also had a new head trainer and medical coordinator in Daniel Martin. Dan brought attention to detail and professionalism to the role. Olivia Walton also took on extra responsibility in the medical room as she took on the mantle of rehab/reconditioning coordinator. Together the above team provided what I believe to be an elite overarching medical and conditioning service to West Australian umpiring.

Normally the WAFL umpiring pre-season begins with a time trial. The year of 2022 was slightly different as we renamed our test an 'indication session'. The difference between this and a time trial was that it wasn't to be used for benchmarking. It was used purely as an individual guide of level of off-season success. It could also be used as a short-term pacing guide for future training. Despite the nature of the indication session the results timewise were some of the best we have seen when compared to previous time trials. The indication session served as a fantastic bookend to the off-season and landmark of the 2022 season. The wider umpiring group built on their comradery and as with previous years the group became more galvanized and ready for the long year ahead.

When the group returned to more regular training at Ernest Johnson Oval the group displayed a fantastic mental resilience. This was the first year since 2019 that we could train as a larger group due to the lower risk of covid-19 infection. However the virus was still lingering and this meant that some umpires had to take on multiple games across a weekend at various stages. As with 2020 and 2021 there was a low injury rate throughout the season.



I would like to thank my fellow coaches Greg, Geoff, Ryan, John, Luke, Justin, David and Daniel for their continued support. Shout out to Jake Mason the operations coordinator who assists in managing the training facility and giving AFL fantasy advice to anyone that needs it. I would also like to acknowledge Dean Margetts and David Crute for their belief in me and the wider athletic team. Not all sporting teams have such strong culture, belief and agreeance amongst the various coaches. The confidence everyone has in each other's expertise makes it easier to get the best result for the wider group and more importantly makes our training environment somewhere you want to be.

HEAD TRAINER'S REPORT

The 2022 season was an exciting year with a close competition and fresh faces in the Trainers Team. It was my inaugural year as the Head Trainer and Medical Co-ordinator. My team included Olivia Walton as Assistant Head Trainer and Rehabilitation Co-ordinator, my fellow AFL Trainers and Leadership team Sid Mathankar and Eve Matson. WAFL and Community Umpire Trainers Vicky Fourie and Eli Wadrop. WAFL Trainers; Tharushi Kannan-gara, Courtney Landers, Eva Masi, Ethan Peacock, Jared Wiegele, Alex Winter and Imogen Borshoff.

Covid-19 took a major effect in 2022 with over 1.15 million confirmed WA cases to date (4/10/22), in comparison to 1,191 by the end of 2021. My team and I were subjected to this as was the case for many other staff. However, with new challenges comes innovation.

This year we spearheaded the creation of the new on-line database for tracking umpires injuries and rehabilitation plans, continuously update by Oliva and myself. This has helped build a foundation of injury history to tailor the rehabilitation needs specific to each umpire. Similarly in collaboration with the strength and condition staff we created new return to play protocol that was specific to each discipline. We were also introduced to a new Blue Card rule to help reduce missed concussions.

For 2022 I would like to give a special thank you to; The West Australian Football Commission, in particular Andrea Boots who has been important with the handling the finances and administration for the Trainers. All the Coaches who have always been willing to



put the Umpires health first. This has allowed me to operate in my role with ease.

Thank you to the WAFLUA for their appreciation of the Trainers with an amazing silent disco themed Harry's Night. A special thank you to the outgoing President David Thatcher, who was exemplary for me personally in my transition into the new role.

Thank you to all Umpires for trusting our process of what we do as a Trainers team. The Umpires in rehabilitation this year have always been happy and resilient even when they all prefer to be out on the field.

This year we had just over 140 injuries in the WAFL. However, this didn't stop us from getting the elite umpires through to the spotlight of a Leederville Grand Final. This is largely due to the credit and dedication of

my amazing, adaptable Trainers staff.

2022 was a great year to be a part of and I look forward to 2023.

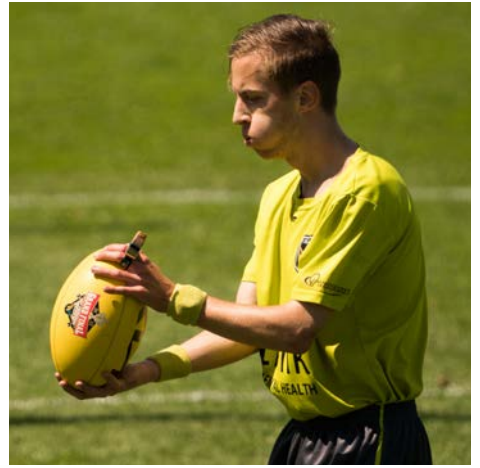

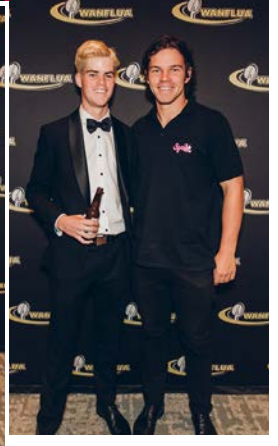
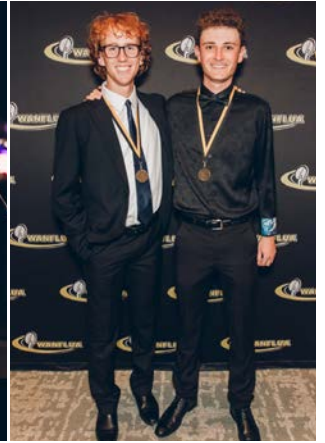

Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2022

1 Statement of significant accounting policies

The significant policies which have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report are:

Basis of accounting

The financial report is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared for its members in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations, other authoritative announcements and the Association Handbook in a form appropriate for a sporting association.

It has been prepared on the basis of historical costs and except where stated, does not take into account changing money values or fair values of non-current assets.

The accounting policies have been consistently applied, and, except where there is a change in accounting policy, are consistent with those of the previous year.

Statement of compliance

The financial report complies with Australian Accounting Standards, which include Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (AIFRS). Compliance with AIFRS ensures that the financial report, comprising the financial statements and notes thereto, complies with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS).

(a) Revenue recognition

Revenues are recognised at fair value of the consideration received.

Membership – Membership revenue is driven through subscription fees. All membership income is recognised in the financial year in which it has been received to accurately match membership revenue with events held.

Interest – Interest income is recognised when it is credited.

(b) Receivables

Subscriptions shall be payable in the case of an Active Member immediately on notification of appointment as an Umpire and in all other cases no later than the 31st of May each year.

Collectability of debtors is reviewed on an ongoing basis. A provision for doubtful debts is raised where doubt as to the collection exists and debts which are known to be uncollectible are written off.

(c) Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment is stated at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Acquisition – All acquisitions of assets (except caricatures but including the updating on all honour boards, photos and framing of posters) are recorded at the cost of acquisition, being the purchase consideration determined as at the date of acquisition, plus costs incidental to acquisition.

Caricatures - They are anticipated to have indeterminate useful life. Their service potential has not, in any material sense, been consumed during the reporting period and as such, no amount for depreciation is recognised.

Depreciation - From 1 January 2016 purchases <\$2,000 to be depreciated at a rate of 100%. Purchases of a large amount will be depreciated on a case by case basis based on the assets expected useful life.

Assets purchased in 2019 financial year with a value of >\$2,000 have been depreciated on the straight-line method with a useful life of five (5) years.

The Balance Sheet should be read in conjunction with the accompanying notes.

(d) Cash assets

Cash assets are carried at face value of the amounts deposited.

(e) Inventories

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Net realisable value is determined on the basis of each inventory line's estimated selling price.

(f) Payables

Trade creditors represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the Association prior to the end of the financial year and which are unpaid. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

(g) Taxes

The Association is exempt from the payment of income tax under the Income Tax Assessment Act.

Goods and services tax (GST) - Revenue, expenses, assets and liabilities are recognised inclusive of the amount of GST.
